







CHINESE CONFERENCE

Argument at Anglican Conference on the Work in British Columbia.

The Task Undertaken Ahead of the Claims of a College in Japan.

As briefly reported by telegraph, the possibilities of Chinese work in British Columbia were the subject of an animated discussion at the Anglican synod in Montreal last week.

When the general board of missions met in the afternoon (that is to say, all the members of the Synod sitting as the general board of the missionary society), exception was taken to the action of the board in the premises.

On the other hand Bishop Baldwin, who confessed that he was the guilty party who at the meeting of the board of management had suggested the Chinese work in British Columbia, said that he had been to the Coast and had seen the condition of the Chinese in the territory.

Rev. Mr. Waller, just returned from Japan, supported the original proposal of the board of management. He said that the present condition of the Chinese on the Pacific Coast, and felt that the work was most urgent.

Archdeacon Davis and Judge-Macdonald indignantly controverted the position of the church in Japan. That work should be strengthened.
