8. We wait for thy *loving*'-kindness, O God: *in* the' midst of' thy temple.

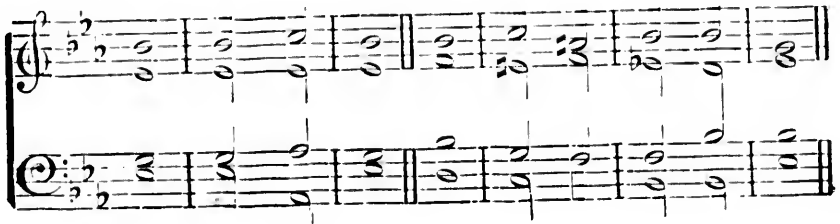
