

# **Christmas Lull in Fighting** Is Possible

London, Dec. 23-It is believed that, notwithstanding the failure of the plan for an armistice over Christmas, some sort of a lull will set in on Christm Day itself. Christmas sentiment is deep in the men's hearts, and their position Day itself. Christmas sentiment is deep in the men's hearts, and their positions on the line of battle, facing each other, in bitter antagonism will not eradicate it. The London newspapers have decided unanimously not to publish on Christmas Day, and the official press bureau will suspend its activities from the afternoon of December 24, until the evening of December 25.

Thousands of tons of Christmas presents have been sent to all the fronts. The distribution and enjoyment of these gifts is another argument for the probable suspension of hostilities, wherever this is possible.

Trom Munich increasing dissatisfaction among the Bavarian troops is learned. They contend that they are not getting proper recognition for the sacrifices they have made. The feeling is spreading quickly throughout Bavaria, that King Ludwig has been deceived by the Kaiser, and that Bavaria is now engaged in a war which can bring no profit to the kingdom, whatever may be the outcome, while in case of Germany's victory the Prussians will reap all the profit and honor, notwithstanding that the Bavarians have sacrificed, proportionately, three times more men and money than Prussia.
