MINUTES

Of the Thirteenth Session of the African Baptist Association of Nova Scotia held with the Dartmouth Lake Church, Halifax County, on Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday, Sept. 26th, 27th, and 28th, 1880.

Sunday, September 26th, 1880.

Met at 11 o'clock, A. M., with the Dartmouth Lake Church in the Thirteenth Session of the African Baptist Association of Nova Preaching by Rev. J. E. Jackson from Romans i. 11, followed by Bro. Chas. Roan. Adjourned.

Met at 3 o'clock. Preaching by the Rev. F. R. Langford from Jude i. 3, followed by Bro Wm. Thomas. Prayer by Brother

Gates. Adjourned.

Met 7 o'clock, P. M. Preaching by Rev. J. E. Jackson from John iv. 14th, followed by Bro C. Roan and Rev. B. Smithers. Truly we had a good and happy time. Adjourned.

Monday, September 27th.

Met at 9 o'clock. Chairman, Bishop Smithers, called the Council to order, and read Psalm i. Prayer was offered by Rev. J. E. Jackson.

Voted, That Rev. J. E. Jackson be Moderator for this year.

It was voted that Bro. J. Bowden be Secretary for this year and

Bro. C. Smith be Assistant Secretary. Adjourned.

Met at 11 o'clock, A. M. The Rev. James E. Jackson preached the Introductory Sermon from 2 Kings v. 12, "Are not Abana and Pharpar, rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? May I not wash in them, and be clean? So he turned and went away in a rage." Exhortation by Bro. R. Smith. Adjourned.

Met 3 o'clock, P. M. Moderator called the Council to order and read James in. Prayer by C. Roan.

It was voted that the minutes of last year be read. They were read and approved.

Voted that a List of Delegates be made out, which was done as follows:

Voted that the Association be held with the Weymouth Falls Church next year, on the last Saturday in September, 1881.

Voted that Bishop B. Smithers preach the Introductory Sermon, and Rev. J. E. Jackson be his alternate. Adjourned.

Met at 7 o'clock. Preaching by Rev. F. R. Langford from St. Mark.vii. 37., followed by Bro. Chas. Roan, Rev. B. Smithers and J. E. Jackson. Truly the Lord was in our midst. Adjourned.

Tuesday, September 28th.

Met at 9 o'clock, A. M. Moderator called the Council to order and read Psalm xxxiii. Prayer by Dea. George Pomp.

It was moved by Rev. B. Smithers and seconded by Dea. Thos. Tynes, that a Committee be appointed to Examine the Letters from the various churches, and to read them.

It was voted that the Rev. J. E. Jackson, Bro. J. Tynes and Rev. F. R. Langford be the committee. The letters were read.

It was moved by Bishop Smithers and seconded by Dea. Thos. Tynes that the Branch Church of Granville Ferry be organized in a body by itself and be called the Fundy Section Church. Adjourned.

Met at 7 o'clock P. M. Preaching by Rev. J. E. Langford from Acts iii. 23, followed by Bishop B. Smithers and Bro. Jas. Bowden.

Then the Ministers, Deacons and Delegates formed into a ring, hand in hand. The Bishop delivered an affecting address, the doxology was sung, and prayer by Rev. F. R. Langford.

It was resolved that a vote of thanks be tendered to friends of Dartmouth Lake Church for their hospitality to the delegates and strangers.

Resolved, That a vote of thanks be tendered to the white friends in Dartmouth for their kindness and for their attention. We hope the Lord will bless them.

The Benediction was pronounced by Rev. J. E. Jackson. The brethren separated to meet with the Weymouth Falls Church on the last Saturday in September, 1881.

Oct. 3rd. That Rev. J. E. Jackson preach in Halifax in Zion Church at 3 and 7 o'clock, P. M. Rev. F. R. Langford preach in Preston South Church at 11, A. M. and 3 P. M., and Rev. B. Smithers at 7 o'clock, P. M.

Circular Letter.

OF THE 13TH SESSION OF THE AFRICAN BAPTIST ASSOCIATION CONVENED AT DARTMOUTH LAKE CHURCH, SEPTEMBER 26TH, THIS YEAR OF OUR LORD, 1880.

Dearly Beloved Brethren,-

God our Heavenly Father has spared our lives and permitted us to meet again this year at the Annual Association, a meeting which, we trust, will never be forgotten in this world. We had some powerful sermons preached to us there, which, we trust, will be as bread cast upon the waters, which will be seen after many days.

My brethren, I shall now try to recommend you a support in trouble, "The Lord will be a refuge for the oppressed; a refuge in times of trouble," Ps. ix. 9. "He hath not despised or abhorred the affliction of the afflicted, neither hath he hid his face from him; but when he cried unto him he heard," Psalm xxii. 24.
