- Something worse than failure may be the alternative to success when the representatives of five nations meet in Washington on November 11 th to discuss the limitation of arms. For if the twenty men who will ial observers aver, they will leave the world in a far more desperate position than if the conference had never been held. The failure of this portentous experiment could "sow throughout the earth the dragon's teeth of distrust," declares the San Francisco Argonaut, which is convinced that this "will not be a case where it was better to have tried and failed than never to have tried at all." Lord Northclifee declared the other day
at Honolulu that "if the conference on disarmament should fail, the consequences will be utterly disastrous to the whole world
