

The Heard of Trade has received from the Trade and Commerce De-partment, Ottawa, a copy of the cul-for tenders for steamship service be-tween Canada, the British West In-dies and British Guiana. The ten-ders, which will be received up to noon January 31, 1922, call for two forms of service, one weakly or fort-nightly from 54. John or Halifax, and the other weakly or fortughtly from St. John and Halifax alternately. The alternate form of asilings from the two ports was recommended to the department by the St. John Boerd of Trade. The service is designed to cover a period of five or ten years. Tenderers are requested to state the earliest date on which they can establish the service proposed. The steamers to be semployed shall be from 5,006 to 5,000 tons gross, orp-able of maintaining an ocean speed of 12 knots, and providing accommo-dation for 100 gipt-class, 30 second-class, and 100 sizenze or deck pa-sengers, and shall be provided with trane dacks. 



We have been told that liquor is practically responsible for about every crime on the calendar and that there would be no use for jails, asylums or even hospitals when Prohibition came into force. As a matter of fact the Abstainers and temperate prisoners in Canadian Penitentiaries far out-number the intemperate. In an official report given out for year ending March 31, 1920 those rated as abstainers totalled 548, temperate 975 and intemperate 408 408.

The jails are still doing business at the old stand, asylums and hospitals are over-crowded and we have had four years of so-called Prohibition.

The question is frequently asked, what benefit, if any, has the public derived from the enactment of the Prohibition law? From general observation it has been a curse to them and to our Country. It has taken away pure liquor and beer. It is teaching the public to secretly drink behind closed doors and get drunk. It is causing gambling and immorality in the homes. It is causing death after death of the innocent public. It is causing blindness by the sore."
