Dominion Parliament.

Ottawa, June 8.

In the House after a recess several Government bills passed a final reading.

In Committee of Supply items for fisheries, light house and coast service, Cursons and Island Revenue were carried.

Mackenzie gave notice that on occasion he would move to strike out members for Trinity House, Quebec and Montreal.

He protested against employment of large number of officials at small salaries in the Customs and Inland Revenue Service and advocated appointment of smaller number at larger salaries.

The Session.

A meeting of the Board was held in the Court House at 11 o'clock this morning. The Mayor in the Chair. The attendance of Justices was small, 12 only being present.

Justice Keane asked to be enlightened as to what had been done in regard to the Lancaster Election question. At the request of the Chairman, the Clerk of the Peace read the minutes of the previous meeting bearing on the matter, for Mr. Keane's especial benefit. He expressed himself as anxious that the matter should be settled by the Supreme Court, as also did Justice Donaldson.

On Motion of Justice Keane, the Court adjourned until Tuesday next, the 18th inst.
