 Peace negotintions between Germany and the Bolsheviki Government apparently have been broken off again. Resumpt: 5 . of the German forward movement and the fact that the Russiat peace emissaries have asked that a trair u der military guard be sent to meet them near Pskov indicates that Teutonic aggression has not been satiated
The Bolsheviki are making strenuous preparations to meet the German advance and Premier Lenine' is sending forth proclamations urging all Russians to save the revolution. Moseow and the interior of Russia have declared against a separate peace and the local councils in the interior are making ready to resist the invaders.

Belated despatches from Petrograd say the Bolsheviki are destroying strategic railways, bridges and roads and are sending large forces to the fighting front. The Germans are said to be within 80 miles of Petrograd on the southwest and are approaching Orsha, on the same Meridian of longitude as Petrograd
