





MOST PERFECT WARSHIP Afloat

H. M. S. Dominion Will Excel in Size, Speed and Fighting Strength--Named in Honor of Canada.

The London correspondent of the Toronto Globe has the following description of H. M. S. Dominion, the magnificent battleship now in process of construction and named in honor of Canada.

In selecting the vessel which should carry the name of Canada in the British navy, the Admiralty has recognized the loyal and highly appreciated help during the recent crisis in the history of the empire, the financial government have greatly enhanced the honor by choosing what will undoubtedly be the largest and most powerful fighting ship built.

The Dominion, the construction of which has recently been commenced, is 425 feet long between perpendiculars, the maximum breadth will be 78 feet when fully completed, her draught as represented by the amount of water she will displace, will be 15,350 tons.

As regards gun power, H. M. S. Dominion will have four 12-inch breech-loading guns, four 9.2-inch caliber, ten 6-inch and six 3-inch in addition to a large number of smaller guns intended for warding off torpedo boat attack.

On previous ships there have been six 12-inch guns, but there has been a great development recently in the use of these weapons since the Admiralty adopted the Vickers improvements. Thus ten years ago a service 12-inch piece developed an energy of about 18,000 foot pounds, while today 36,200 foot tons can be got.

The splendid shipbuilding and marine engineering works at Barrow-in-Furness have a total area of 224 acres, and buildings alone cover 35 acres, while the 10,000 odd workers continuously employed there are about fifteen berths for the building of ships, and the rapidity of construction is largely facilitated by the immense electrically driven machinery.

At Sheffield the company not only made their larger guns and armor-plate, but also the great forgings and castings which are required for the machinery and the hulls of the ships. The company at their Barrow works make all the smaller guns, including the popularly-named pom-pom, which is used for anti-aircraft purposes.

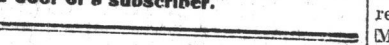

THE REVELSTOCK CONVENTION.

The convention at Revelstoke which closed its deliberations last night must be accepted as very fairly representative of Conservative opinion throughout the province of British Columbia.

It declared its desire for the introduction of party lines into provincial politics in a most unmistakable and emphatic way.

In this we think it is sure of popular approval, men of all shades of political opinion having come to the conclusion that the introduction of party lines into provincial politics is at once inevitable and desirable.

We believe it to be desirable, not merely because it is inevitable, although for that reason also, but as well because it guarantees, as nothing else can, stable and responsible government.

It must not be forgotten, however, that as to the time and circumstances of the introduction of party lines, there are matters to be taken into consideration upon which no convention of either party, however representative and influential, can possibly have the right word to say.

It may be to the advantage of the province to transfer the seat of government from the lines on which it has been run in the past to the modern rails of party politics; but it must not be forgotten that the attempt to make the transfer except at a proper switch, would only result in the machine being run off the rails altogether, and confusion worse confounded.

The next general election held under the Re-distribution Act forms the obviously appropriate time for so radical a change. In harmony with the spirit of the country which this convention has expressed, rather than as a result of its declaration, no candidate at the next general election but one may receive a nomination from one or other of the parties.

It is interesting to note just how economical the Liberals have been since they took office, after the elections of 1896. In 1896, the last year of Conservative rule, the expenditure was \$36,040,142, and the budget speech of that year caused Sir Richard Cartwright to grow hysterical in his denunciations of "Tory extravagance."

In 1897, the first year of Liberal government, the expenditure was \$38,340,760, and after that the figures mounted up as follows:

THE FAST ATLANTIC LINE.

A cable from London reports a rumor that the Canadian government has abandoned the idea of establishing a fast Atlantic passenger line with a fast freight service.

This is not at all surprising considering the way in which the Liberal administration has treated with this great national question.

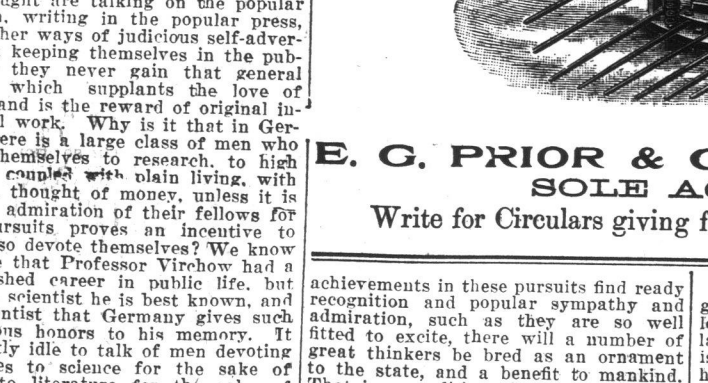
