A new loan of \$3,500,000 was issued to cover this indebtedness. For various reasons it was impossible to prognosticate the result of the present fiscal year but up to April 1 the receipts had been \$3,024,981 and expenditure \$2,259,960, leaving an apparent surplus of \$65,021, but as there was a supplementary budget of \$453,222, and as the collections of arrears tax on commercial corporations covering five years, amounting to \$557,165, were included in the current revenue, there was really a deficit of over \$1,250,000.

During the coming fiscal year Mr. Stiehyn said that he looked forward to an increase of the Federal subsidy, but without it he estimated surplus of \$63,32.




