THE MOUNTAIN'S RUMBLE FROM A LOW
SOUND OF HIS ROSE FALLOUS SEAT BY 146

Smashing Rebuke to Federal
Attempt to Coerce the West—
Roblin Now Says Its Fight to
the Finish.

Winnipeg, April 27.—(Special)—Mountain, speaking to-day for the united west, has declared against coercion by the government at Ottawa. Whatever palliatives have been offered, it is on the attempt of Mr. Barrett and the Roman Catholic hierarchy to force the separation of schools on unwilling Manitobans that this by-election has been fought, and in fighting this battle, the electors of Manitoba have fought the battle of the new provinces, and have emphatically declared their preference with its educational system, nor in the upbringing of its youth. The Mountain government, irritated beyond endurance, hung down the challenge in Manitoba, and the Wilfrid Laurier government, acting thru his accredited agents, picked it up and staked his political career on the west on the vote of that electorate. To-day he stands unshaken, perhaps, but condemned as a traitor to the west, and the Mountain government is avenged in the tragedy of Manitoba.

The actual result has surpassed the hopes of even the most optimistic Conservatives, who hardly dared hope for a majority in the province that returned ex-Premier Greenway for 23 years, and that had been sucked in Liberal tradition.

Free Press, official organ of the Liberal party in the west, this morning made the following confession: "The great majority of the Liberals of Manitoba are of course, incoherent. They might break with their party on a matter of principle, but they cannot be bought nor fooled with false promises."

At the general election in 1905 the result was as follows: McIntyre (Cons.) 67, Greenway (Lib.) 91; Wilson (Ind.) 24, or a total majority against the provincial government in the province of 38, while Greenway had 341 majority over his straight Conservative opponent. Now, McIntyre comes out of the contest with a majority of 146. Aitho the result is not as great as the fact that the total vote cast to-day was little below that cast at the general election.

Roblin Remarks.
Premier Roblin, as he always had great faith in the patriotism and sound common sense of the people of Manitoba, and that most of his constituents in Kamimura's squadrons were in Kelung, at the northern extremity of Formosa. Strategists expected the engagement to be a draw between this port and Formosa, but they recognize the possibility that Kamimura, either by accident or by design, might have been ordered by attacking the Russian steamer, or that the Russians turned on him when he pursued too closely. A third possibility is that Kamimura is carrying out instructions to harass the Russian fleet, and that the Russian admiral hastens northeast into a trap laid for him by Togo.

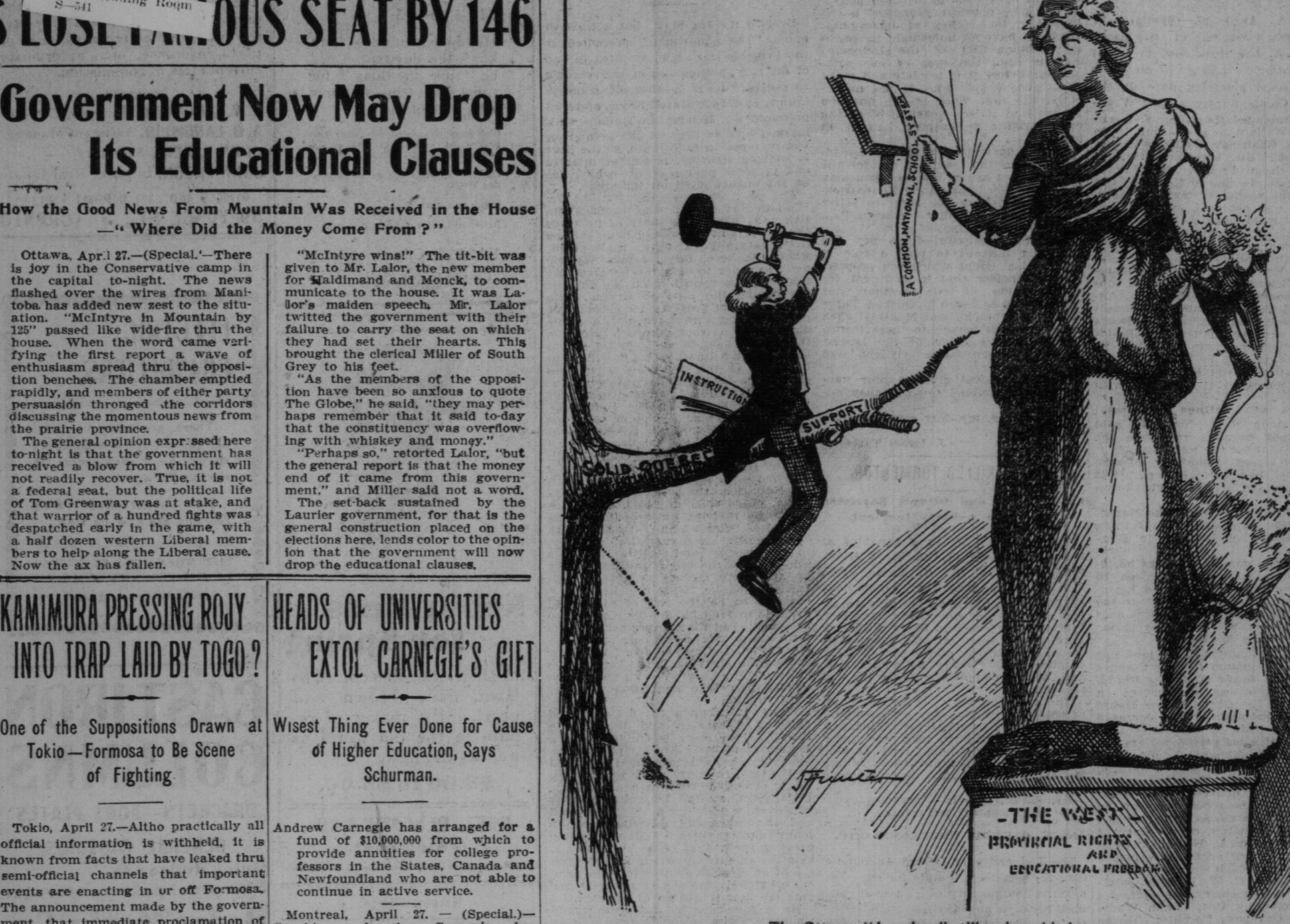

DETECTIVE MURRAY'S HOME
AFTER 20,000 MILE TOUR

Since December Has Travelled
Length and Breadth of America
and Crossed to Europe.

Inspector John Murray of the Ontario government's criminal investigation department, is back again after a holiday trip that few men could undertake. Since leaving Toronto early last December, he has traveled the length and breadth of this continent, and crossed and recrossed the Atlantic. His journeys, in rough figures, will total up a distance traveled of something like 20,000 miles. His home again, invigorated and with a "never felt better in his life" expression. "My six months' leave of absence is not up until May 15. Leaving Toronto, Mr. Murray went to New York (600 miles); thence by coasting steamer to Colon, in Central America (2800 miles); thence thru Colombia, Guatemala, Honduras and Panama and north to San Francisco (4000 miles); thence south to Los Angeles and return to San Francisco (4000 miles); thence across the continent to New York (2800 miles); over the Atlantic to England and Belgium and return (6000 miles), and finally, the return to the city yesterday, adding a last 500 miles.

Mr. Murray says that the beginning of construction of the Panama Canal by the United States has attracted the most mixed and most venomous population imaginable. "There's all sorts of them—carpet baggers, peevish politicians, fakirs and thieves; and all mixtures of races and colors," he said last night.

Mr. Murray's book of reminiscences, "Memoirs of a Great Detective," is having a big sale in the old country, and it has been translated also into French, German and Italian, and is being eagerly read in those countries. In London 1500 copies have been taken by the circulating libraries alone, and if it keeps up, it won't be long before our own John Murray will have supplanted even Sherlock Holmes in the favor of the British public.
