SAW MILL ORE GOES \$6

On the 20th Report of Special Committee to the Directors and Shareholders.

At a meeting of the directors and a committee of the shareholders of the Saw Mill Mine at Hamilton on Monday the substance of a special report then presented was that the Saw Mill has proved to be a low grade mine, the average of some 90 assays being in the neighborhood of 89 to 100. Mr. J. C. Forde of Toronto, who has been in charge of the mine, is the intention of the directors to change their manner of taking out only such ore as is sufficiently rich to pay the cost of milling. This news will be somewhat of a disappointment to the public who bought the stock at a large advance on par value. The World, however, has been informed that even this low grade ore can be mined at a profit.
