MINUTES OF THE TENTH SESSION OF THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE.

Held in the Methodist Church, Cornwall, Ontario, commencing June 1, 1893.

The TENTH SESSION of the MONTREAL CONFERENCE of the Methodist Church assembled, according to appointment, in the Methodist Church, Cornwall, Ont., Thursday, June 1st, 1893, at 9 o'clock a.m.

Rev. W. H. GRAHAM, President of the Conference, occupied the chair.

The Conference prayer-meeting was held from 9 to 10 o'clock.

After singing Hymn 534, II Thess. chap. iv., was read by Rev. Wm. Philp, B.A., B.D., Secretary of Conference; and Revs. J. E. MAVETY and E. B. RYCKMAN, M.A., B.D., offered prayer.

The President called for the names of the laymen elected as members of this Conference by the District Meetings. (See appendix,)

The Secretary then called the roll, and 143 ministers and 37 laymen responded to their names.

The Conference then proceeded to elect a president. The first ballot resulted in the election of Rev. W. Jackson, D.D., of Perth, Ont. In a few choice sentences he acknowledged the honor conferred upon him, and asked the Conference to proceed to the election of a secretary.

The first ballot gave a majority to Rev. S. D. Chown, Almonte. He also, in appropriate terms, thanked the Conference for the expression of its confidence.

On nomination by the Secretary, the following were appointed assistant secretaries: Rev. Wm. Philp., B.A., B.D.; Rev. S. J. Hughes, M.A.; Mr. J. S. Eagleson; and Rev. C. D. Baldwin, Journal Secretary.

Rev. Jas. Lawson was re-appointed reporter to *Christian Guardian*, and Rev. T. H. Wright was appointed to sign railway certificates.

OBITUARIES.

DANIEL SMITH

Was born on the fifth of February, 1822, near the village of Athens, in Leeds County, Ontario, and died at Haley's Station, in Renfrew County, on the twenty-fifth of February, 1893. On the twenty-eighth of October, 1846, he was married to Philinda Brown, who, with two sons and two daughters, survive to mourn their loss.

Our departed brother was converted to God in his father's house at the age of fourteen. His having been brought up under godly influences, and having associated with the ministers of Christ from childhood, doubtless conduced much to the development of his spiritual nature, and turning his thought in the direction of the Christian ministry. In this work he spent the strength of his manhood, giving some thirty-one years of labor in the late Methodist Episcopal Church, and five years afterwards in the united Church in the capacity of a superannuated minister.

Brother Smith belonged in thought and sentiment to the men of the earlier part of the century. He was possessed of a good physique, was thoughtful and intellectual, and pressed his way through many difficulties, in spite is limited educational advantages to begin with.

As a companion he was pleasant and agreeable, while possessing complete self-control. He was of a sanguine temperament, which assisted largely in sustaining him in the midst of arduous work, while in a semi-invalid state.

His Christian experience was not so prominent until during his latter years. In the midst of a gracious revival he experienced that "perfect love which casteth out fear." It was refreshing to hear him speak of his full assurance of faith. And at length, after a season of protracted bodily weakness, his sun banish pain."

Six of our ministers attended his funeral, and assisted the chairman in conducting a most impressive service.

REV. FRANCIS HUNT.

The Rev. Francis Hunt was born in Ireland, county of Leitrim, in the year 1816. He was the second youngest son in a family of ten, and accompanied his parents to Canada at the age of fourteen. At an early age he was converted to God, uniting with the Methodist New Connexion Church, and subsequently entered its ministry in 1842.

At the time the late Methodist New Connexion Church withdrew its laborers from Canada East, Brother Hunt was stationed at East Bolton. Such was the attachment existing between him and his congregation, that they declined to separate, and Brother Hunt was obliged to break off his relation with the New Connexion Church. One year later, in 1856, both pastor and people joined the late Wesleyan Methodist Church. Brother Hunt was a most acceptable preacher and good pastor. He worked faithfully on laborious fields,

The old St. Armand Circuit was his first appointment in connection with the late Wesleyan Methodist Church. When Knowlton became separated from Shefford in 1860, Brother Hunt became its first Methodist minister. Retiring to a farm in 1862, he re-entered the work on the Rawdon Mission in 1871. In 1877 he entered the supernumerary ranks, and stood in that relation until his death. But during that time he often responded cheerfully to the call of service, as brethren in the active work required his help.

Brother Hunt was a man of kind disposition, irreproachable character and winning manner. His piety was of a cheerful as well as fervent type.

The last sixteen years of his life on the Lennoxville Circuit were years of usefulness. He was ever ready to aid the pastor in filling appointments, and in many other ways. No small tribute to the man was the fact that, on the circuit where he resided so long and was best known, pastors and people had implicit confidence in his integrity and Godly character.

Brother Hunt's closing days were full of triumph. Even in moments of delirium, when the subject of religion and the name of Jesus were mentioned, his response seemed quick and intelligent. Often he would say, "The path of the just is as the shining light, that shineth more and more unto the

On the twenty-second of April, 1893, Brother Hunt, at the residence of his son in Lennoxville, passed peacefully away. Six of his brethren in the ministry, some of whom had been his pastors, bore his remains to the tomb. "He rests from his labors, and his works follow him."

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

REPORT OF THE SUSTENTATION FUND COMMITTEE.

CONSTITUTION OF THE FUND.

1. The name of this Fund shall be, "The Sustentation Fund of the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church."

2. The one object of this Fund shall be to supply those fields in our Home Work which are now, and shall hereafter be, known as "Domestic Missions," or "Dependent Circuits or Stations," so that ministers and preachers duly appointed to those fields shall be regular claimants on the Fund, and shall be entitled to supplemental grants therefrom, whenever their "total income" from other sources shall actually fall below the following scale of minimum allowances, viz.:

For a single preacher on probation, \$300 per annum; for a single ordained minister, \$400 per annum; for a married minister, in full connection, \$500 per annum, with \$25 for each subsequent year, until his allowance reaches \$600 per annum.

N.B.—The term, "allowance" or "allowances," shall be understood as including only the items of ministerial support, viz., salary, board and fuel, exclusive of, and in addition to, any necessary charges for house rent, horse-keeping, travelling, removals and circuit incidentals.

Note.—That in regard to the distribution of the money contributed to this Fund, the Committee shall have discretionary power to make grants to ministers with families, even when the minimum allowance, \$600, is exceeded.

3. The income of this Fund shall consist of moneys raised within the bounds of our Conference, by collections and subscriptions on all the various Circuits and Missions, excepting the Indian and the French.

4. The general management of the Fund shall be entrusted to a Sustentation Fund Committee, composed of one minister and one layman, elected by each annual District Meeting, and a ministerial secretary-treasurer elected by the Conference on the nomination of the Committee; and this Committee shall transact the necessary business thereof at each annual Conference, in accordance with the following regulations:

(a) With a view to raising the income needed, the Committee shall annually make a careful estimate of the prospective aggregate deficiencies on dependent fields, and suggest the amount desired from each District, in order to meet such deficiencies.

(b) In making grants from the Fund, the Committee shall have strict regard to the aforementioned "Scale of minimum allowances." No claim shall be entertained which has not been recommended by the annual District Meeting; and all Quarterly Boards presenting claims for recommendation, shall declare their inability to meet their "net deficiencies."

(c) Should the income of the Fund in any year prove insufficient to meet the claims thereon, then the grants shall be so distributed as to make up the allowances of claimants to the same percentage according to the aforementioned "scale," but should there be a surplus over the claims, as

(d) A report shall be presented by the Committee to the Conference annually, while in session, including a summary of business transacted, an audited statement of receipts and disbursements, and any suggestions deemed necessary to the interests of the Fund, said report, as adopted by the Conference, to be published in the Minutes.

5. That no application from any Circuit or Mission be entertained by the Committee, unless that Circuit or Mission has made the most earnest efforts to secure, at least, twenty cents per member.

In order to obtain greater support for this important Fund, the Financial District Meetings are requested to arrange for the holding of platform meetings, and the appointment of deputations to advocate the claims of the Fund on all the Circuits and Missions.

We recommend that most earnest efforts be put forth in every Circuit and Mission to raise, at least, twenty cents per member for the Fund.

That the Secretary-Treasurer be Rev. J. T. Pitcher, for the coming year.

The examination of Candidates shall be held in each District, under the supervision of the Chairman, and the Examiners resident on the District, on the third Wednesday in April in each year, and at such place as the Chairman shall appoint. All papers shall be sent by the Examiners to the Chairman in sealed envelopes not later than the first Wednesday in April in each year. The answers to the papers shall be sent by the Chairman to the respective Examiners, who shall forward to the Secretary of the Board the valuation. The Secretary shall prepare the certificates, and forward them to the Chairman of the District, to be presented by him to the May District Meeting. The Secretary of the Board shall send the Chairman of each District the name of any Candidate or Probationer who may have taken part of the subjects in any given course, and the standing he has attained, but shall not issue the certificate in any year's course until the Candidate or Probationer has completed it; and further, the standard qualification for young men recommended to be received into our Conference as Probationers shall not be lower than fifty per cent. of the marks on the preliminary course of study in the aggregate, and thirty-three and one-third per cent. in each subject. Also a standing of thirty-three and one-third per cent. shall be required in order to pass in each subject of the subsequent course, and the Conference directs that existing regulations relating to the time and manner of examinations be imperatively observed, and more especially that it be deemed absolutely peremptory that the examinations be held on the same day throughout the whole Conference, and that all the young men in any District writing on any given subject write at the same hour. The maximum time for each paper shall be two No supplementary examination shall be allowed between the regular time of examinations and the close of Conference. Each Examiner is expected to send at least one copy of each examination paper to the Chairmen of Districts.

The Probationers of this Conference shall have their standing given them year by year in our Minutes, jointly, according to their years travelled and studies passed.

It is further recommended that in future each paper sent to the Examiners shall be endorsed by the Chairman of the District or his deputy.

Supplemental examinations to be given before September 15th, 1893, shall be granted to E. S. Morrison on the subjects not passed by him in the Second Year's Course; to Isaac C. Smith, to complete the first year of the French Course; to Wm. W. Anglin in English Literature; to Robt. B. McAmmond in Wesley's Sermons, Christian Perfection, and New Testament History.

REPORT OF EPWORTH LEAGUE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee hail with joy the spirit of consecration to Christ and the Church that is more and more stirring the mind and heart of the young men and women of our beloved Methodism.

The advantage of having a consecrated army of young soldiers of Christ, pledged to active service for Him, can scarcely be over-estimated; and we therefore congratulate the Conference and the Church upon the fact that there are now within the bounds of this Conference 97 local branches of the Epworth League, with a membership of 4,141; being an increase for

the past year of 20 societies and 1,049 members.

A large number of these societies are, under the provision made by our General Conference, affiliated with the Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor, and thus provide for that fraternal feeling and interdenominational activity that have happily become so prevalent in these days. We desire our young people to develop a broad and liberal catholicity, and we believe this to be thoroughly consistent with the intensest loyalty to That this end may be served, we recommend that the Conference earnestly and affectionately urge our young people everywhere to consider the recommendation of the founders and leaders of both the Young People's Society of Christian Endeavor and the Epworth League; that wherever either of these societies exist in the Methodist Churches they should at the earliest opportunity affiliate and thus unify our forces.

Let all sectionalism and rivalry be put away from us, and let the youth of Methodism exemplify the motto of our venerated founder, "I desire to form a league, offensive and defensive, with every soldier of Jesus Christ."

The University Extension Movement, contemplating as it does, the holding of Institutes in convenient centres to aid in the study of the English Bible and in training for Christian work, we cordially commend to the Conference, and express the hope that such a scheme may very soon be matured and in successful operation.

During the coming summer two great and important gatherings of young people are to be held, namely, the International Epworth League Convention in the city of Cleveland, June 29th to July 2nd, and the International Convention of United Societies of Christian Endeavor in Montreal, from July 5th to July 10th. We would recommend all our young people who are eligible for representation in these Conventions, or either of them, to take advantage of the Christian inspiration and representative intelligence that will be concentrated in these assemblies. Further, we believe that the interests of this movement will be promoted by a more thorough organization in District and County Conventions, so that the helpful influence of the larger gatherings may be distributed and brought to bear upon the largest possible number of individual societies.

The development of Junior Work we regard as full of promise for the future of our Church, facilitating as it does, the carrying out of the requirements of the Discipline concerning the boys and girls. Let there be a Junior Society in connection with every Church, organized on the lines suggested in the published Model Constitutions.

No cause is dearer to our hearts than that of missionary enterprise. We are persuaded that a study of the problem of the world's evangelization will stimulate the zeal, enrich the mind, and quicken the devotion of all, and will also add materially to the interest of our young people's meetings. In this year, especially in Ontario, the young people will not forget the Temperance Crusade. It is worthy of the strongest effort and fullest devotion, and we are assured it will receive a constant support from the youth of our Church.

The prevalent Sabbath desecration calls for an earnest protest from all Christians. We would commend the example of those Societies which have by resolution declared their purpose to refuse their countenance to, and to withdraw their patronage from, the Chicago World's Fair, because of its flagrant violation of the Christian sense of this Continent in opening its gates on the Sabbath. We feel the need of a call for a more conscientious individual observance of the sacred day, and would especially caution our young people against insidious encroachments of travel and business upon its opening and closing hours.

We would further commend to our young people's societies the subject of systematic giving. We are in the opening of a new era, and we trust the young people of to-day will see the long looked-for conversion of the money power of Christendom to the cause and kingdom of our Redeemer, and full recognition by Christians of the Divine claim upon the wealth of earth.

We trust that due attention is given to the culture of the intellectual life, and that the Literary Department of our Leagues is a help in the formation of reading habits and a guide in the choice of books, thus cultivating

that thoughtfulness, without which Christian experience tends ever to become superficial and unprogressive. In this connection we rejoice to know that our young people's connexional organ, Onward, is being appreciated, and we would exhort all our societies to avail themselves of its helpful, instructive and patriotic columns.

Finally, we would direct attention to the following as the fundamental principles for which we stand: A weekly young people's prayer-meeting, a membership pledged to Christian duty, a monthly consecration service, in which every member takes part, a thorough organization of all for Christian work, a systematic study of the Bible for the promotion of Christian character; Jesus Christ supreme in home, in office, in social life, and complete circle of activities in which we daily move.

We pray for a baptism of the Holy Spirit upon all our young people, that the time to come may witness greater things than the past has known. We recommend that this report be read in all our young people's

societies.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF STANSTEAD WESLEYAN COLLEGE.

The Trustees of Stanstead Wesleyan College respectfully present to the Conference the following report for 1892-93. We present, first, Principal Bannister's report.

To the Trustees of Stanstead Wesleyan College:

GENTLEMEN, -I submit the following report for 1892-93:

I. The total number of pupils enrolled during the year has been 169-92 boys and young men, and 77 girls and young women. The average attendance has been somewhat lessened by protracted sickness.

II. Two undergraduates passed the intermediate examination in arts of McGill University, and four have passed the first year examinations. Two young ladies have completed the course for M.L.A., and three others the course in music. About forty pupils will write on the Government examinations; of these, nine will take the A.A. or Matriculation examination.

Seven are preparing for a Model School teachers' diploma, and two for Thirteen young ladies and twelve young men have completed the Commercial Course, and will receive diplomas at convocation.

III. The small surplus of the preceding year was wisely and economically expended in repairs and furnishing. The convenience and comfort of all the college inmates have been greatly increased by the admission of water from the International Waterworks.

Although the College was closed for two weeks in November on account of sickness, and several students did not return until after Christmas, I shall be able to place a fair amount to the credit of the Trustees.

IV. The fact that the present Principal is leaving after one year's experience at Stanstead, does not indicate that he has not faith in the success of the College; he believes that the status of the College is better and the prospects brighter than ever before.

We would most earnestly commend the College to the patronage of our friends throughout the Conference. We have secured as Principal a gentleman who is widely known throughout the entire constituency of the institution, and we feel sure that this will greatly facilitate your efforts in canvassing for students. The staff of teachers is exceptionally good; the building will be in excellent condition for the year's work when the opening takes place; the courses offered are well adapted to the wants of the community; and the terms are extremely favorable. With these inducements the College should be full. Do your best to bring about such a desirable consummation.

The debt has given the Board a great deal of thought, and while the efforts to reduce it have been fairly successful during the year, there remains much to be done.

If those Districts which have not yet made a special effort to provide for the amount allotted to them, would make an earnest effort this fall to do so, and thus secure the payment of what has been deposited in the bank or guaranteed by the Circuits, the whole debt might be annihilated before next Conference. In the meantime, it is important that each Circuit that has guaranteed a sum toward the debt, should see to it that the interest is annually paid to the Secretary.

In view of the special facilities afforded and the generous inducements offered, we recommend that the Conference be respectfully requested to urge all young men contemplating preparation for the ministry to attend Stanstead Wesleyan College.

Your Board have to report the resignation of Principal Bannister, which takes effect at the close of the current Academic year. Mr. Bannister entered upon his duties one year ago, and your Board then felt that his reputation as an educator warranted the expectation of the continued and increasing prosperity of the institution.

The record of the year under his management, though as yet incomplete is, in many respects, very gratifying.

In the selection of a successor, your Board believes it has been exceptionally fortunate.

For several years, as the Principalship has become vacant, the services of Rev. C. R. Flanders, B.A., have been sought, but hitherto without success. It is with great satisfaction that Mr. Flanders' consent to the acceptance of the Principalship is now announced, and his appointment to the position recommended to the Conference.

The fitness of the selection will commend itself to all. Your Board deplores frequency of change of management, believing it has in the past militated against the continuous growth and largest success of the College, and cherishes the hope that henceforth the tenure of the Principalship may be marked by greater permanency.

We would earnestly recommend that the present scheme, inaugurated two years ago, of dividing the debt among the various Districts, and those

Districts again apportioning the amounts to the various charges, be energetically carried out; that the Chairman of each District, or some other minister deputed by him, visit each Quarterly Board on the District and lay the matter before them so as to secure their co-operation and a guarantee of the amount required; that in case any charge may not think it feasible to raise the amount this year, the interest on the amount be arranged for until such times as the amount may be raised.

REPORT OF THE WESLEYAN THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE.

To the Montreal Conference of the Methodist Church:

DEAR BRETHREN,—The Executive Officers of the Wesleyan Theological College, Montreal, affiliated to the McGill University, respectfully submit to you the following brief report of the work and general interests

1. Educational.—We are prepared to offer the widest range of suitable curricula for young men in training for the ministry. In Arts, the whole equipment of McGill University is available to this institution. This University, in extent of endowment and appliances, now ranks as one of the strongest in America, and it is a conspicuous and gratifying fact that it is so decidedly permeated with an evangelical spirit. Methodist students

do credit to themselves, their Church and their Theological College, in mingling here in a common University arena with representatives of other denominations. Students are prepared for University Matriculation as well as for the Conference Preliminary Examination.

In Theology, some students confine themselves to the ordinary course for Probationers. Provision, however, is made for a much heavier course for Licentiates in Theology, requiring three years' attendance at Lectures, and including one-half (the most useful part) of the pass work in Arts, namely, Logic, Mental Philosophy, Moral Philosophy, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Geology, Hebrew (2 years preparatory to the B.D. course), and French (obligatory on Montreal Conference students). These are taken in McGill University. In addition, the student takes Algebra, Geometry and three years in English. Accompanying this Arts work, there is a full course in Dogmatics, Apologetics, Greek, Latin, History, Homiletics, Church Polity, Elocution and Vocal Music. There is also the higher course in Divinity leading to the degree of B.D., which is thought to be as extensive and serviceable as the B.D. Course of any other Theological College in Canada.

The number of students the past session was as follows: Undergraduates in Divinity, 18; in Arts, 10; Licentiates' Course, 28; Conference Course, 10; Preliminary and Matriculation, 6. Total, 72.

2. Financial.—The assets of the College are over \$120,000, in buildings and endowment. The administration is marked by rigid economy, and a constant effort to avoid debt. To meet the demands of the rapidly increasing work, there is pressing need of enlargement, both of endowment and buildings. For the endowment, a special effort is now being made, by the direction of the Montreal Conference, by the Rev. W. Harris, who has secured, during the past eleven months, subscriptions of \$17,000. The Boarding Department is conducted on the principle of the entire income being spent for supplies and service (apart from fuel and gas). There is thus secured most comfortable residence at the lowest rates of charges. The current expenses of the College are about \$6,000, and of the Boarding Department, \$4,000.

REPORT OF THE FRENCH METHODIST INSTITUTE, COTE ST. ANTOINE, MONTREAL.

The thirteenth session of the French Methodist Institute, being the fourth since its amalgamation with the Girls' Boarding School at Actonvale, has been brought to a successful conclusion.

The number of students in attendance has been 84, an increase of 12 over the previous year. Of these 45 have been male and 39 female pupils; 12 coming from Roman Catholic homes.

During the winter the work of the school has been continued without interruption, the progress made in many instances being most encouraging, and in the final examination merit has been rewarded with prizes provided by a few friends of the Institute. Among our examiners have been Mr. Banwell Sawyer, Rev. W. Groulx, of Sabrevois College, a former student of the Institute; Revs. A. F. Rivard, Charles E. Bland, B.A., B.D., and Prof. W. M. Patton, B. A., B.D., of the Wesleyan Theological College.

We gratefully recognize the hearty support of the Parent Missionary Society and the Woman's Missionary Society. Our other benefactors have been many; friends sending in funds for the support of special students, donations of clothing, books, etc. Special mention should be made of a gift of seventy volumes, a handsome addition to the Institute Library from two of our Directors, Mr. and Mrs. Charles Morton.

To Rev. S. P. Rose, D.D., and the Trustees of Douglas Church, the Faculty and Students are indebted for words of wisest counsel and for pew accommodation.

As in past years, the joy of Thanksgiving Day and the gladness of Christmas have been accentuated by the thoughtful generosity of the members of Douglas Mission Band, who have also given of their time and skill to improve our pupils in sewing and drawing.

The work of the session, so far as studies are concerned, has been faithfully attended to, as those who know the Head Master, Rev. Leopold Massicotte, S.T.L., and our highly esteemed Lady Teacher, Miss Masten, would naturally expect. Prof. J. H. REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE,

The attitude of the Methodist Church toward the liquor traffic must ever continue to be that of uncompromising hostility, until its total suppression shall have been fully accomplished.

We hail with grateful recognition the growing public sentiment in favor of the principles of total abstinence and prohibition, of which our Church has ever been the earnest advocate.

We would remind our membership of the declaration of the General Conference that the traffic in intoxicating liquor can never be legalized It must therefore be our loyal duty to see to it that this sin does not lie at the door of any one of us, by any connection with it, either by the signing of any application for license, leasing property for liquor selling, or by supporting by our ballots, men who vote to perpetuate this giant evil.

In view of the fact that the electors of Ontario are to have the question of the prohibition of the liquor traffic before them in the form of a plebiscite, and recognizing the importance of securing an overwhelming vote in favor of prohibition, this Conference earnestly requests its ministers in Ontario to make such arrangements on their respective fields of labor as shall secure the fullest possible vote in favor of prohibition, to co-operate with the organized temperance societies, where such exist, and where such do not exist, to be responsible for placing the matter before our people, and directing the necessary organization. We also recommend that the

Financial District Meetings of this Conference in Ontario be requested to arrange for public meetings in favor of prohibition on the various circuits next fall.

That there be forwarded to the editor of the Christian Guardian a request that special prominence be given in our Church organ to the question of prohibition, and that our Book Room authorities be also requested to provide a supply of suitable literature for distribution in the

approaching campaign.

Regarding the resolution forwarded to the Conference from the Perth District, your Committee would strongly urge upon the members of this Conference the duty of securing the election as members of Parliament-Provincial and Dominion-of Christian men, who will publicly declare that, on the question of the prohibition of the liquor traffic, they will act independent of any party consideration in favor of prohibition. may be accomplished, we believe it to be the duty of the members of our Church to be active in the selection of the candidates who are to receive their votes, and not delay until political parties have placed candidates in the field, none of whom may be worthy of support.

That we, as a Conference, declare that, in view of the magnitude of the evils of intemperance, so apparent to all, and the great barrier to the extension of Christ's kingdom, which the liquor traffic undoubtedly is, no Government having the power to prohibit the traffic, and neglecting to

do so, is worthy of the support of Christian electors.

Your Committee would also record its profound astonishment at the action of the Legislature of the Province of Quebec at its recent session, in declaring that beer, containing not more than four per cent. alcohol, is not intoxicating. We regard this as not only absurd but exceedingly dangerous, especially to the youth of our country, who are thus deceived and lured to ruin by the declaration of men, whose position as legislators, give to it an importance and significance that even the scientific absurdity of the declaration does not destroy.

Your Committee recommend that this Conference petition the Government of the Province of Quebec to protect from the insult and abuse of its servants, the License Commissioners, those citizens who are specially engaged in endeavoring to promote the moral welfare of the community, and that no special advantages be granted to those who are seeking to ruin their fellowmen by increasing temptation to evil, which are refused to

those who are seeking their good.

Your Committee recommend that the Conference comply with the request of the Dominion Alliance to send four delegates to the annual meeting of the Alliance Council, and that Rev. G. G. Huxtable, Rev. James Kines, Mr. C. B. Taggart and Mr. Asa Beach be named as delegates.

SABBATH SCHOOL REPORT.

We report with much thankfulness the healthy condition of our Sabbath School work. We find an increase in numbers of teachers and scholars, an advance in missionary and Sabbath School funds, and a larger increase in the circulation of our Sabbath School literature, except the Onward, which we strongly recommend our Sabbath Schools to take for the use of adult members.

We regret to report a falling off in the number of scholars learning catechism, and would urge superintendents to give more attention to that

Your Committee is of the opinion that our Sabbath School work would be greatly benefited if a more systematic study of the lesson were adopted during the week. Only 38 of our 500 schools report holding regular meetings for that purpose.

We would express our conviction that the purpose of the School is to instruct, not only the young, but the adult members of the congregation in the Word of God, and that efforts should be made to secure the attendance of the latter at the Bible-class. Also, that when it is possible, catechumen classes should be formed, and attendance of the children at church service be secured by frequent addresses to them.

We are glad to observe the gratifying increase of about \$2,000 in the Missionary Fund, \$119 in the Educational Fund, \$49 in the Contingent Fund, \$46 in the Union Church Relief Fund, and \$95 in the Sabbath School Aid Fund. W regret to find that the receipts of our General Conference Fund show a decrease of \$32.33.

We note with pleasure the increasing vigor and success with which the Woman's Missionary Society continues its work, having raised in this Conference \$4,683, during the year.

It is earnestly recommended that a more vigorous effort be made on all our charges to greatly increase the receipts of the Sustentation Fund.

Re memorial from Nipissing District, we deem it undesirable to unnecessarily occupy the same ground as our Presbyterian brethren, but we think that action in each case must be referred to the judgment of the Chairman and ministers concerned.

We suggest that on our weak circuits or missions where the minister in charge is receiving but a limited support, that a visit from the Chairman, or someone named by him at the August Quarterly Meeting, would greatly aid in increased ministerial support, and that such visits be made in the future.

We would call attention of the ministers to the importance of manifesting greater interest in the children of our Church, and, as far as practicable, getting them into catechumen classes, by which Christian and doctrinal training they may develop into devoted and intelligent Church members.

Increased attention has been paid to the organization of our young people into Epworth League Societies. These now number 97, with a membership of 4,141. Still your Committee thinks much more can and ought to be done in this direction, when it is remembered that we have over 650 preaching places.

While we recognize the good work done by the Christian Endeavor, and other young people's organizations, yet in view of the increasing number of these societies, we earnestly hope that where there are other young people's societies in connection with our churches, they will, as speedily as possible, organize under the Constitution of Epworth League of Christian Endeavor, so that they may, according to the laws of our Church, be represented on our Official Boards.

Our Sunday School work shows pleasing aggressiveness, there being an increased number of teachers and scholars, together with an increase of nearly 1,100 signatures to the Temperance Pledge. Encouraging evidence of the practical spirit of our teaching is afforded in the fact that over 1,000 conversions have taken place in our schools during the year. Here we would urge increased fidelity in teaching the catechisms of our Church in every school.

sanctity of the Holy Day is disturbed; that notwithstanding the protest of the Christian Church, boat and railway traffic, the running of street cars, political dinners, and divers minor agencies desecrate the holy Sabbath.

We commend Mr. Charlton, and those who sustained him in the House of Commons, in their efforts to close the Canadian exhibit in connection with the Columbian Exposition at Chicago on the Sabbath; and deplore the fact that the moral sense of the House should be such as to defeat the measure, and thereby lend themselves to the desecration of God's Holy Day, and to the introduction of the continental Sabbath.

We would call the prayerful attention of all our people to the Charlton Bill now before the House of Commons, and in accord with the expressed wish of the "Lord's Day Alliance," invite all our people, especially those who are voters, to so use their influence with their respective members of Parliament as to constrain them to support the aforesaid bill.

We would strongly urge upon all our people to avoid the use of railway, boat, street car, and other public conveyances on the Sabbath; also social visiting; and while we thus urge our people we would be consistent in setting the wholesome example.

Believing that the proper observance of the Sabbath is closely allied with Christian and national life, we would urge upon all our ministers to frequently refer to this subject, and to preach a sermon thereon annually, say, on the second Sabbath of July.

We would remind all among our people who have to do with the education of the young, the vast importance of properly and carefully instructing them on the value and proper observance of the Sabbath.

REPORT OF STATISTICAL COMMITTEE.

After careful and prolonged examination of the District Schedules, your Committee have found that an advance of about \$2,000 has been made in the contributions to the Missionary Fund; \$126 to the Superannuation Fund; \$119 to the Educational. Other funds remain about the same as last year, except General Conference and Sustentation, which show a slight decrease.

The contributions to the Woman's Missionary Fund have been increased by the sum of \$57.

In the membership returns we find great losses reported in consequence of removals, excisions and deaths, amounting in all to 3,742. But in this connection we find reason for grateful acknowledgment of the divine presence and saving grace upon our Circuits, in the fact that there is a net increase of 563 in the membership of our Church within the bounds of this Conference.

We now report 34,948 full members; 1,378 on trial; total, 36,326. The rite of baptism has been administered to 2,806 children and 232 adults; total, 3,038; marriages performed, 999; burials attended, 1,526. The income during the year for Connexional Funds is as follows:—

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

Report of the Board of the Superannuation Fund, for the Year ending July 31st, 1892.

We have pleasure in being able to state that the income for the Annual Fund has increased from circuits, \$1,443.16, and from ministers' subscriptions, \$435.41; thus enabling us to meet the claims in full, notwithstanding the increased expenses, as shown in the financial statement, and yet keep within the estimates for the year.

There has also been an addition of \$12,373.91 made to the capital account in the item of legacies, being an increase over the preceding year This shows a very commendable disposition on the part of our friends to contribute in this way for the permanent benefit of the Fund.

It has been found very difficult to secure safe investments for our funds at present rates. We have therefore been under the necessity of keeping a larger amount in the bank than we thought to be desirable. however, considered better to do this than to invest in doubtful securities. This has led to a falling off in our interest account of about \$340.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EVANGELISTIC WORK.

Your Committee appointed to enquire into the methods and results of our evangelistic work, beg leave to report:—

That we have pursued our investigations more especially in the directions indicated below; that we have taken the evidence of a large number of the brethren who have had intimate knowledge of the labors of our Conference evangelist and his work, and various other persons, male and female, who have been engaged in this work.

We find first that the financial report of Rev. R. C. Horner presented to the Conference was, according to Mr. Horner's own statement, only partial, representing merely the net surplus after all expenses had been paid, such as moving the tent, salary of singer, board and other expenses. As to the general benefits of these evangelistic efforts, we find that, although we are assured that souls have been converted and believers sanctified, yet the results, spiritual and financial, have as a rule been sadly disappointing.

We find that there have been serious irregularities in the prosecution of our evangelistic work, especially in the following particulars, viz.: In the mode of conducting prayer and inquiry meetings, in which the people were permitted and sometimes encouraged to pray aloud simultaneously, tending to confusion and disorder.

We find that physical manifestations, not calculated to commend our common Christianity to the hearts and consciences of men, but tending rather to bring it into disrepute, such as prostration, ecstasy, immoderate laughter, etc., are common; and we judge that sufficient effort is not exerted towards their restraint and control.

Reports concerning the methods of the evangelists, their teaching and spirit, have reached us which we do not fully accept, believing them to be exaggerated. Nevertheless, we find that a censorious spirit is exhibited leading to unkind criticism and condemnation of both ministers and members of our Church, who do not see their way clear to adopt the methods referred to above; and we further find that a spirit of disloyalty to our Church and her institutions is a very painful and frequent outcome.

While your Committee recognize the necessity for and utility of evangelistic work, and are desirous that it should be most vigorously prosecuted on all our Circuits and Missions, and while we recognize that the doctrine of perfect love, as taught by Wesley and by his Divine Master and ours, should be made most prominent in our teaching and conduct, yet because of the irregularities referred to above, we recommend that no Conference Evangelist be appointed for the present year.

And further, that a committee be appointed by the Conference to examine all those that desire to labor as evangelists among us, as to character, doctrine and methods, and that our ministers and Quarterly Boards be requested not to employ any evangelists not thus accredited, and that a circular be sent to our Quarterly Boards asking them to assist in carrying out these regulations.

We therefore recommend that the Conference appoint a committee to hold these examinations, and prepare and forward these circulars.

Whereas,—The Government of Continental India stands unhappily connected with the manufacture of gin and opium to the alarming ruin of the people of India and especially of China; and whereas, state protection of vice obtains in all military cantonments in India; and whereas, the Decennial Conference of Missionaries met, and in a moment of weakness, at the suggestion of a mistaken prudence, refused to pass condemnatory resolutions, thus impairing the moral influence of the missionaries in India; and whereas, the Christian public of England desire the sympathy and co-operation of the Christians in the Dominion in their solemn protest against the action of the Decennial Conference. Therefore, be it

Resolved,—That we, the ministers and laymen of the Montreal Conference, express our profound regret at the moral cowardice indicated at the Decennial Conference in their refusal to condemn the administration of the Indian Government anent the manufacture of gin and opium, and especially the governmental protection in the license of vice; and that a copy of this resolution be transmitted to Bishop Thoburn, of Calcutta, and also to the Mission House of the Wesleyan Church, London.

Whereas, in a pre-eminent degree the Christian sentiment of this Continent, and indeed the world, has been insulted and repudiated by the opening of the Chicago Exhibition on the Sabbath; therefore, be it

Resolved, - That we, the ministers and laymen of this Montreal Conference, pledge our sympathy and moral support to Mr. Charlton, and those members of Parliament who are endeavoring to secure legislation for the protection of Sabbath sanctity.

Resolved further, -- That we solemnly declare that the appropriate answer by all true Christians to the moral defiance of the Directors of the Chicago Exhibition should be to antagonize and avoid the aforesaid

Resolved also,—That in sympathy with our American brethren, our Book Steward, Dr. Briggs, be requested to withdraw his exhibit from the Exhibition, as a protest against the violation of the fourth command of the Decalogue, which guarantees at once the claims of God and the

STANDING RESOLUTIONS.

It was Resolved,-That the following resolution, passed at a former Conference session, be retained in the printed Minutes as a standing resolution: "That the Librarian of the Wesleyan Theological College be requested to take the custody of completed District Journals and other Church documents of valuable historical interest, to be deposited in the Library of said institution, and to be accessible at all times to members

Re DEGREES.

In relation to the recognition of Academic Titles, the Board of Examiners recommends:-

1. That all Degrees from Canadian Universities and Theological Colleges be recognized in the Conference records.

2. That continued recognition be given to all Degrees recognized in the

Minutes of 1891.

3. That in the case of foreign Degrees, on the same being reported to the Board of Examiners, recognition shall be given by not less than a two-thirds vote of the Examiners present at the Annual Meeting. Action may be delayed by the Board calling for further information, or for production of the Calendars of the Colleges concerned, or of the Diplomas.

4 Diplomas shall in no case be recognized from so-called "Correspondence Colleges," which have no provision for lectures and for instruc-

tion of resident students.

ADDRESS

OF THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE TO THE CHURCHES UNDER ITS CARE.

In addressing you on the occasion of our Tenth Annual Session, we are prompted first of all to express our thankfulness to God that the year has been marked by gain in membership and increase in gifts to the various institutions and enterprises of the Church. God's blessing has been with us, despite the many imperfections, which should prompt us to constant vigilance and humility. We gratefully note that, notwithstanding the continual drain of population westward, our membership is larger to-day than a year ago by 563. The missionary givings also have been increased by \$2,000, and all the other leading funds of the Church are in advance, with the exception of the Sustentation Fund, the importance of which we think has not yet been fully recognized.

Suffer us in the second place to earnestly bespeak your unfaltering fidelity to the doctrines of our beloved Methodism. Their conformity to the teachings of the Holy Scriptures; their reverent recognition of the inspiration of the Word of God and of its sufficiency as a guide in faith and practice; their emphatic declaration of the breadth of divine grace and the freedom of human choice; their insistence upon the atoning sacrifice of Christ as the ground of acceptance with God, and upon obedience to the divine will as indispensable to the continual enjoyment of the divine favor; the unique emphasis which they have ever laid upon the necessity of the new birth, the privilege of every child of God to know his sins forgiven, and the sacred obligation of purity of heart and holiness of life through the presence and power of the Divine Spirit. These characteristics invest our body of Methodist doctrine with a supreme claim to our loyalty and love. In it is given a basis of doctrine at once rational, practical and evangelistic, and permit us to remind you that a deep experience in divine things is with the spirit and the understanding also.

Our institutions, too, merit reference here. We notice with gratification the liberal response that has been made to the appeal on behalf of the Wesleyan Theological College, of Montreal. This institution, peculiarly the child of the Montreal Conference, claims and deserves our special support; and we confidently expect that the energetic Secretary of the College will find the success of last year's canvass excelled in the year to come.

We commend also to you again Stanstead College, another child of the Conference. In the new Principal, Rev. C. R. Flanders, B.A., and the able coadjutor he will have in his wife, we look for enlarged usefulness to this institution, and we hope its advantages will be carefully examined by those of you who purpose educating your children away from home.

To our young people we turn with ever-increasing joy and hopefulness. The organization of the Christian young people of our land for religious fellowship and service is the Church's answer to-day to the doleful predictions uttered in every age regarding her future. To you, organized in Epworth Leagues or in Societies of Christian Endeavor, or in the happy combination of the two recommended by the General Conference, as well as in the manifold other forms of religious associations, we say that frankly and heartily we rejoice in your activity as young people. Without misgiving, we yield you the measure of independence most stimulating to your zeal. With new and fascinating

hope in the possibilities of the future, we see that you are finding and proving that the most genuine loyalty to the mother Church is consistent with not less genuine joy in the larger fellowship of all who love the Lord Jesus Christ. We desire that your piety may find ever-deeper root through the systematic and devotional study of the Word of God; and we caution you against any other measure of prosperity, whether in membership or in outward activities, than the conscious union of the individual soul with the indwelling Saviour. We do covet that you exercise all the activities of a rich, full and varied life in an abiding and most real sense of the presence of God.

In making the customary reference to the Temperance Reform, we rejoice at least in this that the time is drawing manifestly nearer when such references will be obsolete.

We think we may reasonably expect that Ontario will not fall behind the record of Manitoba in the approaching plebiscite, in regard to which we feel we need not urge those of you who live in that province to do all that lies in your power to make that popular deliverance unmistakable and resistless.

Yet in larger movements let not the value of local measures of restriction be overlooked. The community is educated by agitation. We feel strongly also that in Canada, at least, the Temperance Reform has not paid sufficient attention to institutions, such as coffee houses, etc., which provide for sociality without the dangerous accompaniments which frequently attend it. We believe also that the steeping of the minds of the young with sound ideas on the nature and effects of intoxicants through school text-books, Bands of Hope and Sunday School instruction, is in its promise of usefulness second to no other temperance agency. And finally, we would most earnestly urge upon both our ministers and people the supreme importance of giving their franchise, irrespective of prohibition.

In the spirit of secularization of the Lord's day, we recognize a danger more subtle but hardly less to be feared than the liquor traffic and the drinking

Resist the beginnings of this evil. Against the encroachments of travel and business and pleasure, maintain the sacred right of every man to a day of rest and worship. With our grieved and insulted fellow-Christians of the United States, withhold all countenance and patronage from that great Exposition which, over the garnered achievements of the art and science of the race, would fly a flag that is not Christ's.

We rejoice that the missionary enterprise has entered on a new era. Yet to-day we believe is only the introduction to a more consecrated morrow. Whatever be our missionary knowledge and sympathy, let us each beware of contentment; rather let us ever be forgetting the things that are behind and pressing onward to a nobler offering of wealth and life.

Side by side with the evangelization of the Pagan world is the christianization of the evangelized world. The Christianity of so-called Christian nations is often scarcely skin deep. Especially do the great problems of the christianization of politics and of the money-making forces of the world call for strenuous endeavor and high self-sacrifice. Christianity still has need of the heroic virtues. Despair is atheism.

The greatest peril, however, is perhaps found in the changed policy of the world. It seeks to-day not to destroy, but to control the Church of Christ. Let there be then in the Church no countenance to the exaggerated respect for wealth. In social and commercial life, have faith in the law of righteousness as the only guarantee of stability and true prosperity.

With you we would gird ourselves for an uncompromising and unresting warfare on every social usage, business principle, political method, which cannot find sanction in the laws of the kingdom of God.
