RUSSIA ARRANGES FOR
EXCHANGE WITH AUSTRIA

Moscow, June 18—(Tuesday, by the Associated Press)—An understanding has been reached between Russia and Austria that, pending final agreement regarding the repatriation of war prisoners, able-bodied prisoners may be exchanged immediately head for head in numbers as great as the carrying capacity of railroads and other means of transportation permit. It is also stipulated that civil prisoners of military age shall be released.



TWENTY-FIVE CANNIERIES IN ONE ONTARIO COUNTY

Well on to 1,000 Cars of Canned Goods Froduced in One Season

A neat little booklet, prepared by District Représentative MacVannel and published by The Picton Times, puts in a nutshell the agricultural position of Prince Edward county, Ontario. And that position is one of which the county has good reason to be proud.

The agricultural output of Prince Edward for 1917 was valued in this booklet at eight and a quarter million dollars. at eight and a quarter million dollars. The value of grain produced is put at one and three-quarter millions, of which \$100,000 is credited to peas produced for seed. The second largest item is cheese and butter, \$1,500,000; cattle and canned fruits and vegetables are put at one and a quarter millions each, with hay and clover at \$880,000. Of course some of these items are duplicates as the of these items are duplicates, as the grains and fodder are largely raw materials for the production of cattle, dairy goods and hogs, which latter are credited with an out-turn of \$500,000.

Marvellous Expansion Since 1882. The canning industry of Prince Edward county deserves special mention. The output of this industry last year was estimated, as stated, at one and a quarter millions, but this figure would have been doubled had not 1917 been a





PUBLIC NOTICE

Military Service Act, 1917

Men 19 and 20 Years of Age Harvest Leave

Leave of Absence on Ground of Extreme Hardship Procedure to Obtain Leave of Absence

Men Nineteen and Twenty Years of Age.

It has come to the attention of the Government that there is a widespread impression that young men of nineteen years, and those who became twenty since October 13, 1917, as well as those who may become nineteen from time to time and who have been or will be called upon to register under the Military Service Act, are to be immediately called to the colours.

This impression is quite incorrect. No date has yet been fixed for calling upon such men to so report for duty, nor has the question been brought before the Cabinet for decision. In view of the need of labour on the farm, it is most unlikely that consideration will be given to the matter until after the harvest is over, although of course the Government's action must be determined primarily

by the military situation. There is no further obligation incumbent upon young men of the ages above mentioned who have registered or who do so hereafter, until they receive notice from the Registrars.

Harvest Leave.

Some enquiries have been received as to the possibility of granting harvest leave to such troops as may be in the country at that time. No definite assurance can be given on this point as advantage must be taken of ships as they become available. On the other hand, harvest leave will be given if at all possible.

Leave of Absence on Grounds of Extreme Hardship.

It is desired that the Regulations respecting leave of absence in cases of hardship should be widely known and fully understood. Such leave will be granted in two cases:— (a) where extreme hardship arises by reason of the fact that the man concerned is either the only son capable of earning a livlihood, of a father killed or disabled on service or presently in service overseas, or in training for such service, or under treatment after returning from overseas; or the only remaining of two or more brothers capable of earning a livelihood (the other brother or brothers having been killed or disabled on service, or being presently in service overseas, or in training for overseas or under treatment after his or their return from overseas); brothers married before 4th August, 1914, living in separate establishments and having a child or children not to be counted, in determining the fact that the man is the "only" remaining son or brother; where extreme hardship arises by reason of exceptional circumstances such as the fact that the man c oncerned is the sole support of a widowedmother, an invalid father or other helple

It is to be noted that in all these cases the governing factor is not hardship, loss or suffering to the individual concerned, but to others, that is, members of

his family or those depending on him. Procedure to obtain leave of absence.

A simple system for dealing with these cases has been adopted. Forms of application have been supplied to every Depot Battalion and an officer of each battalion has been detailed whose duty it is to give them immediate attention. The man concerned should on reporting to his unit state that he desires to apply for leave of absence on one or more of the grounds mentioned and his application form will then be filled out and forwarded to Militia Headquarters, Ottawa. In the meantime, if the case appears meritorious, the man will be given provisional leave of absence for thirty days so that he may return home and continue his civil occupation while his case is being finally disposed of.


