





## To The Electors of The City of St. John

Ladies and Gentlemen :-

The majority of our citizens are dissatisfied with the present are dissatisfied with the present system of taxation, feeling that the burden bears too heavily upon those who are doing the most in the building up and improving of our city. I have given a great deal of time and attention to the studying of the principals of taxation as levied here and in o the r Canadian cities and find that in all places where the majority of revenue is raised for city purposes upon income, personal property and improvements, the progress of

such cities is very slow, whereas cities that have adopted the more modern system are advancing rapidly. Vancouver in 1895 had a population of 17,000 and under a gradual scale of reduction of taxes on improvements starting with 25% and in 12 years abolished the entire taxes on improvements, increased the population from 17,000 to 100,000 and the amount of money spent on improvements from 1895 when they were \$4,317,660 in 1909 increased to \$24,405,210. The largest increase being from 1907 when the entire improve-




