Correction of a False Report.
Editor of the Miramichi Advance:

railway company with the Springfield mines for the immediate delivery of 30,000 tons of coal at St. John. The coal will be carried from Springfield to St. John in barges and will then be brought to Montreal over the C. P. R. line. The cost of the latter transportation will be very small, in view of the fact that the freight cars which are used to carry winter freight from Montreal to St. John will be utilized on the return journey to carry the coal westward.

Heretofore these freight cars have come back from St. John empty, they being practically no return freight from that port to Montreal. By the present project the C. P. R. will have at once solved the important problem of return freight from the port and may accomplish a considerable development of the Nova Scotia coal fields.

Big Game on the Miramichi.
It is doubtful if even many of our own people realize what a splendid game country the Miramichi is. Its reputation as a salmon-fishing resort is, of course, well established, although particular are not so readily obtainable in regard to fish as big game, but there is no other region in North America of such easy access where hunters may count as surely on securing game as on the Miramichi. As an illustration of the truth of what we state some of the most successful hunters of the operations in this locality will be interesting.

On Friday last, Mr. L. M. Thatcher, of New York, who had George McKay as partner, arrived from the coast, having secured on the Tomopogo with a fine moose.

Messrs. Wm. Crawford of New York and A. B. Wallace of Springfield, who had Messrs. Wm. and Geo. Besing as guides, arrived from the head waters of the North-west Miramichi, having killed two moose and a bear, which they brought with them.

On Sunday last, Ernest Houston and David Whiting of Boston, who were guided by Ned Menzie and Wm. McKay on Mountain Brook Lakes, Northwest Miramichi, brought out with them each a moose, which were fine specimens.

On Thursday of last week Dr. Calle and Adolph Knott of New York, whose guides were James Manderville and son, came out from the Little Southwest Miramichi region with two moose and two caribou. The moose heads had antlers spreading 23 and 21 inches respectively and one set of the caribou antlers had 27 prongs.

S. C. Stanley of Lawrence, Mass., also came out on Thursday from the Renous River, where he was guided by Ned Manderville. He had a fine moose with him, which he killed in that region.

Messrs. H. McK. Kirkland and Irving Kinson of New York also came out to New-castle on Thursday with two moose which they killed on the Gagneux Lake grounds, where they had John Wambold as guide.

Edwin C. Holmes, of Boston, is under the guidance of Arthur Pringle in the Bald Mountain region of Northwest Miramichi.

Dr. Calais and Gester of New York are up the North Branch, Little S. W. Miramichi in Gagneux country with El and John White as guides.
