he anti-liquor crusade, which is of pecumovement had its beginning. The main practical results that have been accompractical results that have been accomplished are the creation of a powerful public sentiment against bar-rooms and dissipation, and, as a consequence, a material reduction of consumption of liquors. Every county in Ohio has its women's prayer leagues, and through their efforts some three hundred bar-rooms have been closed; the open traffic in liquors has been for the present at least, closed in some twenty or more towns, ranging in population from 6000 down to little hamlets of a dozen families; also in several counties. While it is true that opposition to the movement has gained strength, it is also true that the crusade is stronger to-day than it has been at any previous period. The prayer leagues embrace a greater territory than ever before, are better organized, and are more resolute in their determination. They are meeting with success in smaller places, which encourages their belief that they will ultimately suppress the traffic in the interior of the State; but in large cities, like Dayton, Columbus, Toledo, Cleveland and Cincinnati, they do not seem to accomplish anything beyond the creation of an influence adverse to the liquor traffic. The street movement, which began in Cincinnati, Cleveland and Columbus last week, produced such a popular commotion that the authorities interfered, and have practically driven the women back into the churches.
