## GRAND MASTER'S ADDRESS.

The Most Worshipful Grand Master delivered the following address :

BRETHREN,—

The meeting of the members of Grand Lodge to-day on this our Fourteenth Annual Communication, reminds us that another year with all its changes, pleasures and adversities has passed beyond the level of time. In our

little Province we have great reason to feel thankful to the Great Architect of the Universe for the many blessings we have enjoyed—a healthy climate and productive soil are advantages which cannot be too highly appreciated, and when we consider how we have been preserved from the ravages of pestilence, tornadoes and floods such as our brethren in parts of the United States have unfortunately passed through within the past year, we have indeed cause to thank the Great Giver of all good for His manifold mercies to us in this beautiful little Island.

The year which has just ended has been one of peace and harmony amongst the fraternity in this jurisdiction.

The membership of our Lodges shows but a slight increase during the year. The number of demits granted and the suspension for non-payment of dues, have almost equalled our gain, in new members you will however be glad to know that but few suspensions for non-payment of dues have taken place within the past year, and we trust this evil will soon be unknown amongst us.

Since our last annual meeting four members of the Subordinate Lodges have gone to that "bourne from whence no traveller ere returns." We trust our loss is their eternal gain.

The Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia has sustained a severe loss in the death of their highly esteemed and most efficient Grand Secretary, R. W. Bro. Benjamin Curran.

In the United States several distinguished Masons have been called to the Grand Lodge above, amongst whom the one best known and most universally respected is Doctor Robert Morris, P. G. I have not been called upon for any decisions of importance during the past year.

I have granted one dispensation to confer the second and third degrees within shorter periods than required by our constitution, to a brother who was leaving the Province. I also granted a dispensation to the Members of Victoria Lodge, to wear regalia at a Masonic Social, held by them at Masonic Hall, in Charlottetown.

#### GRAND SECRETARY'S REPORT.

*To the M. W. Grand Lodge of Prince Edward Island :*

I beg to submit my Annual Report and Account for the year just ended.

The Proceedings of the M. W. Grand Lodge for the year ending 24th June, 1888, were printed and copies forwarded to all the members of Grand Lodge, and as is customary, three copies each to our sister Grand Lodges.

In July last I wrote to R. W. Bro. D. Murray Lyon, Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Scotland, asking him to obtain our plate for Diplomas from the representatives of the late Brother Alexander Hay. I received a very kind reply, stating that he had obtained the plate, and had ordered one hundred Diplomas to be struck off, which I duly received. Brother Lyon kindly offered to take charge of the plate, and I wrote requesting him to do so.

**GRAND LECTURER'S REPORT.**

*To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge, A. F. & A. M. of Prince Edward Island.*

As Grand Lecturer, I beg to submit the following report of my doings during the past Masonic year.

Immediately after the close of the last annual communication, I wrote to the Secretary of Zetland Lodge, No. 7, offering my services at any time that they might think it proper to call upon me, but owing to so many of their members being absent during the summer

months, they found it impossible to have a sufficient number present to make my visit of any good.

February 4th, 1889, I visited St. Andrew's Lodge, Montague, and it being their regular communication, a good number of the members were present, but owing to the bad state of the roads, and some of their officers residing at a distance, the attendance was not as large as it would otherwise have been.

After transacting their regular business, a Lodge of E. A. was opened and the degree exemplified, which was satisfactory except in a few minor points.

February 14th I visited Zetland Lodge, Alberton, and remained with the members the following day.

All the Officers were present, and a fair number of floor members.

The first evening being the regular communication, I witnessed their mode of transacting business, after which an E. A. Lodge was opened, and the work exemplified. Many questions were asked, and the officers and members appearing anxious to get as much out of my visit as possible, agreed to meet me on the following day, when we devoted the forenoon to the degree of E. A. the afternoon to that of F. C., and the evening to the M. M. degree. Each degree was first worked by myself, then the regular officers, and lastly I again took charge explaining the differences as I proceeded.

Each member worked with a determination to get all the instruction possible, and I am pleased to say, that before leaving them a marked improvement was discernable.

I recommended that they hold Lodges for instruction as often as possible, and thereby continue to improve, this they promised to do.

Zetland Lodge is made up of good material, and with their surroundings should meet with every success.

March 7th, visited Alexandra Lodge, Port Hill.

The attendance was very small, principally caused by bad traveling.

After the general business was concluded, R. W. Bro. Harper, W. M. exemplified the M. M. degree, which was done in a very satisfactory manner, considering that some of the regular Officers were not in attendance. Bro. Harper delivered the lecture in a very impressive manner.

Several members asked me to remain with them the following day, which I concluded to do, but on the morning of that day, learning that but few could be present owing to the bad weather and the prevalence of sickness in that section of the country, the meeting was abandoned.

March 19th I visited Orient Lodge, Souris, the attendance was very good, all the officers present except the Senior Warden, who was in England.

The third degree was conferred, Bro. Brownell, W. M. in the chair.

The work done was very satisfactory and reflected much credit on the officers, showing that my expectations of twelve months ago are being fulfilled.

I may say that the Brother on whom the degree was conferred, passed one of the best examinations in the preceding degree that I ever witnessed.

May 2nd I visited Mount Zion Lodge, Kensington, all the officers present, but few members.

The W. M. (Bro. Hopgood) opened the Lodge and conducted the regular business. Later on P. M. McNutt conferred the F. C. degree on two Brothers in a satisfactory manner. The Middle Chamber Lecture was not given in the best style but with a little practice the officers will soon improve.

I promised the W. M. to be present at the regular communication this month, June, but business calling me from the Province I could not attend.

At every visitation I endeavoured to impress upon the brethren the necessity of holding Lodges for instruction, so that the officers and members generally might become proficient in the work. I also endeavored to show them the benefit to be derived from reading papers on Masonic subjects before the Lodge, and thereby become better learned in the teachings of our symbols.

As St. George's Lodge, Georgetown, hold their regular meeting on Saturday night, I informed one of the brethren that if they would call a special meeting at any time on other than the night named I would attend. I have not heard from them.

During a portion of the winter months, St. John's Lodge held weekly Lodges for instruction at which I attended except on one or two occasions.

And now Brethren I have given a full account of my labors during the year, and am sorry that I cannot report having visited all the Lodges. I would recommend to my successor that he first visit those Lodges I do not report upon.

The time occupied in my visitations was considerable, and though it may appear small work to the brethren generally, perhaps they will be surprised when I inform them that I travelled in all 647 miles.

We are pleased to note that neither envy, discord, nor confusion has been permitted to interrupt the peace and tranquility reigning within our borders, and that our relations with Sister Grand Lodges are unimpaired.

It is gratifying to learn that but few suspensions for non-payment of dues have taken place during the past year, and trust the brethren generally will so study the duties they owe to their Lodges as to make the infliction of that penalty the exception in the near future. In many cases the Masters and Secretaries are responsible for the failure to collect dues. Many brethren can pay once in twelve months without inconvenience, and will do so if called on, but are unable to meet an accumulation of years.

We recommend that a page be set apart in the proceedings of the Grand Lodge to the memory of the brethren of this jurisdiction who have preceded us to the Grand Lodge above, where the Supreme Architect of the Universe forever reigns,—forever presides.

We also recommend that a page be set apart to the memory of the late R. W. Benjamin Curren, for many years Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia; and M. W. Rob. Morris, Past Grand Master of Masons in Kentucky, a great Masonic traveler and a noted Masonic author, crowned Poet Laureate of Free Masonry in New York City, December 17th, 1884. As the author of "We Meet upon the Level and we Part upon the Square," his memory will remain green while Freemasonry shall last.

We note with pleasure the fact that the M. W. Grand Master has not been called upon for any decisions of importance during the past year.

We recommend that the commissions issued during the past year, appointing Representatives of this Grand Lodge near other Grand Lodges, and those recommended by the M. W. Grand Master for appointment near this Grand Lodge, be confirmed.

It gives your Committee very great pleasure to learn that R. W. John W. Morrison has received a commission from the Grand Lodge of Scotland, and we are of opinion that a better choice could not have been made, Bro. Morrison having presided over the first and only Lodge in this Province working under the Grand Lodge of Scotland, and the M. W. Grand Master must have had this fact in view when he recommended him (a Bro. unknown to the officers of that Grand Lodge) for appointment.

We recommend that the Dispensations issued during the past year be approved.

We have no remarks to make on application for recognition from the United Grand Lodge of New South Wales, and the United Grand Lodge of Victoria, the documents pertaining thereto being in the hands of the Committee on Foreign Correspondence.

Your Committee regret that the M. W. Grand Master was unable to accept the fraternal invitation to be present at the Fiftieth Anniversary of the Grand Lodge of Arkansas.

We cannot close this report without an expression of hearty approval of the manner in which the M. W. Brother John Yeo has presided over this Grand Lodge from its organization, a period of fourteen years, and hope he may be long spared to assist us in our deliberations, and further the interests of Freemasonry in this jurisdiction.



**RESTORATION.**—A brother who has been indefinitely suspended, can be restored to membership by a majority vote of the Lodge at any regular communication, notice having been given at a previous regular communication, that a motion to that effect would be made.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

**MASONIC BURIAL.**—The friends of a brother who died while under suspension for non-payment of dues, cannot by paying his dues, entitle him to Masonic burial.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

**MOTIONS.**—A brother who gives notice of motion to amend the Constitution cannot delegate another brother to move in the matter in his absence.—(Proceedings, 1880.)

Demits cannot be granted to entered apprentices and Fellow crafts. 1885.




