BIOGRAPHY.

1. Iruiz, the new minister, is a native of 1812, where his father made his fortune by trading with South America. His two sons have since ennobled the glowing traditions of grand plans put forth by the Cortes in 1812 and 1813, which induced them to quit their counting house. One of the brothers, now dead, emigrated to England after the failure in 1815, and obtained a prize in the lottery of £20,000. The present minister returned to the Madrid Cortes for Cadiz in 1822, but did not take a leading part in the discussions of the day. He is no orator, but his quietness and reserve are a requisite essential at the present moment in Spain. He is well versed in commercial and financial questions, is zealous and vigorous, and cannot be considered a politician.
