CANADIAN DELEGATION - DAVOS SYMPOSIUM

The Honourable Allan J. MacEachen, Deputy Prime Minister and Secretary of State for External Affairs, today announced the composition of the Canadian Delegation which he will head to the Davos Symposium of the European Management Forum in Davos, Switzerland, from January 26 to February 2, 1984. Mr. MacEachen will be accompagnied by the Honourable Gerald Regan, Minister for International Trade, and eighteen chief executive officers from the private sector (names attached).

The Davos Symposium is to be attended by over 600 chief executive officers, mainly from western Europe, political leaders from around the world as well as senior media opinion makers. The main theme for the symposium will be: "The Management of the Recovery: An Economic Outlook." A second major theme to be discussed by world political leaders will be: "International Security in 1984: How can we Unblock the Situation?"

The 1984 Symposium will also focus on Canada through a series of special briefings and seminars to be led by Ministers MacEachen and Regan and various Canadian chief executive officers. Details of the programme and the Delegation are attached.
