On the Western front, the German offensive throughout the whole line, from Alsace to the Belgian coast; and in the vicinity of Verdun they began an attack in great force...

No authentic news was received during the week of the Russian operations in the Tigris. In the Balkan campaign, on the Vardar River just south of the Greek frontier...

The Italian campaign seems to have been prosecuted with great vigor, and with advantage to the Italians...

No news of the East African campaign was forthcoming during the week; but news was received of the final and complete subjugation of the Cameroon by the Entente forces...

Coast towns in Suffolk and Kent, England, were the scenes of raids by German seaplanes, which made their escape after dropping some bombs that did some damage...

The "News of the Sea," and other paragraphs in this issue give the brief telegraphic accounts of all submarine and naval activities reported during the week...

Political and diplomatic matters received much attention throughout the week. The British Government announced its intention to make more effective the blockade of Germany...
