These articles were sorted on Sunday by Drs. Wyman, Ainsworth, and myself, Dr. Gry having been obliged to leave for the day. Bon: I found in the cinders from the furnace: right oscalcis; right astragalus; tibia and fibula phalarges, probably of the middle or ring finger; coronid-proof of lower jaw; numerous fragments of a skull; a human tooth that had a hole in it, as it once filled by dental operation; three blocks of artificial mineral teeth were also found in the cin-ders, without the gold plate; a pearl shirt button was also found in the sabes, and was partially cal-cined. Numerous little cup shaped psices of cop-per, similar to some seen in one of the laboratory drawers, were also found; many pieces of glass were mixed with the sings, and pieces of metals

per, similar to some seen in one of the laboratory drawers, were also found; many pieces of glass were mixed with the siugs, and pieces of metals were found in and among the cinders. These various articles were all carefully exa-mined, and such asneeded chemical analysis were subsequently taken by Dr. Gay and myself and examined. The lumps of metal most abudiant in the furnace cinders were to a ciset lead, and an elloy of tin and lead, in nearly equal proportion; the in predomination in the pieces analysed. The cinders being pounded and washed, disclosed some small globules of gold and an alloy of silver and gold; the amount of gold found was small. After your examination of the buman body com-mitted to you, I made some chemical examinations of the surface which had been disclored on the chest, and one thigh, and found they had been im-baed with a solution of potash. This I determined by chemical analysis, finding potash and a little see sait; there was an evident corrosion of the surface of the skin by the action probably of the gotash, aide by heat. 
