Lack of transport facilities in the west and holding for a raise in Manitoba is the cause assigned for a continued alight duiness in the grain and produce markets. This duiness is worse even in the European than in the American markets, though prices keep steady. Liverpool r ports very little demand and the French markets are nearly as bad.

In the local market wheat holds steady, as in fact do most kinds of grain and produce. Eggs are in demand and the price going up rapidly, and good roll butter is hard to get.

Apples and grapes are the most active in the truit market, while shipments of foreign dried fruits are beginning to arrive. New figs are solling at 6c.


