IN FRENCH NEW ORLEANS.

Old Houses With Wide Verandas, Made Beautiful by Trailing Vines and Flowers—Creole Customs.

The old houses, with their wide verandas are made picturequely beautiful by trailing vines and flowers in this tropical climate, and afford a striking contrast to the severe simplicity of the newer residences on the American side of the city.

The French side of the city sleeps later than the American side. The French shopkeeper sees no necessity of opening up early, for no one will buy until after breakfast, he argues.

And it is at the opera that one sees the very perfection of fashion—the loveliness of a Creole beauty in demure, and the world's model of courtly manners. The dress-circle of the old historic opera house is admirably ranged in boxes so that everyone can see everyone else and also have a most excellent view of the stage.

The American side of the city does not visit the French opera—except on rare occasions, as on ballet nights. The Creole never crosses the street to the American theatre. He cares nothing for even the most highly seasoned opera drama, and even the "living pictures" have failed to draw him across the dividing line.

A new feature of the French opera is the Sunday matinee, which begins at 12.30 p. m. Those who attend church have just time enough to return home, make a cup of black coffee and a bite of cake, and change their church apparel for a grayer one.

In walking along Chartres, St. Louis, and St. Anne streets, the visitor is at once surprised and interested in the curio-shops and other places of business. He sees little dingy offices, fronting on the pavement, containing book-cases, rocking-chairs, the walls lined with paintings of French nobles, and on the centre table is a vase of flowers.

CYCLE VS. STREET RAILWAY.

Nine Thousand Wheels in Toronto Deprive the T. Ry. Co. of a Big Sum.

The rise of the bicycle is a problem to other people besides those who use the roads and those who are engaged in the business directly. It has engaged the very serious attention of street railway corporations, and notably that of the Toronto Railway Company.

The company indeed has found it making so serious an inroad into their business that they have endeavored to get at the facts concerning it, and one result of their enquiry is the fact that there are over 9000 bicycles in use in Toronto, and that by reason of the use of these machines the railway is losing in fares anything from \$300 to \$400 a day for 30 weeks in the year.

The Toronto Railway people are now considering how they can get back some of the money that they have lost in this way, and one proposal made to them is that they should build a class of cars that would have a special section for the wheels, so that they could carry wheelmen to and from the city limits when going on or coming in from long journeys. In this way the wheelmen would be more or less contributors to the company and the crowded streets be relieved at the same time of a portion of their traffic.

The Worthington Engines.

Editor World: It has come to our knowledge that comments have been made in one of the Toronto daily papers concerning the cost of maintenance and fuel required to operate the Worthington pumping engines in the Toronto water works.

Owing to the absence of accurate records it is impossible to determine the amount and percentage of repairs upon these engines, but from our extensive experience in the designing and construction of water works engines during the past forty years, and from the actual records from various cities where our engines are used, we are confident that the engines of our make in your city could not have cost in repairs to exceed 1 1/2 per cent. per annum upon their original cost.

The record from a number of cities where we have installed large pumping engines during the past 25 years shows that the average repairs did not exceed \$20 per annum per engine, with engines costing approximately \$30,000 each. We have an exact account of the complete overhauling of two of our engines, duplicates of our No. 1 engine at Toronto. These engines had been in constant use day and night in direct service for 12 years, a service in which some of the machinery must be constantly in operation. The total cost of repairs amounted to one and one-tenth per cent. per annum upon the original cost of the machinery.

With reference to the quantity of coal consumed by the Toronto engines, we have only to say that these engines, which are 21 and 19 years old respectively, were fully up to date when constructed, and represent a type of large pumping engine now obsolete with the largest engine of the Toronto class having been built over 10 years ago. They are now building high duty engines, fully up to date in fuel economy, and abreast of the times in economic value.

The practical economy of the steam engine has so nearly approached the point of theoretical perfection that the margin of further improvements is brought down to narrow limits, and until some radical departure in heat engines is made, not now discoverable or probable, the Worthington modern high duty engine, with its low cost of repairs, will hold its own for years to come.

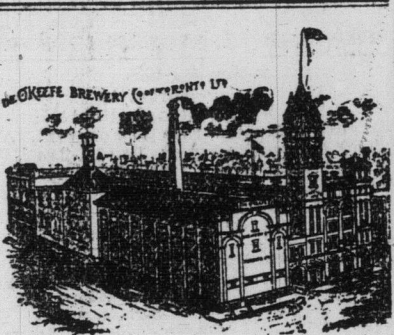

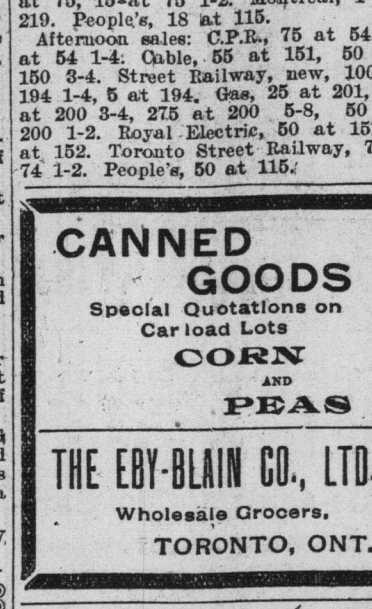
