THE ELECTION RETURNS DISTURB THE MARKET

But Prices Recover From Early Weakness—Canadian Stocks Show More Activity.

World Office, Wednesday Evening, Nov. 7. The Toronto stock market made its individuality more recognizable to-day by further advances in various securities, and a general better undertone to the whole market.

It would seem reasonable to hope for an easing of money rates abroad after the first of the month, and with the December and January dividend and interest disbursements approaching, and the crop-moving completed, and more returns from the west, it would seem reasonable to anticipate easier money locally. We would, therefore, have to hold out to expect a continuation of the present market for the purchase of sound and permanent bond investments.

Money market will probably require some further help from treasury, which may be the form of another redemption of government bonds. Eighteen bonds for fourth week of October show average gross increase of 21.22 per cent.

The Bank of France has released this far this week \$2,000,000 in gold to supply a new demand from Egypt. It is thought that the requirements from that quarter will be about satisfied by this new demand, and a very favorable feature of the situation is the willingness of the Bank of France to release this gold.

The feature of the second hour's trading was the strength in the Hill stocks, both Northern Pacific and Great Northern, prepared with Monday's closing, and showing that much loss. On all the leading stocks there is a constant belief to be for the inside interests, who are acquainted with the intentions of the management in regard to the expected results. We continue our advice given freely during the past week that these stocks should be bought for the very great improvement that is almost certain to take place before the month is out.
