## ANNUAL REPORT, 1900.

INTRODUCTION.

In presenting the report for the year ending May 31st, 1900, the Council has to congratulate the members on the satisfactory position of the Association, both with regard to the membership and the finances.

The revenue derived from the higher annual subscriptions has enabled the Finance Committee to meet the following increased expenses:—

In accordance with recent amendments to the City Charter the exemption hitherto enjoyed by the Association as an Educational Institution has been withdrawn and a taxation of \$437.50 exacted.

The building has been put in thorough repair and the Galleries have been renovated and re-decorated.

A satisfactory cash balance has nevertheless been carried forward, as shown in the Treasurer's accounts which may be found on pages 11-15.

## EXHIBITIONS.

### CHRISTMAS EXHIBITION.

A small exhibition of the works of local Artists was held from 16th December to January 2nd, closing with an afternoon reception. The Galleries were open free to the public. The attendance was, members 939, free visitors 405. A few sales were made.

### 22ND LOAN EXHIBITION.

A special Loan Exhibition of Paintings by the Maris Brothers and Horatio Walker, N.A. was opened by an Evening Reception on January 19th, which was largely attended by Members. The works of Jacobus Maris shown were, 29 Oil Paintings, and 6 Water Colour Drawings. Those of Matthys Maris were 3 Oil Paintings and 1 Water Colour Drawing; and the exhibit of Willem Maris included 7 Oil Paintings, 3 Water Colour Drawings and 1 Crayon Drawing.

The Pictures exhibited by Horatio Walker, a Canadian painter of Animals and Pastoral Subjects, comprised 15 Oil Paintings and 9 Water Colours.

During the Exhibition the Ladies Morning Musical Club kindly gave vocal and instrumental music on Saturday afternoons, when Tea was also provided for the Visitors. The attendance was,—Members 2253, Visitors 450, Complimentary Tickets 1162; Total 3865. The Exhibition closed on February 3rd.

### SPRING EXHIBITION.

The 19th Annual Spring Exhibition of Canadian Art was opened by a private view on the evening of March 16th, and closed on April 7th. The number of works exhibited was,—Oils 115, Water Colours and Pastels 57. There were also some Architectural Drawings, Pen and Ink Sketches, and an Exhibit of Decorated China.

A steady improvement was apparent in the quality of the pictures sent in; a notable feature being the number of Portraits, while Landscape was as usual well represented.

The attendance was,—Members 3167, Visitors 1093, Total 4260. The sales were below the average.

## ART CLASSES.

*Director, WILLIAM BRYMNER, R.C.A.*

(Fees for the session \$40, term \$25, month \$10.)

The nineteenth session (1899-1900) of the advanced Art Classes opened on October 13th, 1899, and closed May 11th, 1900 ; 44 pupils attended the classes.

In the competition for the Association Scholarships, 27 took part. The successful ones were :

In the Life Class, Berthe Lemoyne and Helen Galloway McNicoll, equal. The Scholarship was divided, giving one year to each. Honorable mention to Edward Boyd, and special mention for Time Drawing to Eveline Clay.

In the Antique Class, Marie Anne Proulx was awarded the Scholarship.

### MR. BRYMNER'S REPORT.

The classes were exceptionally large during the session of 1899-1900. A model posed five days a week as in the previous winter. A sketch class was held every Wednesday afternoon. Besides the quick sketches a subject was given out every week for composition, in which branch of study much more interest was shown than formerly.

The school was asked to furnish some designs for ornamental dance programmes in colour. A number of these were selected and paid for. The success of these designs led a member of the Art Association to very generously offer fifty dollars to be given for the best drawing or drawings done in the school from life. The money was divided into a first and second prize. The former was won by Miss Cleland, the latter by Miss Lemoyne. The ten drawings made in this competition were exhibited with the other school work at the end of the session in May.

Several pupils left last summer to continue their studies in Paris. It is gratifying to hear that they have taken good places in the schools they are attending. This is especially true of F. W. Hutchison, who won one of the Art Association scholarships last year. Shortly after his entrance into the "Academie Julien" he won school prizes for drawings from the nude. For composition he also took a good place. Others at the same school in Paris are Robert Montgomery and Gordon Mackenzie. Z. Fabien, the winner of a previous Art Association scholarship, is attending Gérôme's Studio in the "Ecole des Beaux Arts."

Two casts from the Elgin marbles and one of the Dancing Faun were purchased and placed in the Antique Room at the beginning of the year. They are the size of the originals and are good casts, adding much to the efficiency of the equipment of the school.

#### ANATOMY CLASS.

*Lecturer, DR. R. TAIT MCKENZIE.*

(Fees \$5.00 for course of lectures ; students attending regular classes \$3.00.

A course of ten lectures was given on Monday afternoons at 4.30 o'clock, commencing November 11th, 1899, and finishing February 5th, 1900. 15 pupils attended.

#### ELEMENTARY DRAWING CLASS.

*Teacher, MISS ALBERTA CLELAND.*

Fees, \$4.00 per month.

Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 3.30 to 5 o'clock.  
Number of pupils 11.

#### WATER COLOUR CLASS.

*Instructor, CHARLES E. MOSS, R.C.A.*

Sketching Classes were held from September 14th to October 14th, 1899, the work being altogether out of doors.

12 pupils attended.

## LECTURES.

1. December 19th, 1899. — Mr. Rubin Goldmark, Director Colorado Conservatory of Music, delivered a most interesting and charmingly illustrated lecture on Wagner's "Valkyrie."

2. Feb. 26th, 1900.—Following up the course begun in 1898, on the British Universities, the Rev. J. Edgar Hill, D.D., lectured on "The Scottish Universities," and exhibited 40 slides of the buildings at the four University Seats—St. Andrews, Aberdeen, Glasgow and Edinburgh.

3. April 5th, 1900.—Disappointed in a third lecturer, the Chairman undertook, at the request of the Committee, to lecture on "St. Mark's, Venice." This lecture was illustrated by over 50 slides showing the details of that great church, as celebrated as unique, both in its history and in its high place in the life and fortunes of the great Republic.

## EXTRACTS FROM THE BY-LAWS.

---

### BENEFACTORS.

3. Donors of money or property to the value of \$5,000 and upwards, shall be enrolled as Benefactors and shall have their names inscribed on the walls of the Art Gallery and printed in every annual report.

### GOVERNORS.

4. A donation of \$500 in money, or of property to the value (in the opinion of the Council) of \$1000, shall be a qualification for nomination to the office of Governor.

### LIFE MEMBERS.

6. A donation of \$200 in money, or of property to the value (in the opinion of the Council) of \$400, shall be a qualification for nomination to the office of Life-member.

### ANNUAL MEMBERS.

The yearly subscription for a family membership, entitling the holder, the ladies of the family, and all sons under twenty, living at home, to the privileges of the Association, shall be \$10. Supplementary tickets for sons from twenty to twenty-five years of age may be issued in connection with a family ticket at \$2 each.

The subscription for individual members shall be \$5.

The Annual Fees of Members shall be due at the date of joining and thereafter on the same date in each succeeding year, and shall be payable in advance.

TWENTIETH YEAR OF THE ADVANCED ART CLASSES.

The Session for 1900-1901 will commence on October, 17th, and will close on Friday, May 17th, under the direction of MR. WM. BRYMNER, R.C.A. The Studios are open for work every week-day, and the regular instruction is given from 9.30 to 12.30 on the mornings of Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

The Course is, as far as possible, that adopted in the French Studios, which assumes the fact until one step is well taken it is useless to proceed to the next. A thorough study of form being of first importance, the student will draw from the cast in light and shade, proceeding from simple objects, parts of the figure, etc. to the entire figure from the antique.

Such Students as, in the opinion of MR. BRYMNER, may benefit thereby, will paint from the cast or still-life, and if sufficiently advanced will work from the living model.

Subjects for composition will be given out occasionally during the Session.

The Session for 1900-1901 will extend over two terms, the first term being from the 17th of October to the 4th of February, and the second term from the 6th of February to the 17th of May. It will be optional to Students to attend by the session, term or month.

Fees, in all cases payable in advance, have been fixed for the full session at \$40; for the term at \$25; and for the month at \$10.

The classes are held in the Studios of the Association, and Students are allowed the use of the Reading Room and Library, and free admission to the Galleries during the continuance of their studies.

Two Association Scholarships will be offered for competition at the end of the Session, each entitling the winner to two years free tuition.
