THE GERMAN ARMY. Preparations to Materially Increase Its Strength.

BERLIN, May 7.—The Reichsanzeiger, in announcing the preparation of the bill to increase the field artillery by 70 batteries and the army corps by special troops, says that the state of things among the neighbors of Germany does not admit of Germany continuing the present military system, under which the artillery is strengthened at the expense of the infantry. It is, therefore, necessary to fix a new effective strength for the army. An increase of the cavalry and infantry near the western and eastern frontiers is also intended. It will be the duty of the troops in those sections to advance to the frontier in the event of war without awaiting the reserves, to repel attacks. It is expected that the increased expenditures will not exceed 18,000,000 marks annually.
