# THE GIRLS' HOME.

---

## THIRY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT.

---

In reviewing the history of the Girls' Home during the past year, we feel that a decided advance has been made, and that the Institution is on a firmer basis, and in better running order than ever before.

It will no doubt be as great gratification to the subscribers as it is to the Managers, to know that the troublesome scalp disease, to which we have had occasion to refer on former occasions, is now completely eradicated. The money so graciously given by the City Council for the support of the branch Hospital, for the isolation of the infected children, which proved quite adequate when the house was filled with patients, was not sufficient for expenses as the number of inmates kept lessening; so it was decided at the beginning of last October, to bring the few still remaining back to the Home, using special precautions, and keeping them strictly isolated from the other children. Mrs. Bowers, to whose faithful care the present happy state of affairs is largely due, has now taken the position of seamstress here. Dr. Graham and Dr. Caven have been assiduous in their exertions with this troublesome malady, and will, we feel sure, rejoice with us that the struggle is now ended, and has resulted so successfully.

Last January there were in all eighty-seven children being cared for, and sixty-seven were received during the year, making in all one hundred and seventy-four. Of this number twenty-one have been sent to service, thirteen of whom still occupy the homes provided for them; thirty-seven have been taken by relatives or friends, one has gone to the Boys' Home, two are in the Hospital for Sick Children, and one has died, leaving ninety-two children under the protection of the Institution on the first of January, 1890.

The School-room, the overcrowding of which was alluded to last year, has not yet been enlarged, and this has augmented the difficulties which the teaching of pupils of such divers stages of advancement necessarily involves. Miss McKee has, however, been painstaking and uncomplaining, and we feel that improved accommodation which would greatly facilitate her labour, and also afford better ventilation, is no more than her due, and that of her little pupils. A scheme for the erection of a new school-room is already under way, and will doubtless be undertaken early in the Spring.

We lost last year a dear and valued friend and constant visitor, one whose memory will always be cherished among us; and perhaps it would be well in this connection to refer to the resolution which was unanimously adopted at the Meeting held on the seventeenth of September: "That we desire to record our sense of the great loss this Institution has suffered, in the removal by death of Mr. William Gooderham. For many years he has been a most generous friend to the Home, and though his gifts have been large, he has aided us even more by his personal interest in the welfare of the children, and his words of encouragement to the members of the Board. Though we mourn his loss as it affects ourselves, we rejoice in the assurance that he has been called to a rich reward by that Master whom he so faithfully served." Mr. Gooderham was with us at the last Annual Meeting, and his short address on that occasion was cheering and helpful. His munificent bequest of ten thousand dollars, will form an additional memorial of his sympathetic interest.

There has been very little sickness in the Home this year, owing to the constant attention of Dr. Wishart, and the vigilance of our excellent Matron, Mrs. Bright.

Mrs. McGee still conducts the Sunday School, and Dr. Saunders and Venerable Archdeacon Boddy have weekly talks with the children.

The difficulty long experienced by all philanthropic workers of helping children, owing to the persistent claims of shiftless and incompetent guardians, has in some measure been overcome through the "Act for the protection of neglected children," under which the

children of worthless parents can be taken before a magistrate, and committed for a period of years to the shelter of a Public Institution, being paid for by the City at the rate of two dollars a week. The boys who come under this Act are sent to the Mimico Industrial School, and when the similar Institution for girls which is contemplated shall be established, the neglected girls will doubtless be sent there ; in the meantime such cases of destitution have been received here, and there are at present eight children thus provided for.

The following letters, received during the year by the Corresponding Secretary, will doubtless prove interesting. They are selected from among a large number, many of which are equally satisfactory :

November 18th, 1889.

DEAR MADAM,—I received your kind letter, and in reply would say Emma is quite well at present, and improving satisfactorily ; she is going to day school and Sabbath School ; we teach her at home all we can. She seems quite contented here, and we think so much of her. While I am writing she is very busy dressing her doll. We would be pleased to have a call from any of the managers of the Home at any future time. Hoping to hear from you again,

DEAR MADAM,—The girl Maria is still with us, she is quite well and has proved satisfactory ; we like her as well as when she first came.

DEAR MRS. JACKES,—I hope you are well. I am very happy with Mrs. C. for she is very kind to me, and I wouldn't like to leave her. On Thanksgiving Day Mr. C., the baby, and I, drove out to S. with another lady and gentleman. We went ten miles, and we

counted the milestones as we went along. We had a Thanksgiving Tea at the Church. Mrs. C. sets a sum for me every second night, and the nights that I don't do a sum, I write in my copybook. Saturday evening I learn my verses for Sunday School. I go to the Methodist Church. Our Anniversary is next Sunday. We have been practising for two or three weeks, but I did not go on the very wet evenings, for Mrs. C. thought I might get a cold. The little girl next door comes and plays with baby and I, and the three of us play together. I have two new dresses, a light brown, and a dark brown cashmere. I wear the light brown dress in the afternoons when I take the baby out, and the cashmere on Sundays. I think I'll close my letter now.

## MEDICAL REPORT.

While the year of 1889 does not present the same clear "bill of health" as its predecessor, nor as is desirable, still we are glad to be able to report that the health of the inmates of the Home has, on the whole, been good. None of the more fatal forms of disease have visited us, and even La Grippe has passed us by. Many of those who enter the Home, however, do so with a constitutional bias towards disease, which they have inherited from vicious or incapable parents, and it is not to be wondered at, if these are oftener ailing, or more difficult of cure, than their more favoured sisters.

In the latter part of March, and during April, a large number of the children suffered from colds, while four contracted Bronchitis, and four others a mild Pneumonia. These all recovered.

In October a child was unfortunately passed into the nursery, suffering from an infectious form of Vaginitis, with which she promptly infected the others in this department. By dint of persistent treatment and isolation, all of these, twenty-six in number, have been, or will shortly be entirely cured. The result of this has been to make the entrance examination still more rigid than before.

In the past month an exceedingly mild form of measles has been in the Home, some twelve in all having been isolated therefor.

Besides the above mentioned, several girls have from time to time been sent to the Sick Children's Hospital for treatment, including one case of Phthisis, three of Scrofula, and one of Chorea. A former inmate of the Home, Mary Funston, is now in the same Hospital, suffering from Pyæmia.

Lottie Knox, one of the nursery children, aged four years, died in October, after a convulsion. She had been ailing for some time previously, and came of a strenuous family.

None of the other troubles are deserving of special mention.

In conclusion, I have again to thank Mrs. Bright, and her assistants, for their watchfulness, and their promptness in carrying out

any orders that were given. I would also draw the attention of the Board and the public to the need that exists for a large Infirmary, the present one being far too small for the large number of children in the Home.

We have the honor of presenting the following report :

At the time of our last report (for the year 1888), there were still eleven inmates in the Bleeker Street Home. During the past year this number was gradually diminished until only four cases remained, at which time it was deemed advisable to close the Bleeker Street Home, and to remove these four cases to the Gerrard Street Home. Since their removal to Gerrard Street three of the patients have been cured, and the fourth, a boy, although not altogether free from Tinea, has been taken out of the Home. We have now the pleasure of reporting the Home free from this disease.

## CONSTITUTION OF THE GIRLS' HOME.

---

1. This Institution shall be called the "GIRLS' HOME," and have for its object the rescue from vice of young girls, and the bestowal of careful attention to their religious, moral, and temporal welfare; also the maintenance and support of girls from two to fourteen years of age.
2. Children are given out to parties furnishing suitable references, on payment of five dollars per annum, till the child is fifteen; then, ten, fifteen, and twenty dollars for the next three years respectively; these sums, except the first, to be invested for the said child's benefit and given to her at the expiration of her term of service.
3. The management shall be entrusted to a Committee, of not more than forty-five ladies, chosen at the Annual Meeting, out of which shall be elected by ballot the 1st, 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Directresses, Treasurer, Secretary, and Corresponding Secretary. All vacancies shall be filled by ballot, and a majority vote at a Monthly Meeting after at least one week's notice. Should it happen at any Meeting that no Directress be present, then the ladies in attendance, if sufficient to form a quorum, may elect some one of their number to take the chair, the lady so appointed to have, for the time being, the same authority in all respects as a Directress.
4. No alteration shall be made in this Constitution, except at the Annual Meeting; and notice of any proposed alteration must always be given to the Board, at least one month previous to such Annual Meeting.

of the Monthly Meeting, for which all important business shall be deferred. Special meetings may be called by the Secretary, upon an order from the 1st Directress, or, in her absence, at the request of any three members.

2. All meetings shall be opened and closed with prayer, and be opened as soon after the appointed hour as a quorum shall be present, which shall consist of five members at a Monthly and three at a Weekly Meeting, being conducted in the following order :

1st. The Secretary shall read the minutes of the preceding meeting, which shall be signed, or in case of a Monthly Meeting all the meetings during the past month ; inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place and read the general Reports of the condition of the Institution.

2nd. The presiding lady shall place all resolutions before the meeting, declare the decision to the Secretary, and if an equality of votes occur, give the casting one, in addition to her vote as member of the Board.

3. As soon as the meeting is opened (when a quorum is formed) all conversation, not addressed to the presiding Lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order, and stopped.

4. Any lady allowing three months to pass without being present, or notifying her inability to attend, to the Secretary, shall have her name struck off the list of the Managing Committee.

5. The Treasurer shall receive and take charge of all moneys belonging to the Institution, as well as the children's fees, keeping account of the same. All accounts shall be brought by her before the meeting of the Managers every month.

6. The Corresponding Secretary shall keep account of all children given out from the Home, and correspond with them at least once a year, and shall keep account of and read all correspondence respecting them, at the Board Meetings.

7. The Secretary shall direct all the correspondence, keep account, as far as practicable, of all the children in the Institution—giving a general report thereof at the Monthly Meeting, at which she shall regularly attend, but never be called upon to preside, minute the proceedings, and take the names of the ladies present.

8. Two members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Secretary to visit the Home daily each week, ascertain from the Matron the behaviour of the children, as well as whatever may be requisite for them and for the house, and report the same at the Regular Weekly Meetings. The 1st Directress, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, and Secretary shall not be of the number of Daily Visitors.

9. Any three Managers, including a Directress, may admit applicants up to the age of fourteen, with the doctor's certificate insuring them to be free from disease.

---

### RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MATRON AND CHILDREN OF THE GIRLS' HOME.

---

1. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the children, as well as to conduct the household affairs generally, and also to instruct the girls between the ages of five and fourteen, in sewing, knitting, and household work.

2. She shall admit any applicant not younger than two years, or older than fourteen, upon the doctor's certificate; subject always to the approval of the Board.

3. The charge for each child of such parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$5 per month, unless an exceptional case should occur. If more than one child of the same parent or friend gain admittance, a reduction may be made as approved by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

4. The Matron shall daily inspect the cleanliness of the children, see that they attend the day-school punctually and regularly; and every morning and evening conduct family prayers.

5. The children shall rise at 6 a.m. from May 1st to October 31st, and at 7 a.m. from November 1st to April 30th. The time for going to rest to be from 5 to 8 p.m.

Children under fourteen are not allowed to wash or scrub more than three hours a day.

8. Parents or friends of the children shall be admitted to visit them on Wednesday and Friday afternoons, from 3 until 5 o'clock. Persons wishing to come at other hours must obtain a permit from the Board.

9. The Home shall be open to the public any afternoon during the week.
