

 Almost every expedition to the North has returned with some news of the unfortunate explorer's fate. Now the East-Adventurer's Observer states that Capt. Salomon, of the whale-ship "Janey," at present, with the "Chancellor" and "Equinox," named Tyson, by whom he was informed that a tribe living much further north had massacred a white man named O'Keefe and his others. They would not deliver up their guns and ammunition. O'Keefe was the second in command of the Franklin Arctic Expedition. Ship Ahoj, the chief of the tribe is still alive.

These quantities have a particular method of saving their poultry, so that their guests can have a turkey as sweet and delicious in June as during the Christmas season.  Some of the Boston papers are indulging in an interesting question whether or not Miles Standish, the famous Puritan Captain, was a Catholic.
