At the General-Assembly of the Province of Nova Scotia, begun and holden at Halifax, on the Sixth Day of June, Anno Domini 1770, in the Tenth Year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lord GEORGE the Third, of Great-Britain, France and Ireland, KING, Defender of the Faith, &c. and there continued by several Prorogations until the Sixth Day of June, Anno Domini 1777, in the Seventeenth Year of His said Majesty's Reign, being the Fifth General Assembly convened in the said Province.

CAP. I.

An ACT for regulating the Price of certain Provisions in the Township of Halifax.

Affimbly, That the Justices of the Peace in their B General Sessions, held for the County of Halifax, shall and may, and they are hereby impowered, as often as Occasion may require from Time to Time, to regulate and settle the Prices of all Kinds of Butchers Meat in the Township of Halifax, according to the best of their Judgement, respect being had to the Season of the Year and the Prices of Provender.

The Justices in Sessions to regulate and Settle the Price of all kind of Butchers Meat in Halifax.

II. And be it further Enacted, That the faid Justices shall immediately after the faid Regulation so made, cause the same to be posted up in the most public Places by the Provost-Marshal or his Deputy.

III. And be it also further Enacted, That if any Person shall upon Complaint made before any two Justices be convicted of buying, selling, purchasing or receiving, or agreeing to buy, sell, purchase or receive any Butchers Meat at any greater Prices than shall be so assessed, such Person or Persons shall forfeit double the Value of the Meat so sold or bought, or agreed to be sold or bought, to be levied by Warrant of Distress and Sale of the Offender's Goods and Chattels, one Half to be paid to the Prosecutor, and the other Half to the Overseers of the Poor for the Use of the Poor of the said Township.

any Person convicted of buying, selling, or agreeing to buy or sell meat at greater Prices, shall forfeit double the Value of the Meat fold or bought. This Act to be in Force one Year.

IV. And be it Enacted, That this Act shall continue and he in Force for one Year, and until the End of the Session of the General Assembly then next following.

An ACT for restraining the exorbitant Price of Labour.

The justices of Peace in the several Counties, &c. to regulate the Wages of Artificers and Labourers,

And be it also further Enacted That if any person employing any Labourer or Artificer shall offer or agree for, or give greater Wages than shall be so affessed, every person convicted thereof, upon Complaint made before two Justices of the Peace shall forfeit a Sum not exceeding Fifteen pounds nor less than Five pounds, for the Use of the Poor of the Township where such person resides, and be levied by Warrant of Distress and Sale of the Offender's Goods, and if any Artificer or Labourer shall take and receive greater Wages than shall be so assessed, such Artificer or Labourer shall upon Conviction in manner assessed, forfeit a Sum not exceeding Five pounds, nor less than Forty Shillings for the Use aforesaid, and on Non-payment thereof, be committed to the Goal, of the County or place where the Offence shall be committed for the Space of one Month.

IV. And be it Enacted, That this Act shall continue and remain in Force for one Year, and until the End of the Session of the General Assembly then next following.

CAP. III.

An ACT for more effectually preventing the Defertion of Seamen and Soldiers from his Majesty's Navy and Army in this Province.

XXXX HEREAS notwithstanding the Provision made by the Act of Parliament, and the Acts of the General Afferphly of this Propince, for preventing the Defertion of Seamen from bis Majesty's Ships of War, and of Soldiers from his Majesty's Troops in this Province, many evil minded Persons do barbour, conceal, assist and even excite them to desert, to the great Detriment of his Majesty's Service; for Remedy whereof,

1. Be it Enacted, by the Livutenant-Governor, Council and Affembly, That if any Person thall harbour or conceal any Stranger or idle wandering Person, who has not a Certificate or Pals from one of his Majett'y Justices of the Peace within this Province, or from an Officer commanding any of Majesty's Ships or Vessels, or from the commanding Officer of any Regiment, Troop or Company, to which they belong, which shall fet forth from whence such Person shall have come, and the Place to which they are to pass, and shall not use his utmost Endeavour to apprehend, or cause such idle or wandering Person to be apprehended and conveyed before some Justices of Peace, such Person being thereof convicted before any two or more of his Majesty's Justices of Peace either on Confession on Oath of one credible Witness, shall forefeit a Sum not exceeding Twenty Pounds, nor loss than Ton Pounds, one Half to the Informer or Professior, and the other half to the Poor of the Township where the Offence shall be committed to be levied by Diffress and Sale of the Offender's Goods and Chattles by Warrant from such Justices, and if sufficient Distress cannot be found, it shall be llawful for fuch Justices to committather Person so offending to Goal, or to the House of Correction, there to be kept to hard Labour for any Time, not exceeing Four Months, nor less than two Months.

If any Person shall harbour or conceal any Stranger or wandering person who has not a Pais,

and shall not use his Endeavour to apprehend fuchStranger & convey him before a Justice, on Conviction to forfeit not exceeding Twenty Pounds nor less than Ten Pounds.

II. And bent also Enacted, That if any Person shall advise or incite any Suaman or Soldier to defert, fuch Person so advising or inciting shall upon Conviction by the Oath of two or more credible Witnessos before awa of his Majesty's Justices of the Peace be liable to a fine of Forty pounds, for the Use of the poor of the Township where the Offence shall the committed, and be levied and recovered as aforefaid, and in Failure of payment thereof, or where no sufficient Distress can be found, whereon to levy the same, such Person shall be committed to Goal or the House of Correction, there to be kept to hard Labour for Twelve Months.

AnyPerson advising or inciting any Seaman or Soldier to desert, shall on a Conviction be liable to a Fine of Forty Pounds.

An ACT for continuing the several Acts relating to the Duty on Wheel Carriages within the Peninsula of Halifax.

E it Enacted, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Affembly, that an Act made in the Eight Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled, An Act for Granting to His Majesty a Duty on Wheel Carriages within the Peninsula of Halisax, and also An Act made in the sisteenth Year of his said Majesty's Reign, in Amendment of the said Act, shall be, and the same are hereby continued in sorce from the Expiration thereof until the Thirty sirst Day of December One Thousand Seven Hundred and Eighty.

C A P. V.

An ACT for continuing an Act made in the 15th Year of his present Majesty's Reign, intitled an Act to impower the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief for the Time being, to prchibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, arms and Ammunition, or Salt-petre, or carrying the same Coastways.

E it Enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That an Act made in the fifteenth year of his present Majesty's Reign intitled, an Act impower the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or Commander in Chief, for the Time being, to prohibit the Exportation of Gunpowder, Arms and Amunition or Salt Petre, or carrying the Same Coastways, shall be, and continue, and the same is hereby continued in Force, from the Expiration thereof, for and during the present Rebellion in America only and no longer.

E it Enasted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and B affembly, That an Act made in the 12th Year of his prefent Majesty's Reign intitled, An Act for railing a fund For the Purpose of making and repairing Bridges and Roads of Communication thro' the Province, and an Act made in the 13th Year of his faid Majesty's Reign for amending and continuing the faid Act, shall be and continue, and the same are hereby continued in Force from the Expiration thereof until the 31st Day of December, 1780.

*** HEREAS several of the Goals erected in the out Country we ties are very insufficient for the safe keeping and securing 🙊💥 criminal Offenders.

I. Be it Enacted, by the Lieutenant-Governor, Council, and Affembly, that every Justice of Peace, authorized to examine and to commit Offenders within this Province, if they fee Cause to commit any Offender for Treason or Suspicion thereof, or for any high Crimes and Misdemeanors committed against his Majesty or his Government, shall in Case the Goal of the County, from whence such Offender shall be so committed, be insufficient, cause such Offender to be conveyed to his Majesty's Goal in Halifax, within the County of Halifax, and the Provost Marshall of the said Province, or Keeper of his Majesty's Goal in Hahfax, are, hereby required and Commanded to receive all such Offenders, them safe keep, till they shall otherwise be delivered by due Course of Law. VII. And

In Case the Goal of the County from whence any Offenders for Treaton. &t. are committed is insufficient such to be conveyed to theGoal in Halifan.

When the Supreme Court, shall be impowered to try such Offenders, may hear, try and determine such Offenders at Halifax.

II. And be it further Enacted, by the Authority aforefaid, That when and as foon as the Supreme Court, Court of Affize and General Goal Delivery shall be impowered to proceed to the Trial of Offenders for any of the Crimes aforesaid, they are hereby impower'd to hear, try and determine, all such Offences at his Majesty's Supreme Court to be held at Halifax; in and for the said County, by a Jury of the said County, any Law, Usage or Custom, to the contrary Notwithstanding.
