## Report of the Superintendent of

Wn received a short time ago the Annual Report of the Chief Superintendent of Schools for the year 1870. We have not had time to look into it, but for the beself of our readers, give the following syntopsis taken from the Hamilton Times.—
We have received the Annual Report of the Superintendent of the Normal Model Grammarend Common Schools in Ontario for the year 1870. Why this document should be so long delayed it is impossible to asy. It appears by its date to have been presented to the Provincial Secretary as long ago as October, 1871,—some ten mouths after the year 1 fo which it reports the condition of the schools had closed. It seems strange to us that so importants a document cannot be presented within two or three magnits, at least after the expiration of the year for which it is prepared, has ex-

The number of free schools in 1870, supported entirsly by rate or property, and which were attended as a matter of right by all residents between the ages of 5 and 21, years, without payment of fees, was 4, 264, showing an increase over the previous year of 113 schools. The number of schoolspartly free-that is, with a rate bill of 20c, or less per month—was 322, a decrease of 71. Under the new School Act, all the schools in the Province are free, except those of Hamilton, and the sucception is a monstrous blunder, committed at the instance of the Hamilton Board of School Truttes, who petitioned to be exempt from that provision of the Act which was originally intended to make all the Common Schools in the Province free.

The average time of keeping the schools open, including the holidays, was eleven months and four days, in 1870. "This," remarks the Superintendent, is nearly twice the average time of keeping open the public schools in the States of Pennalyvania and Ohio, and about three months more than the average time of
