Dear Mr. Glasco,

I have your letter of yesterday with reference to the desirability of holding Convocation in the evening in order to make it possible for more of the graduates in Montreal to attend. I can promise the Montreal Branch of the Society that every consideration will be given to this request.

Dear Dr. Martin:-

Apropos of our conversation yesterday about a separate function for the granting of diplomas in the several schools directly under Corporation I have to-day a copy of a letter written to the heads of these different schools by Dr. Lomer, making a suggestion along these lines. It is altogether likely that they will approve of the idea. In any case it ought to be carried out whether they approve or not, as it seems ridiculous to be solemnly reading out a list of names of persons none of whom, except possibly students in Pharmacy, have been in the University for more than two years. They would receive far more notice if the diplomas were presented to them in person at a special function. As it was last year, you will remember, only the names were read out as they stood up and the diplomas were received afterwards, and I may say that this created no little confusion. It would be far more satisfactory for these and for all concerned to have a little affair of their own on the afternoon or evening of the day before Convocation. It would mean that there would be ninety more seats that could be occupied by regular graduates ^{who they would} bring the whole body up closer to the front, and it would also mean three hundred seats for friends of the regular graduates, as those who receive diplomas have been in the past allowed as many tickets for their friends as those who are obtaining a degree.


This will necessitate some little legislation probably. In the first place, is there any need of having the names of those who have been granted diplomas by the separate schools submitted to Corporation

for approval ? They do not go out from the University with the same stamp on them, as it were, as do the students who obtain degrees and it scarcely seems ^{necessary} to put them on the same basis as the others even in this respect. However, that is a small matter. In the next place, there should be some organization to arrange proceedings at their little ceremony, presumably in conjunction with myself. Probably it would be advisable for Corporation to make provision for a committee consisting of the heads of the different schools to decide upon a programme in this connection, unless of course your Committee of Deans wishes to make all the decisions, although I should think they would prefer to leave it to Corporation.

You will recall that there is a motion before Corporation to grant representation to these different schools. If it were decided that it is not necessary for them to report the names of winners of diplomas it would do away with one of the main arguments which has been advanced in favour of this representation.

The procession will form up as usual in the grounds of the University.

The Visitor, Chancellor, Principal, Governors and recipients of honorary degrees will meet at the Library, where those who are or are to become Doctors of Law will robe.

The Visitor, Lord Willington, with the Chancellor, Mr. E.W. B the Vice-Chancellor and Principal, Sir Arthur Currie, the Governors and the Doctors of Law, including those receiving their degrees at the present Convocation, will lead the procession as far as the gate.

At the gate the Visitor and those attending him will stand to one side and the remainder of the procession will pass them. The Visitor preceded by the rest of the senior party will then take his place at the rear of the procession for the march to the Royal Victoria College.

When the head of the procession reaches the Royal Victoria College, the ranks will divide and the fifty senior members present, led by the Visitor, will enter the College. The ranks will then again be closed and the remainder of the procession, led by the graduates of this Hall will march into the hall.

On entering the College the Visitor, Chancellor and Principal will leave their places at the head of the procession and proceed to the Warden's Office. The remainder of the procession will continue into the Hall and take their seats as follows:-

Senior 46 on the platform
Junior graduates (less 2 seats in right aisle).
Visiting graduates
Staff.

The Visitor, Chancellor and Principal and the G.O.C. M.D.& will then enter. All in the hall will rise, but God Save the King will not be played. As soon as the Visitor, Chancellor and Principal have reached their places God Save the King will be played.

Graduates attending the Reunion who wish to attend the Convocation and thus take part in the first official ceremony of the new Governor General, will take their places in the procession in the College grounds, where they will be directed by the Marshal and his assistants.

Owing to the limited space available it will only be possible to issue a very few tickets. These will be for the gallery and will admit ladies only, wives of members of the staff or wives of graduates who are not themselves graduates. They will be issued at the Registrar's Office on Tuesday morning, October 5th, in the order of application. Only 75 are available.

A number of seats in the lower portion of the hall are reserved for students who will lead in the songs on the programme. Tickets for these are being issued to Miss Hurlbatt, Warden of the Royal Victoria College, and to Mr. Amaron, President of the Students' Council.


