Boyd Sticks to His Story

Tells Why He Did Not Speak of \$10,000 Bribe Many Months Ago.

Owen Sound, Aug. 14.—(Special).—On two occasions, George M. Boyd, former representative for North Grey in the legislature, has made the statement from a public platform that immediately previous to the protest trial which was held last November, he was approached and offered a consideration of \$10,000 cash and a quarter interest in a valuable timber limit...

The first public announcement was made at a Conservative convention called together here a month ago, to consider the ways and means of carrying on the present protest. At the Conservative meeting the announcement was received quietly, as Mr. Boyd had months before told the story of the affair to a number of the leading members of the party...

When asked if he would prove his charges before a committee appointed to investigate the matter, he replied emphatically in the affirmative. "I have in mind the disadvantages under which Mr. Gamey worked through divulging the details of the evidence which he had collected, and did not propose to repeat the mistake."

EMERSON LOSES CASTE

Ottawa, Aug. 14.—(Special).—Henry R. Emerson of New Brunswick gave an exhibition in the House to-day of a legislator discounting his chances for coveted political preferment. He has been looked upon as an aspirant and likely candidate for the cabinet vacancy created by Mr. Blair's retirement. Had he acquainted himself well with his speech on the Grand Trunk Pacific scheme to-day he would at least be a favorite in the running. As it is he made a rather weak speech, and not better than a four-to-one shot to-night.

Dr. Sproule, replying to Mr. Emerson, alluded to the latter's lack of gratitude in speaking disparagingly of the ex-Minister of Railways and Canals, the man to whom above all others he is indebted for the position he occupies to-day.

Estimate All Astray. He went on to say that the estimate of the Finance Minister that the outlay involved in the project now before the House was only thirteen or fourteen millions, staggered his comprehension. 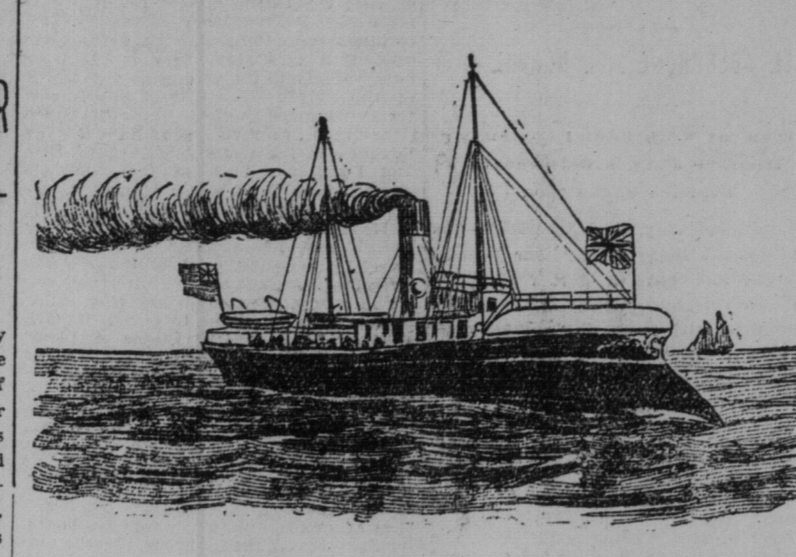

Enormous Crowd Saw Big Men Battle at San Francisco — Jeffries Had All Better of Bout, With Corbett Always Game to the Core.

San Francisco, Aug. 14.—James J. Jeffries, champion heavyweight of the world, played with Jim Corbett for nine rounds and a half tonight, and then Corbett's seconds motioned to Referee Grano to stop the fight in order to save their man from needless punishment. The end came shortly after the beginning of the tenth round, when Jeffries planted one of his terrible left swings on Corbett's stomach. The man who conquered John L. Sullivan dropped to the floor, and the memorable scene at Carson City, when Bob Fitzsimmons landed his solar plexus blow, was almost duplicated. The fight was over. Corbett struggled to his feet, and again faced his gigantic adversary. With hardly a moment's hesitation, Jeffries swung his right and again landed on Corbett's stomach. Jim dropped to the floor, and then it was that Tommy Ryan, seeing that it was all over, motioned to Referee Grano to stop the punishment.

10,000 Saw the Battle.

Ten thousand men were seated about the arena in Mechanics' Pavilion at 9 o'clock, representing an expenditure for seating accommodations aggregating \$54,000. This is the largest crowd ever assembled in the United States, and the third largest sum in dollars and cents ever contested for. The two that exceeded its receipts were the races at Coney Island, \$96,000, and the Corbett-McCoy at Madison Square Garden, New York, \$83,000.

The scene about the big pavilion from 5 p.m. until the men stepped into the ring was one of confusion. The gallery ticket holders found the long lines, and there was much crowding and scurrilities in the attempt to gain admittance. A hundred policemen kept good order once the doors were opened. The pavilion ticket holders were more leisurely about coming to claim their seats. Not until 9 o'clock were the chairs, boxes and benches full. There were many celebrities that had seen every pugilistic encounter during the last decade. Jeffries and Corbett were the center of attraction on the side of the arena, more than four hundred Jeffries admirers from Los Angeles, the home of Jeffries, sat in a group on the main floor.

Two preliminaries, the first a six-round draw between Frank Smith of Los Angeles and Jack Sheridan of San Rafael, another of like length between Jack Evans and Jerry Fairbanks kept the crowd in good humor until the hour of the main event. For the big men to enter the scene had arrived. The ring looked large compared with the enclosed arena here. In this city, in pursuance of an under standing with the big fighters was made the regulation 24 foot ring, herebefore 20 foot rings have been the rule.

Round 1. Jeffries feinted and Corbett side-stepped. Jeffries swung left over Jim's head, Jim came in quickly to a clinch and they went right to a clinch and they refused to break. Jim put right over the head and hit hard about arm right on the body. They were exceedingly careful to break. Jeffries was the one to get the ring and put left light on the body. It was noticed that Corbett did very little in the first round, but his punches were light and solidly over the heart. Jeffries missed right for the body, but put in a jab over the heart. Corbett quickly stepped up and put right to the heart. Jeffries laughing said, "Ah."

Round 2. Jeffries came up quickly, missed left for the head; they came to a clinch. They missed and Corbett clinched. Jeffries was holding on. In the break, Jeffries went left on back of the head lightly, Corbett ducked and thus far to land a straight hand blow. He attempted it at this stage but was too close in. Jeffries forced him to the ropes, coming dangerously near a jaw with a left hook. They immediately came into a clinch, in the break of which Corbett hooked to the jaw. Corbett swung left and right to the body but got left hook on the head. Jeffries came in quickly, missed right over Corbett's ear in a peculiar right hand ball. Corbett put right over the head. They fought carefully to the end. Corbett had shown very little speed so far, while Jeffries showed improvement in speed and cleverness.

Round 3. Both came to the center, Jeff missing left and Corbett clinching. Jeffries went left to the neck and Corbett joined him. Corbett was quick to get up, but increased in speed somewhat and had a run to avoid a rush. He turned quickly to put right over the head. Corbett was a lot of clinching, neither man taking a chance in the break. Jeffries hardly missed right for Corbett's head. Corbett hit Jeffries on the jaw, and Jeffries hit Corbett on the jaw, landing three times and a left to the stomach. The blows did not hurt Jeffries, but only sent and forced his man about the ring. Jeffries was in a rough mood, in which he was even. Jeffries gave indication of facing matters in fighting.

Round 4. Jeff went after Corbett, but clever clinching and blocking prevented damage. Referee Grano stopped the fighting to look at Jeff's glove, which he had burst, but then to go on with it. Jeffries fought hard to get any damage. Jeff hit hard left to chest and got left on the mouth and right over heart. There were calls that Jeff was fighting foul, but the proceedings did not warrant any such claims. Corbett got

rather against subsidizing railways in the future. He challenged the Prime Minister to dissolve the House and go to the country on this question. The government are not doing it. The appeal would be made after the election, but after the obligation had been incurred. As to the control of freight rates in the west, he pointed out that the government of Manitoba had secured control of rates without adding a dollar to the national debt. By that stroke of statesmanship Premier Roblin had done more for the west than would ever be accomplished by this scheme. (Applause.)

A great deal of money had been spent developing the waterways of Canada, but now the country was told that this expenditure was all futile, and that another scheme must be carried through at once, that it was unsafe to wait, to wait even a few months. And this scheme would add to the debt of Canada at least \$125,000,000. How did the country stand in regard to the national debt? There had been spent up to the present on railways \$278,830,000, on canals \$103,484,000. The national debt is already \$28,000,000 more than the figures. This scheme would make the national debt roughly \$400,000,000. He wanted the country to understand that this was what they were committing to. "We'll be bled white," there must be provided \$100,000,000 to be borrowed to meet the debt falling due. Add to this \$125,000,000, and where would be the credit of Canada? Also, it must be remembered that hard times would come again with the Canada must raise close upon \$200,000,000 by borrowing. No doubt the heavy expenditure building the road would help to tide over hard times, but it would do so at heavy cost.

The sentiment of the country was in favor of the project. It began by declaring in favor of government ownership and proceeded: "But, if we can't get what we want, we must get what we can on the best terms we can. I therefore support the present arrangement."

Houghton Lennox moved the adjournment of the debate. Sir Wilfrid Laurier said he agreed with the motion, but wished to determine that he expected that commencing on Monday next the sittings ought to be more extended than up to the present. "I think," said the Prime Minister, "it is about time we should think of such a step as adjournment, and in view of that blessing to come I think that beginning on Monday, the House should sit late and even pretty late."

Sir Wilfrid Ready rose. Mr. Gourley observed that members who sat listening to the debates from the House should be asked to sit later than midnight, as it involved a severe mental strain. 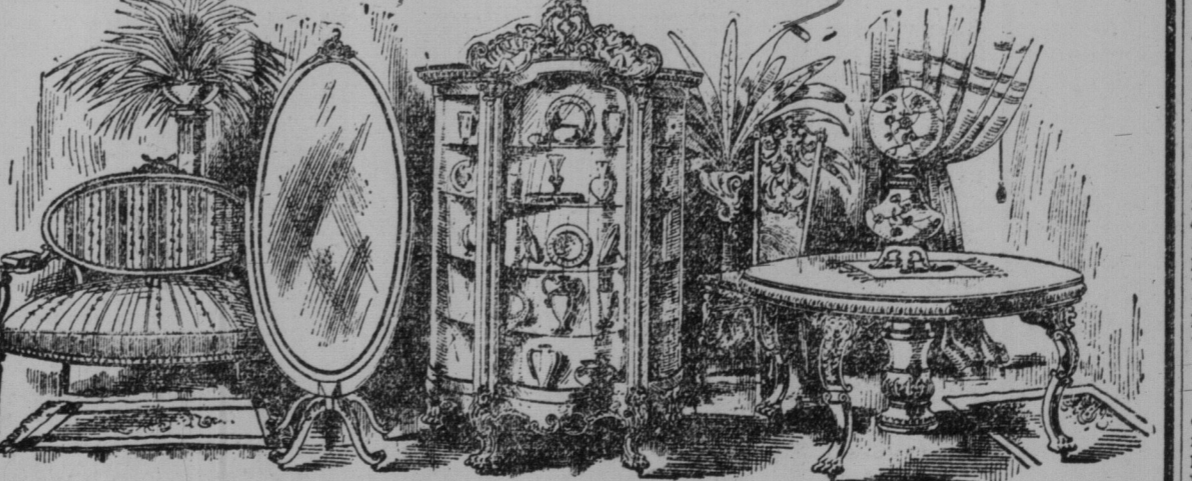

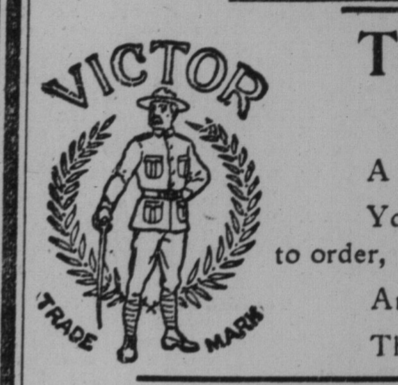

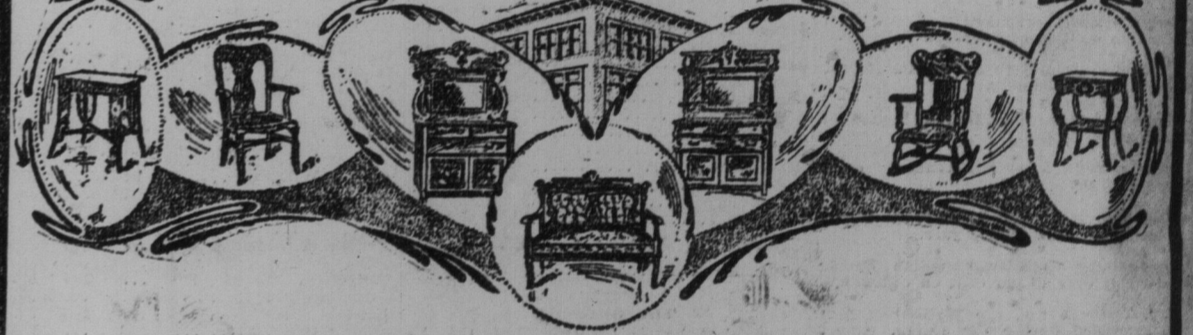
