Moyer was offered the nonination by a convention of prohibitionists, held here on Saturday. He asked for time to consider the matter, and initiated that he would give his decision to-day. It was expected that he would be a candidate, in which case he would undoubted y have received the support of many Conservatives. Mr. Moyer, however, considered that his own private business will require so much of his time that he would be unable to look after his legislative duties properly if he were elected. The Liberals hold their con-vention here to-morrow. It is hardly likely that a candidate will be put up to oppose Dr. Jessop.

Uzbridge, Nov. 20.-(Special.)--George Thompson of Orlilla will receive and ac-cept the Liberal candidature for North Gutario at the convention at Beaverton on Iriday. The riding is already represented in the Dominion house by a resident of Orlilla, which is outside the riding, and this attempt to foist another outsider upon them will hardly meet with the approval of the electorate.
