EIGHTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT
OF
THE MANAGERS OF
THE PROTESTANT ORPHANS' HOME
AND FEMALE AID SOCIETY.

In accordance with the provisions of the Act of Incorporation, the Lady Managers of "The Orphans' Home and Female Aid Society," beg leave to present this their Annual Report. The Lady Managers render their sincere thanks to Lady Young, who has done them the honor of permitting her name to be enrolled as Patroness of the Home.

During the past year 30 children have been admitted; 3 apprenticed; 1 adopted; 4 taken by their friends; and 1 died. There are at present in the Home 87 children, 51 boys, 36 girls.

The Matron, Mrs. Large, finding the duties of her position too arduous, and her health failing, resigned her situation last March, much to the regret of all connected with the Home: but the Managers have been most fortunate in securing the services of Miss Wheelwright, who seems in every way fitted to supply the place of the late Matron.

The Managers have decided to purchase a piece of land in the rear of the Home from Mr. Baldwin, and have offered the sum of \$1,000 for it, through their solicitor; which will enable the Matron to keep the boys employed in gardening; thus teaching them habits of industry, and making them fit to labor after leaving the Home. The fence around the Institution being very much out of repair, the Managers considered it necessary to erect a new one, which is nearly completed. And as soon as funds can be obtained the additional piece of ground will be enclosed.

The Ladies desire to express their gratitude to those kind friends of this charity, who, during the past year, have contributed to its maintenance, whether in money or in kind. They would record with thankfulness their sense of the liberality of the butchers of the St. Lawrence and St. Patrick markets, of several of the confectioners, and of the market gardeners, who have always shewn themselves most ready to give to "the Home" those things, which are of great service to it.

During the past year five cows have been bought, two at first; and these have been sold, and three purchased in their stead. This has been found a source of saving; and the milk has been of great benefit to the children.

The members of the "Loyal Orange Association" still continue firm and steadfast friends of "the Home" by their repeated and handsome contributions, and the kind interest taken by them in its welfare. By referring to the Treasurer's report it will be seen, that the different amounts given by these Lodges in all amount to \$524 10.

The thanks of the Managers are due to the Directors of the Northern Railway Company, who, with their usual liberality, brought down the wood required for the use of the Home at half tariff rate; and also to Mr. John Hendrie, who kindly had it carted to "the Home" free of charge.

The teacher, Miss Scott, still continues to give entire satisfaction; both, as to her duties in the school-room; and in works of kindness, which she has voluntarily undertaken, and performed most faithfully. The servants continue to give satisfaction and evince the utmost kindness and patience with the children.

In December the children of "the Home" had a sale of needle-work wrought by themselves, to raise sufficient funds to erect a memorial in the Cemetery in remembrance of their lost companion, Rebecca Dorrington, and others who have been buried there. By this sale the sum of \$22 was realized, and since then many of the girls have knitted socks and stockings for the poor; in several cases out of yarn which they bought with the pennies given them by kind friends of the Institution, thus proving that while their fingers are taught to work, their hearts have been taught to feel for others. It is to be hoped that this self-denial of these little ones for the comfort of others, will induce many to deny themselves, if need be, to sustain efficiently an institution which implants such principles in the human heart. Encouraged by what these kind children had done, a charitable gentleman of the city presented them with a large quantity of yarn.

By the considerate kindness of a few benevolent individuals, the children of the Orphans' Home, together with those of the Boys' and Girls' Home, were treated last Christmas, to a most excellent dinner of "roast beef and plum pudding," in the St. Lawrence Hall, which they enjoyed most thoroughly. The principal mover in this feast was Mr. Hallam, Front Street.

The Managers desire again to express their obligations to the kind physician of the Home, Dr. Ogden, who has so long and so faithfully, free of charge, administered to all the inmates of the Institution; and through whose skill and kind attention, under God's blessing, they have been indebted during the past year for almost uninterrupted health.

By referring to the Treasurer's report, you will see that this year we have received a Parliamentary Grant of \$640; a City Council Grant, \$400; from the Corporation of Port Dalhousie, \$40; a legacy from the late John Cameron, Esq., Grafton, \$400; and another from the late Mr. John Lindsay, of Brockton, \$196; also a Grant from the Municipality of Clifton, \$25; \$13 collected by Mr. Pettigrew, who has always been a kind friend to the Home; and \$50 from the Relief Committee, of Guelph.

Children of all Protestant denominations are received into this Home, and all, except Roman Catholics, can obtain children for apprenticeship or adoption; therefore this Institution cannot be considered sectarian in its views of management. Gentlemen and ladies are earnestly requested to visit the Home at any time and record their opinions regarding it, whether favorable or otherwise, in a Visitor's Book kept for that purpose.
