



CELLULOID CRYSTALS FOR WAT-

Celluloid has been put to many uses, but the latest is the manufacture of a watch crystal that is guaranteed not to break. Anyone who has carelessly let his watch fall and has mournfully watched the small pieces of the broken glass crystal fly in a hundred different directions can realize what a non-breakable, transparent watch crystal means. The Germans are responsible for the new use of celluloid. These crystals cost a little more than glass. but they are proving popular because they are much more durable. Daily Hints for the Cook

MOCHA CARAMEL BUTTER

Mocha caramel butter for filling cakes is made by adding 1-2 cup of freshened butter to 1 1-2 cups of confectioner's sugar and beating together until creamy. Then flavor with 2 tablespoonfuls of mocha caramel filling.

A delicious frosting may be made by using whipped cream and mocha caramel filling.

Into big mixing bowl put a scant tablespoonful of salt, 2 of molasses, scant one of lard, 1-2 one of butter. Pour over this about 1-2 cup boiling water to melt. Add 1 pint warm milk and 3-4 cake of yeast (dissolved of course). Put into this warm liquid enough bread flour to make a batter that will beat without spattering. Cool and set aside for a couple of hours, then stir in enough sifted graham to knead. Cut the graham in with a knife and you won't have to knead it. Next morning just handle to shape for the time.

CHARLOTTE RUSSE.

To make a really delicious charlotte russe prepare first of all, a very delicious sponge cake after this formula:

Four eggs, beaten separately. Into the beaten yolks, beat again one cup of sugar and to this add half a cup of potato flour. Into the flour must previously have been sifted three-fourths of a level teaspoonful cream of tartar and one-fourth teaspoonful of soda, the same of salt. Add, finally, two teaspoonfuls lemon extract and the white of the eggs. Bake in a charlotte russe pan. Remove the centre, leaving a hollow shell. Fill this hollow with flavored, sweetened whipped cream or with its creamy in any flavor liked, or Bavarian cream if available for the purpose.

The same cake may be baked in ordinary tins for forty-five minutes, when it yields a soft and very light sponge loaf.

RHUBARB CUSTARD PIE

Stew 2 cup's rhubarb, press through a sieve, add 1 cup sugar, 1 egg, 1 tables sponge constarch, butter size of nutmeg.
