These topics are first discussed by these bodies in separate sessions and afterward their reports are submitted for further discussion and adoption or rejection by the whole Congress.

The Congress itself is made up of sections representing the Socialists of as many different countries as are taking a share in its work but there is no uniform plan by which elections are carried on or the number and position in the Congress of these dele-gates is determined.

The reports are printed in French and in another language reported to have been English. The explanation was made that the English was misleading because it was written by a gentleman who knew what wanted to say but did not know the English way of saying it.

The discussions are carried on in the three languages and the votes all ealled for and taken in the same confusion of tongues.
