Within the Dominion..... 2 cts each letter. | To the United States..... 5 cts each letter.
To Newfoundland..... 2 " " | To the United Kingdom..... 5 " "

These registration fees are, of course, in addition to the postage, and must be prepaid by registration stamp.

N. B.—Registration Stamps cannot be accepted in payment of postage.

Parcel Post.—The following rates apply for the transmission of Parcels in Canada.

Not exceeding ½ lb..... 6 cts. | Not exceeding 1 lb..... 18 cts.
½ lb..... 12 cts. | 1 lb..... 24 cts.

Registration fee, 5 cents. Parcels can only be sent by post to places in Canada. Postages and registration fee must be prepaid. The limit of weight to parcels is 5 lbs.

There is no Parcel Post to any place beyond the limits of the Dominion of Canada. Parcels to Manitoba and British Columbia must not exceed 2 lbs 8 oz. in weight. (Special) Parcel can be sent to Winnipeg, 5 lbs.

Money Orders in Canada.—All Money Order Post offices in Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward's Island, Manitoba and British Columbia are authorized to draw Money Orders on each other for any sum up to \$100, and for as many orders of \$100 each as the applicant may require, upon the following terms, viz.:

Orders up to \$ 4..... 2 cts. | Orders from \$40 to \$80..... 30 cts.
" " " 5..... 5 cts. | " " " 60 to 80..... 40 cts.
Orders from \$10 to \$20..... 10 cts. | " " " 80 to 100..... 50 cts.
" " " 30 to 40..... 30 cts.

Money Orders on the United Kingdom.—The Money Order Offices in the Dominion also draw upon all the Money Order Offices in England, Ireland and Scotland, the Channel Islands and British India—save those in British India for which there are special rates—for any sum to £10 sterling, and grant as many orders for £10 each as may be required to make up the amount remitted. The terms are as under:—

Orders up to £2 10s..... 30 cts. | Orders from £5 to £7 10s..... 60 cts.
Orders from £2 10s to £5..... 50 cts. | " " " 10s to £10..... 80 cts.

Money Orders on Newfoundland.—The Money Order Offices in Ontario, Quebec, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, drawn also upon Money Order Offices in Newfoundland, Prince Edward's Island, Manitoba and British Columbia. The orders on Newfoundland, like those of the United Kingdom, are made payable in sterling money.

Orders up to £3..... 25 cts. | Orders from £5 to £7..... 40 75
Orders from £2 to £5..... 50 cts. | " " " £7 to £10..... 1 00

Money Orders on the United States.—Money Order Offices in the Dominion are also authorized to grant Money Orders on the United States, the maximum amount of which, however, on a single Order is limited to \$50, Canadian currency. The rates are:—

Orders under and up to \$10..... 10 cts. | Orders from \$30 to \$40..... 40 cts.
Orders from \$10 to \$20..... 30 cts. | " " " 40 to 50..... 50 cts.
" " " 20 to 30..... 50 cts.

Two-Horse Vehicle—For the conveyance or carriage of any number of passengers not exceeding four, in carriage, sleigh, or other vehicle, drawn by two horses, when hired by the hour, or when the time occupied amounts to or exceeds an hour:

For the first hour	\$1 25
And for each subsequent quarter of an hour	0 25
Each additional passenger for the first hour	0 20
And for each subsequent quarter of an hour	0 05

One-Horse Vehicle—For the conveyance or carriage of any number of passengers not exceeding four, in a carriage, sleigh, or other vehicle, drawn by one horse, when hired by the hour, or when the time occupied amounts to or exceeds an hour:

For the first hour	\$1 00
And for each subsequent quarter of an hour	0 20
Each additional passenger for the first hour	0 20
And for each subsequent quarter of an hour	0 05

For the conveyance of one passenger from one of the carter's stands, or from one part of the city to one or more places consecutively in said city, provided the time occupied in conveying and waiting for such passenger

Does not exceed fifteen minutes	\$0 25
And for each additional passenger	0 10
If the time occupied exceeds 15 but not 30 minutes	0 40
And for each additional passenger	0 15
Each subsequent 10 minutes after the first 30 minutes	0 15
And for each additional passenger	0 05

but if the time occupied continuously whilst any such vehicle shall be in the employ of the same person or persons amounts to or exceeds one hour, then the rates by the hour, as aforesaid, shall only be proper and legal, and no higher rates shall be legal.

That each passenger shall be allowed to take with him or her, one trunk or other baggage to a reasonable extent, free of charge; and it shall be the duty of the person in charge of any such vehicle to load and unload the same free of charge.

That children under five years of age shall not be charged for as additional passengers, and children over five and under twelve years of age shall not be charged for as additional passengers more than half rates.

RULES

Respecting the Library of Parliament.

A PROPER Catalogue of the books belonging to the Library shall be kept by the Librarian, in whom the custody and responsibility thereof shall be vested; and who shall be required to report to the House, through Mr. Speaker, at the opening of each Session, the actual state of the Library.

No person shall be entitled to resort to the Library during the Session of Parliament, except the Governor-General, the Members of the Privy Council and of the Senate and House of Commons, and the officers of both Houses, and such other persons as may receive a written order of admission from the Speaker of either House. Members may personally introduce strangers to the Library during the day-time, but not after the hour of seven o'clock p.m.

During a Session of Parliament, no books belonging to the Library shall be taken out of the building, except by the authority of the Speaker or upon receipts given by a Member of either House.

During a recess of Parliament, the Library and Reading Room shall be open every day of each week, (Sundays and holidays excepted), from the hour of ten in the morning until three in the afternoon; and access to the Library shall be permitted to persons introduced by a member of the Legislature, or admitted at the discretion of the Clerk or Librarian; subject to such regulations as may be deemed necessary for the security and preservation of the collection; but no one shall be allowed to take any book out of the Library except Members of the Legislature, and such others as may be authorized by the Speaker of either House.

During the recess of Parliament, no Member of either House not residing at the seat of Government, shall be at liberty to borrow or have in his possession at any one time more than three works from the Library, and to retain the same longer than three weeks, and all such persons shall return the books so taken when required by the Librarian.

No books of reference, or books of special cost or value, may be removed from the seat of Government under any circumstances.

At the first meeting of the Joint Library Committee at every Session of Parliament, the Librarian shall report a list of the books absent at the commencement of the Session, specifying the names of any persons who have retained the same in contravention of either of the foregoing rules.

Her Royal Highness, Helena-Augusta-Victoria, born May 25th, 1846; married to His Royal Highness Prince Frederick-Christian-Charles-Augustus, of Schleswig-Holstein-Sonderburg-Augustenburg, July 5th, 1866, and has had issue two sons and two daughters.

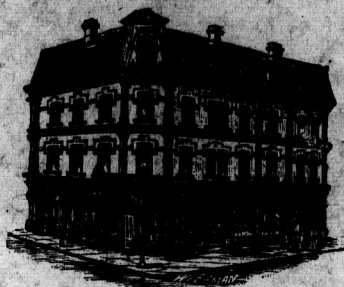
