The roll having been called, and the attendance marked, the Moderator addressed the court and intimated that the first business was the election of a Moderator.

On motion of Mr. John Johnston seconded by Mr. A. D. Mac-Donald, Mr. W. S Ball, of English Settlement, was unanimously elected Moderator, and took the chair accordingly.

On motion of Dr. John Thomson, seconded by Mr. Robert Hamilton, a cordial vote of thanks was tendered the retiring Moderator for his conduct in the chair, and for the sermon preached before the Synod.

SEDERUNTS OF SYNOD.

It was agreed that the Sederunt of Synod should be from 9 a m. to 12:30 p. m.: 2:30 p. m. to 5:30 p m, and 7:30 p. m. to 10:30 p. m.: and that the first hour of the next Sederunt should be spent in devotional exercises, the Synod to meet to-morrow morning at 10 a. m.

PRESBYTERIES ALLOWED TO MEET.

The various Presbyteries within the bounds, were permitted to meet for the transaction of necessary business, during the intervals between the Sederunts of Synod.

The Synod then adjourned to meet to morrow morning at 10 a.m., and was closed by the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

SECOND SEDERUNT.

St. Andrew's Church, Chatham, the twenty sixth day of Λ pril, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven years, at 10 a. m.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment, the Rev. W. S. Ball, Moderator.

 Devotional exercises were engaged in during the first hour, in which the Moderator and Messrs McKinnon, Ramsay, McMullen, McConechy, McCoy, Campbell, ministers, and James Bell, elder, took part.

COMMITTEE ON BILLS AND OVERTURES.

Mr. Gray, from the committee on Bills and Overtures, presented their first report as to the order of business for the day, which, on motion, was adopted.

The Synod then proceeded to take up the business in the order recommended.

BUXTON FUND.

The Clerk presented the report of the committee on the Buxton Fund showing that the sum of \$239.99 had been received during the year and paid over to Mr. King. On motion the report was received, and the committee reappointed for the ensuing year.

The Rev. Wm. King was heard before the Synod, in reference to his work in past years in connection with the Buxton Mission.

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COMMITTEE TO NOMINATE STANDING COMMITTEES.

The Moderator submitted the following names as the Committee to strike Standing Committees for the year: Messrs. D. H. Fletcher, James Boyd, John Gray, D. M. Ramsay, R. Leask, W. M. Martin, ministers, and Messrs. Jas. Bell, Thomas Gordon and Samuel Fraser, elders.

PETITION FROM BRUCE PRESBYTERY.

A petition from the Presbytery of Bruce, asking the Synod to agree to the transference of Balaklava from that Presbytery to the Presbytery of Saugeen, was read and considered.

On motion of Mr. Cuthbertson, duly seconded, the Synod agreed to grant the prayer of the petition to transfer the charge of Balaklava to the Presbytery of Saugeen, to be by them connected with some other congregation as they may deem best, said action to be subject to the approval of the General Assembly.

OVERTURE ANENT AGED AND INFIRM MINISTER'S FUND.

There was read and considered an overture from the Chatham Presbytery to the General Assembly, asking that the Assembly should appoint or enjoin the appointment of one or more ministers or members to canvass the church for the increase of the aged and infirm minister's fund.

The overture having been read, Messrs. Becket and Gray were heard in its support.

The overture was received.

On motion of Mr. D. H. Fletcher, seconded by Mr. Geo. Burson, the Synod adopted the overture and ordered it to be transmitted to the General Assembly. Dr. Thomson and Mr. John Gray, ministers, and Mr. J. A. Younge, elder, were appointed to support the overture.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned to meet again at 2:80 p. m., the Moderator pronouncing the benediction.

THIRD SEDERUNT.

St. Andrew's Church, Chatham, the twenty-sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven years, 2.30 p. m.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment, the Rev. W. S Ball, Moderator, who constituted the Synod by prayer.

MINUTES SUSTAINED.

The minutes of the former Sederunt were read and sustained.

On motion of Dr. Thomson, duly seconded, the address of Mr. Goforth, on Foreign Missions, was postponed until the evening Sederunt.

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BRANTFORD YOUNG LADIES COLLEGE.

The Clerk read a report transmitted by the Board of Directors of the Young Ladies College, Brantford, giving particulars as to the present encouraging condition of the institution, and its prospects for still greater usefulness, and asking the continuedpatronage and support of the members of the Synod, and that a visitor be appointed for the ensuing year.

Dr. T. M. MacIntyre, the Principal of the College, addressed the court, pressing the claims of the institution upon the attention of ministers and elders within the bounds of the Synod, and Presbyterian families

generally

After questions had been asked of Dr. MacIntyre in regard to the college, and brief addresses by Drs Thomson, Cochrane and others the following resolution, on motion of Dr. Laing, seconded by Mr. Becket,

was unanimously adopted.

"That the Synod receive the Memorial, and express pleasure in receiving the statement of the Directors of the Brantford Ladies College, and is gratified to learn through Dr. MacIntyre, the Principal, of the good work which is being done by this institution, for the cause of Christian training, and for its power for good in the Presbyterian Church. That the Synod commend the institution to the members within its bounds, and earnestly urge them to take an active interest in promoting in every way the success of such a centre of influence, within, and under the supervision of the church. That the Synod has pleasure in granting the petition of the memorial, and nominates the Rev. W. T. McMullen, Woodstock, as a visitor from the Synod of Hamilton and London for the ensuing year."

REPORT ON TEMPERANCE.

Mr. W. A. McKay, Convener of the Committee on Temperance, presented the report for the year, and gave a summary of the returns made to the questions sent down to Kirk Sessions and Presbyteries by the General Assembly's Committee on Temperance.

After discussion the report was unanimously received and adopted, as also the following recommendations of the Synodical Committee:

1. That in advancing this work we give ourselves with increased earnestness to the preaching of Christ. Faith in Christ can alone save society, and make a temperate, peacable, orderly people of God. Let us therefore hold up Christ in our pulpits, in our prayer meetings, Sabbath Schools, bible classes and families, as the only foundation of Temperance and social reformation.

That we persevere in our conflict on the platform of civil law until we obtain through the whole land a law that will prohibit, instead of sanctioning and protecting this great evil.

That we express our gratification at the intention of the Provincial Government to impart Temperance instruction in all our public schools.

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4. That our people be advised in accordance with the repeatedly expressed mind of our General Assembly to support at the polls only efficient men, who are known for their christian Temperance principles.

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod then adjourned the meet again at 7:30 p. m., and the Moderator pronounced the benediction.

FOURTH SEDERUNT.

St. Andrew's Church, Chatham, the twenty-sixth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-seven years, 7:30 p. m.

The Synod met pursuant to adjournment, Rev. W. S. Ball, Moderator. After devotional exercises conducted by the Moderator and Mr. J. A. Murray, London, the Synod was duly constituted.

The minutes of the former Sederunt were read and sustained.

REPORTS ON THE STATE OF RELIGION, SABBATH SCHOOLS AND SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

The reports on the state of Religion, Sabbath Schools and Sabbath Observance were then called for and submitted by Mr. Alexander Henderson, Mr. George Rutherford, and Mr. John Gray, the respective conveners of the said committees.

The reports were all received.

At this stage of the evening's sederunt, Mr. Goforth, of Knox College, under appointment by the students to the foreign field, was heard on the claims of the heathen world, upon the sympathies and prayers of Canadian christians.

After Mr. Goforth's address, the Synod proceeded to consider the recommendations of the committee on the state of religion seriatim.

They were unanimously adopted and are as follows:

1. That sessions be recommended to divide their congregations into districts, where such is not already the case, for the more systematic oversight thereof, and that Presbyteries in their religious conferences during the year endeavor to render such kindly counsel as may conduce to the greater efficiency of our sessions and managing boards.

2. That the attention of ministers and sessions be again drawn to the recommendation of last General Assembly, anent the religious instruction of the young, and that parents be affectionately aroused to the duty and responsibility to teach their children piety at home, as well as by the

other agencies of the church.

3. That our christian people especially in towns and cities, be exhorted to give all possible encouragement and help to those who in a legitimate way by the early closing movement, are seeking the relief of both merchants and their clerks from the grievous bondage of late shopping, especially on Saturday nights."

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The recommendations of the committee on Sabbath Schools were then considered seriatim, and also unanimously adopted. They are as follows:

1. That each Presbytery require from its Sabbath School Committee a report of every school within the bounds, to be presented at its March meeting

 That each Presbytery devise and adopt if possible, some scheme of supervision or visitation whereby the efficiency of each of their schools may be ascertained and enhanced.

3. That Presbyteries recommend wherever practicable the use of the

Assembly's series of registers.

4. That Presbyteries impress on sessions and superintendents the duty of recording the Sabbath school scholars who have become communicants during the year, and also of urging every school to connect itself by some contribution, however small, with the great mission work of the church.

MINUTE ANENT MR. GOFORTH'S MISSION.

On motion of Mr. Burson. the Synod adopted the following resolution: "The Synod desires to put on record its gratitude to God that so many of our students, to the number of thirty-one, have offered themselves to the Foreign Mission field, and their pleasure in hearing Mr. Goforth, who is to be sent by the students to the Foreign Mission field, and assure him of the sympathy of this Synod, and their prayer that he may be eminently successful as a laborer in the gospel in the heathen field."

The hour of adjournment having arrived, the Synod adjourned to meet again to-morrow morning at 9 a. in. and the Moderator pronounced the

Mr. W. T. McMullen, on behalf of the committee appointed to consider applications for the licensing of students, gave in a report recommending that leave be given to the Presbytery of Chatham to take on trials for license, D. G. McQueen, and Mr. J. W. Rae; to the Presbytery of Huron to take on trials for license, Mr. John McGillivray, and Mr. J. W. Orr; to the Presbytery of Sarnia to take on trials for license, Mr. George A. McLennan; and to the Presbytery of London, to take on trials for license, Mr. J. E. Browne, and John J. Dobbin.

CHATHAM COLLEGIATE INSTITUTE.

The clerk read a letter from Judge Bell, inviting the members of Synod to visit the new buildings recently erected for the Chatham Collegiate Institute. The clerk was instructed to acknowledge the courtesy and kindness of Judge Bell in sending the invitation.

TIME AND PLACE OF NEXT MEETING.

It was agreed that the Synod meet next year in St. Andrews Church, London, on the last Monday in April, 1888, at half-past seven p. m.

PRESBYTERY RECORDS.

The committees appointed to examine the records of the Presbyteries of Hamilton, Paris, London, Chatham, Stratford, Sarnia, Huron, Maitland and Bruce, reported the same as carefully and correctly kept, and the records were ordered to be attested in accordance with said reports.

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SABBATH OBSERVANCE.

The Synod resumed consideration of the report of the committee on Sabbath Observance, postponed from last night's Sederunt.

On motion of Dr. Archibald, seconded by Mr. A. Henderson, the report was adopted in the following terms: Having heard the report of the Synod's committee on Sabbath Observance, the Synod of Hamilton and London receive and adopt the same, and in doing so desire to reaffirm their conviction that our ministers and people ought to use every available means to counteract the tendency to sabbath desecration so prevalent throughout our land, and especially that they should unite with the people of other christian denominations in a strenuous effort to prevent railway and steamboat travelling on the sabbath.

OVERTURE ANENT THE LICENSING OF STUDENTS.

Dr. Laing presented an overture to the General Assembly anent the licensing of students, and was heard in its support. On notion made and seconded, the Overture was adopted, and Dr. Archibald and Mr. Burson appointed to support it before the General Assembly.

OVERTURES ANENT ORDAINED MISSIONARIES.

There was taken up and read an Overture regarding the relation of Missionaries to the church courts, and asking the next General Assembly to consider the matter, and give direction to the inferior courts as in its judgment may be deemed proper.

Dr. Laing was heard in support of the Overture, which was, after consideration, unanimously adopted, and Dr. Cochrane and Mr. Burson appointed to support it before the General Assembly.

REPORT OF THE AUDITORS.

Mr. Walker, Convener of the committee to mudit the Treasurer's books and accounts, gave in a report to the effect that they had examined the books and vouchers and found the same correct, and the business transacted in a highly satisfactory manner. The report was received, and on motion the thanks of the Synod tendered through the Moderator, to Mr. Rutherford, the Treasurer.

VOTE OF THANKS.

It was, moved by Dr. Cochrane, seconded by Mr. Chrystal, that the thanks of the Synod are due to the minister and officers of St. Andrews Church, Chatham: for the use of their building and the arrangements made for the work of the Synod; to the committee in providing homes


for the delegates; to the christian people of the town, for their generous hospitality; and to the Grand Trunk Railway for reduced rates to the members of the Synod.
