A STRANGE DEATH.

Cincinnati, O., Jan. 16-An Indianapolis special gives an account of the most singular killing ever-reported. Leonidas Grover, living near Newtown, Fountain County, while in bed was killed by the fall of a meteoric stene. The stone is said to be twenty pounds weight. The story is not entirely credited. About twelve o'clock on Wednesday night the Union Cheese Factory, probably better known as Collins' Factory, situated on the gravel road between 'Jistowel and Newry, was discoved to be on fire. There was no assistance available, and the fire having made considerable headway when first seen, the building and surreundings were totally destroyed. The origin of the fire is evidently the work of an incendiary, as the factory was closed and no one to the knowledge of those living in the neighborhood had been it in for some time previous. It was the property of a joint stock company, and was reputed as being one of the best cheese factories in this district. As building, machinery and everything in connection have been destroyed, it is doubtful if \$3,000 will cover the loss. We learn that it was insured for the sum of \$1,300 in a Witerloo Company. It is probable that an investigation will be made into the origin of the fire.
