J. Roderick Robertson and Seven Others Perish in New York.

Dynamite Used in Rapid Transit Construction Does Terrible Destruction.

A Hundred People Injured and Several Large Buildings Wrecked.

New York, Jan. 27.—An explosion in the Park avenue shaft of the Rapid Transit tunnel in this city shortly after noon today caused the death of eight persons. At least 100 persons are injured, and serious damage was done to property, including the Murray Hill hotel, Manhattan Eye and Ear hospital, Grand Union hotel and Grand Central station on East Forty-second street.

The approach to the street railway tunnel used by the Madison avenue line cuts through Park avenue, and the shaft for the Rapid Transit subway was run down beside it at the intersection of Forty-first street.

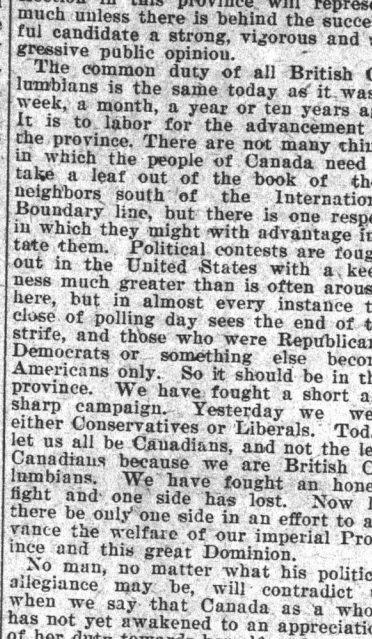

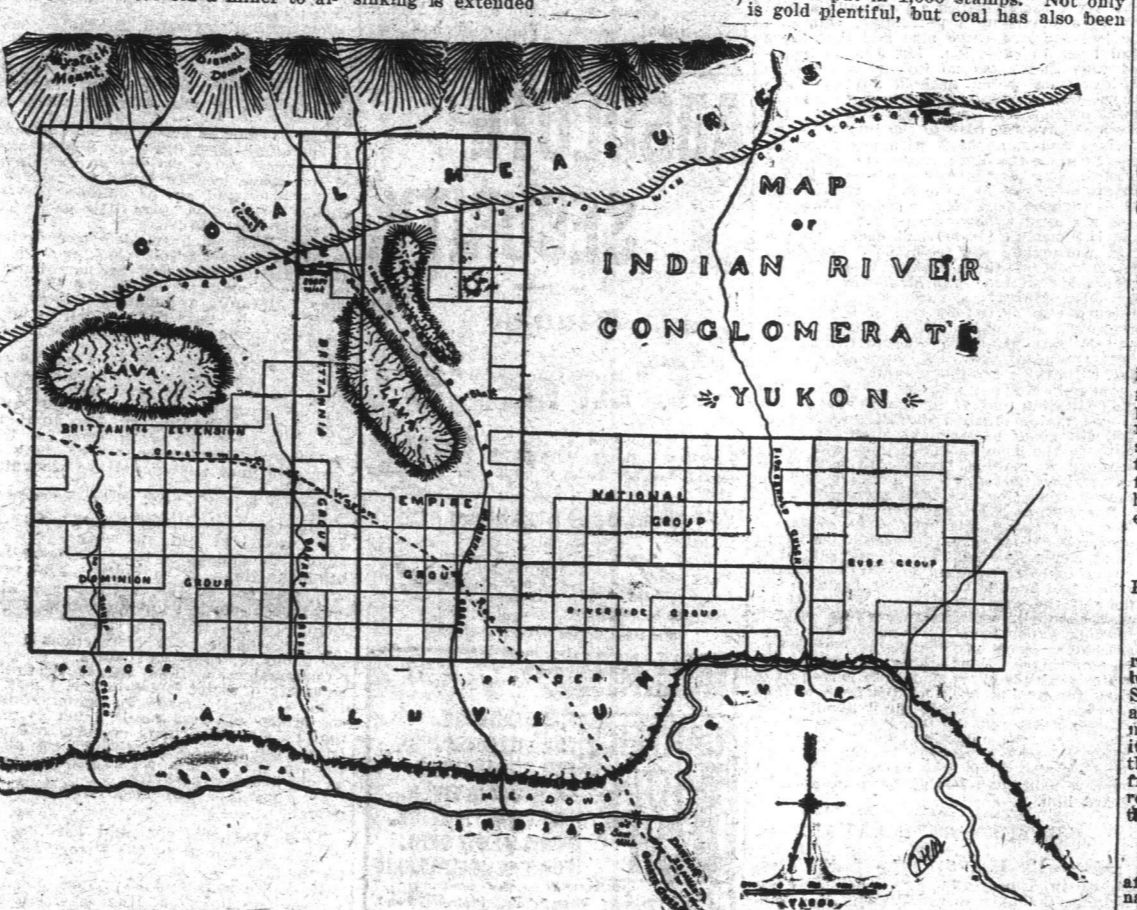
