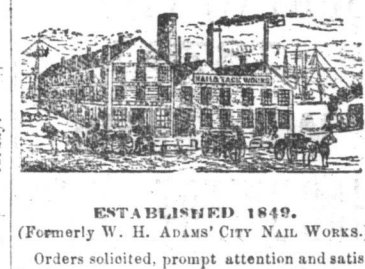

The capital of the Dominion must be a busy place just now. The accession of a new Sovereign to the Throne—a new Viceroi—a General Election—or a change of Ministry always tends to impart untold interest to a parliamentary session.

Never before, perhaps, has the Canadian capital been so crowded with eager outsiders as it is to-day. There are here by interest, visitors, in multitude from all parts of the Dominion.

We would fain hope that stern state-manship, with inflexible firmness, will so far assert its independence, and maintain its dignity, as not to be intimidated or browbeaten by outside boisterous importunity.

It is to be hoped that, during the present Legislative Session, party political feuds will be suffered to die, or at least lie dormant; that no factious hostility will be arrayed against good governmental measures, and that the predominant party will not turn a deaf ear to the suggestions and remonstrances of the Opposition.

OTTAWA, Feb. 14. From an early hour morning it was evident that something unusual was going to occur. Not that an opening of Parliament in Ottawa is a new thing, but the fact that a live Prince was going to appear on the throne tended to add greater interest to the ceremonies.

Parliament has recognized the importance of providing for the safe deposit of the moneys of the nation by arranging for their being placed with the Government at a fair rate of interest. It may be well for you to consider how far it is in your interest to give a like security arrangement to persons who may desire by an insurance upon their lives to make provision for those dependent upon them.

The state dinner at the Government House was a most brilliant affair and will probably not soon be forgotten by those who were present. Such an important gathering of the highest dignitaries of the country has, perhaps, never before taken place in Canada.

The "Zoolah" War.

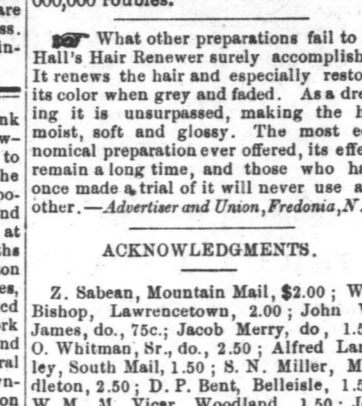

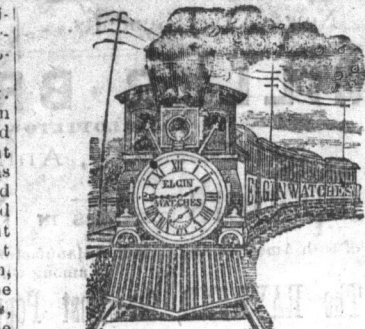

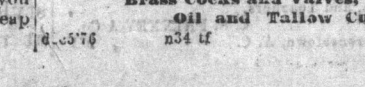
