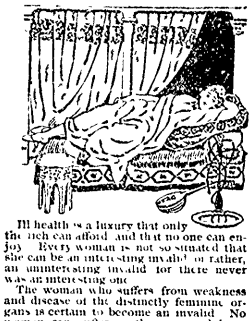

The Government Contention Upheld.
