minutes before the Sun, and will be a Morning Star during the remainder of the year.

JUPITER.—In the months of January, February and March Jupiter will be a Morning Star. It will be above the horizon during the greater portion of each night from the end of January until the middle of May, when it sets 2 hours and a half before sunrise. It will be an Evening Star from about the last week in March until the close of September, and during the remainder of the year a Morning Star.

SATURN.—On the 1st January Saturn will be an Evening Star—it then sets about 1 hour and 45 minutes after sunset, and on the 25th will be in conjunction with the Sun. It will be a Morning Star from the beginning of February till the 6th August, and then an Evening Star for the remainder of the year.

Like any other business, it requires system in the ordering of operations, and scientific knowledge and practical skill for their correct performance. Any strong workman can plough, and sow, and reap, and feed cattle, and carry produce to market. But it requires a trained mind to direct the ploughing, and sowing, and reaping, so that there may be an outcome of profit. The reason why farming was long regarded as unprofitable in Nova Scotia was not that the soil was naturally poor, or the climate bad, but that the cultivation was slovenly from want of intellectual stimulus.

See that wells and watering places are kept open; nothing is so injurious to cattle as want of water, especially when they have nothing but dry feed. At this season serve out the best hay, and give some roots and grain to all stock for which they can be spared. Where roots have not been grown, it is well to consider whether the stock of animals should not be reduced before wintering time; but it is too late to think of that now, for nobody will buy poor cattle at this time of

year, and it will therefore be profitable to purchase grain for your stock. Nothing is so unprofitable as to starve stock.

So soon as the snow is deep enough sleighing operations should begin. Bring home from the woods the fuel that has been chopped, and deposit it in orderly piles in the back yard or close to the wood house. During wet and snowy weather it can be cut under cover, and will thus supply work for unfavorable days that would otherwise be lost. Haul fence poles to the lines where they are to be used on the opening of spring.

It so completely covers the ground that weeds are killed out wherever it grows. In wet lands where red clover gets winter killed, the Alsike grows most luxuriantly, not suffering during the severest winters. It may be sown upon the grass land, where the sod

is not too close, any time during the spring or early summer. In seed-ing down land, always sow the clovers in spring time if possible, so as to give a strong root for the first winter.

In March see that all your farm implements are repaired, so as to be ready for spring work. Make definite plans and calculations as to the crops to be put in, see that you have manure enough at hand for them, and lay in your supplies of seed, so as not to have to run to town and buy the first bad seed you can get, while your men are waiting in the field to sow it. Make up a hot-bed for cabbages, celery, salads, and such flowers as are required to furnish the beds in front of the windows. *TTC*

It is only in favourable seasons that much field work can be accomplished in April, yet every preparation should be completed, so that when the frost leaves the ground and dry weather comes, a beginning may be made. On land prepared in the Fall, early potatoes and peas may be sown a fortnight or three weeks earlier than on land that has still to be ploughed. In the garden, select a dry, warm sunny exposure for early vegetables. Peas, parsnips, onions and carrots may be sown as early as it is possible to make a drill. Early potatoes should also be put in for summer use. It is too early to sow salads, &c.

should be sown. Early frost will not injure any of these. But bush beans, Indian corn, squashes, cucumbers and pole beans require to be sown about the end of May or beginning of June, after the ground has become dry and warm.

In order to economise time, arrange all the men's work for them the day before, and in the evening tell them what you want them to do the next day, so that their tools, clothing, &c., may be suitable for the work. Take the first rainy day in May to clean out the cellar, and, after the bulk of the seed is in the ground, take the first bright sunny day to whitewash the outhouses and fences.

JUNE is turnip month, and we wish this crop were more generally cultivated, as, in suitable soils, the yield is enormous. The soil requires to be made very fine by ploughings, rolling, harrowing, &c., and the manure applied should be well-rotted. The best of all manure for turnips is bone dust or superphosphate of lime; even half-inch bones have a wonderful effect upon this crop, where farm yard manure has been ploughed in. Swedish Turnips are best adapted to the circumstances of Nova Scotia: they may be sown earlier than the other kinds, they may be transplanted like cabbages, they are not so liable to suffer from frost as the softer sorts, and they keep much better during the winter. They are besides much

more nutritious for stock, and give a larger supply of winter food for the same extent of storage, which is here a considerable item. The sowing of white and yellow turnips (as distinguished from Swedes) may be profitably delayed till July, and when the turnip land happens not to be got ready by the end of June, or beginning of July, it is better in ordinary seasons to sow the soft kinds. Yet in some seasons the Swedes will succeed well and grow large even when sown late in July. When the fly eats away the young turnips as fast as they come up, draw a light harrow over the drills and sow again; probably the fly will have gone by the time the second sowing comes up. At any rate do not be contented with a poor crop, merely because it will save a pound or two of seed and a little trouble.

In the Almanack for 1873 we gave a recommendation in reference to seeding down grass lands, which we consider very important. It is being acted upon in some parts of the Province to a limited extent; but, as we hope it will be more extensively followed, we repeat the paragraph:—Hay being by far the most important crop produced in Nova Scotia, the operation of seeding down land to grass is entitled to much attention. In the past the common method has been to sow grass seed with barley or oats or wheat in Spring, and to look for a hay crop in the year following. The disadvantages of this plan are (1) that if the grain grows well, the grass plant will be partially smothered; (2) if the land is not very clean there will be an

abundant crop of weeds and brown top in the grass; and (3) by the time two or three crops of hay have been obtained, the land begins to show signs of running out. To overcome these disadvantages, it is now customary in some localities to prepare the land and sow the grass seed in August or September. By this method a full crop is obtained during the following summer. Potato land may be treated in this way as soon as the potatoes are taken up. Old grass land that requires renewing may be merely ploughed, harrowed, topdressed with manure and sown with timothy. Clover seed should never be sown in the Fall, but may be scattered over the fields in Spring time.

THE Hay Harvest is now completed, and the Grain Harvest commenced. There are also other crops to be secured. Potatoes may be taken up as soon as ripe, that is when the haulm, or stalks, have matured and browned or blackened. It is not necessary to wait until they are entirely withered away. Do not be in too great a hurry to throw your potatoes into large heaps; a dry, airy day will do as much to ripen potates as to make hay, if they are left loosely on the field; but, if left long in sunlight, they become green and nauseous and poisonous. Carefully pick out all faulty potatoe before storing away; they should be stored in a dark cellar, but with free

admission of air, so long as the temperature does not fall too low. After potato time, the mangel wurtzel has to be taken up, and then carrots and turnips; parsnips also, if required for winter use. All roots when taken up are partially cut or wounded, and, if thrown together in heaps before the surface has time to dry, the wounded spots begin to decay and enlarge, and the ultimate result is the entire destruction of the crop. People are continually complaining of their roots rotting, and yet continue the very methods calculated to set up putrefactive action in their winter stores. Let every root be dry on the surface before storing it away or allowing it to come into contact with another.

SWEDISH TURNIPS have usually to be taken up this month; they should never be raised until we have had a slight frost, followed by wet weather, which causes the roots to swell very rapidly. Be careful to let the cut surface left by removal of roots and tops to become dried over as it were, before storing away the bulbs. Parsnips may be taken up any time before severe frost, or they may be allowed to remain in ground all Winter, for use in Spring. It is time now to mulch all





Mails for the United States, British and Foreign West India Islands, South America, Cuba, St. Thomas, British Columbia, Vancouver's Island and Red River, by *Falmouth* to Portland; *Alhambra* and *Commerce* to Boston; and by Express Mail to St. John, via Annapolis.

Mails for Bermuda, St. Thomas, and the British and Foreign West India Islands, are made up every fourth Monday, at 10 A.M.

Mails for Newfoundland are made up every alternate Tuesday, at 11 A.M.

Mails for St. Pierre and Miquelon are forwarded in summer by land route to Sydney, C. B., where they are received by the French mail steamer—and during the winter months, direct from Halifax.

DEAD LETTERS opened and returned to the writer on payment of postage due thereon, together with 5 cents additional on each letter, and if registered a further sum of 2 cents.

Letters *Prepaid by Stamp* and dropped into the Letter Box any time during the night and up to 4.30 o'clock, A.M., will be forwarded by Mails despatched same morning.

Letter Rates.

Letters within the Dominion, if pre-paid, 3 cents per half ounce.

Letters within the Dominion, if unpaid, 5 cents per half ounce.

If a letter is posted partially unpaid, the charge on delivery will be the same as if wholly unpaid, deducting, however, any amount that may have been pre-paid upon it. Letters mailed for delivery at the office where posted, 1 cent each; must be prepaid by stamp, otherwise they will be sent to Dead Letter Office and returned to the writer. Letters are re-directed from one place to another without any further charge. On letters remailed from the Dead Letter Office, 5 cents additional.

Letters to Non-commissioned Officers and Privates, whether in Her Majesty's Service or Canadian Volunteers whilst on active service, pass, if pre-paid, for two cents each, when not over the $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce; if over $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce, ordinary letter rates.

On letters to Newfoundland 6 cents—pre-payment required.

Letters for the United States is 6 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., if pre-paid; if unpaid, or only partially paid, 10 cents per $\frac{1}{2}$ ounce.

To Bermuda 6 cents, and British and Foreign West Indies, by British mail packet from Halifax, monthly, the charge is 12 cents, which must be pre-paid.

Letter rates to the United Kingdom, by Canadian Packet from Halifax, not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., 6 cents. Exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz., and not ex-

ceeding 1 oz., 12 cents. Exceeding 1 oz. and not exceeding 1½ oz., 18 cents, and so on increasing, one rate of postage for each additional ½ oz. If letters for the United Kingdom are posted unpaid, they will be charged a fine of 3d. sterling in addition to the postage on delivery.

The postage on letters by the Cunard line from New York, is 8 cts. per ½ oz., and an additional 8 cents for every ½ oz., with a fine of 3d. sterling if posted unpaid or only partially pre-paid.

Letters sent by way of the United States, if addressed via New York, may be forwarded to Brazil 18 cts, Aspinwall 13 cts, Costa Rica 13 cts, Guatemala 13 cts, Cuba 10 cts, Mexico 13 cts, Nicaragua 13 cts, Panama 13 cts, Danish West Indies 13 cts, West Indies, not otherwise specified, 21 cts, Venezuela 13 cts, Bolivia, 25 cts, Ecuador 23 cts, Bermuda 10 cts, Honduras 13 cts, Sandwich Islands 9 cts, Australian Colonies, except Queensland, 10 cts, Bahamas 13 cts. These postages must be prepaid by stamps.

Mail Matter exempt from Postage.

All mailable matter, sent to or by the Governor-General, or sent to or from any Public Department at the Seat of Government at Ottawa, or to or from any member of the Legislature at the Seat of Government during the Session, or ten days before the meeting of Parliament.

Registration of Letters.

Parties posting letters containing articles of value should have them registered, and obtain a certificate of such registration from the office when posted.

The registration fee on letters circulating in the Dominion, and Newfoundland, is 2 cents; on letters to the United States, 5 cents; and on those for the United Kingdom, 8 cents; for British Colonies, see Table of Foreign Postage. The registration fee, together with the postage, should be pre-paid by postage stamp.

The object of registration is not to make the Postal Authorities responsible, but in order that a letter or package may be traced through the various offices through which it passes, and when loss is sustained by the negligence or carelessness of any party through whose hands it has passed, such individual is bound to make good the amount or value of such package.

Parcel Post.

Parcels may be posted for circulation in the Dominion only, at the following rates, which must be paid in advance:-

Not exceeding 8 ounces 12½ cents; above 8 ounces and not exceeding 1 lb., 25 cents; above 1 lb. and not exceeding 1½ lbs., 37½ cents; above 1½ lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs. 50 cents. Registration fee 5 cents.

No parcel to exceed 4 lbs. in weight. No letter must be enclosed. No parcel shall contain anything liable to injure the mail. The size is limited to two feet in length, one foot in breadth or thickness. The postage must be pre-paid by stamp. Unpaid parcels will not be forwarded, but short paid parcels will be sent on with a fine of 12½ cents in addition to any postage that may remain unpaid.

Pattern and Sample Post.

Patterns or samples of merchandise may be transmitted within the Dominion at the rate of 1 cent per oz., pre-paid by postage stamp, and may be registered on payment of a fee of 5 cents. Short paid packages of samples will be fined 5 cents. No packet should exceed 24 ozs., or

be more than 24 inches in length, or 12 in depth, or breadth. No letter should be enclosed, or anything liable to injure the contents of the mail. Parcels should be so made up that they may be easily examined by the officers of the Post Office.

Pattern and Sample Post with the United Kingdom, British Colonies, and Foreign Countries.

The following are the regulations for the transmission of Samples and Patterns of merchandise between the Dominion of Canada and the United Kingdom:

1st. Samples of seeds, drugs, and similar articles for delivery in the United Kingdom, may be sent in bags entirely closed, provided such bags be transparent.

2nd. Scissors, knives, razors, forks, steel pens, nails, keys, watch machinery, metal tubing, pieces of metal or ore, and such like articles, are allowed to be forwarded by post as samples, to the United Kingdom, Germany, and Belgium, provided they be packed so as not to injure the mails and the officers of the Post Office. They must be so put up as to be easily examined. Any packet found to be insufficiently guarded will not be forwarded.

Patterns or samples of merchandize now circulate between Canada and the following countries, but must not exceed the following weights and sizes:—

All papers must be pre-paid before leaving Canada, if not at the commuted rate, 1 cent each, but all transient newspapers, i.e. papers not from the publishers or British newspapers posted by news agents to regular subscribers, must be pre-paid 2 cents each by postage stamps. Exchange papers pass free between publishers in Canada, and also to and from those in the United States, Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland. Papers coming from England via the United States are charged 2 cents each on delivery; by Canadian mails free. Postage on papers from the United States to regular subscribers in Canada, 1 cent; transient United States papers 2 cents. Papers from Prince Edward Island and Newfoundland may be delivered to regular subscribers at the ordinary commuted rate; transient papers, 2 cents each.

Canadian Book Post.

Books and Pamphlets addressed to any place in Canada, Newfoundland, or the United States, must be pre-paid 1 cent per 2 oz. by postage stamps. Periodicals 1 cent per 4 ozs.

British Book Post.

Books may be sent by post between the Dominion of Canada and Great Britain by Canadian Mail Steamers, at the following rates, which must be pre-paid:—

The rules which guide the transmission of Books by post are:—

1st. Book packets must either have no cover or be open at both ends or both sides.

2nd. Must contain no writing, or any sealed enclosure.

3rd. The weight not to exceed 4 lbs; the size not to exceed two feet long or 1 foot in width or depth. Insufficiently paid books, if for Canada, Newfoundland, or the United States, will be sent to the Dead Letter Office; but if for England they will be forwarded, marked with the unpaid postage and 3d. sterling as a fine.

French Book Post.

Books for France to be forwarded at the following rates—must be sent either by the Canadian mail steamers from Portland or Quebec, or by the Allan steamers from Halifax:—

A Book Packet may contain any number of separate Books, Publications, Works of Art and Literature, Maps, Prints, Photographs, Paper, Vellum, Parchment; they may be either written, printed or plain, or any mixture of the three. Book Packets must be open at both ends or both sides.

Parcel post may contain anything contained in the British Book Post, Printer's Proofs and copy, Military Returns, Statements containing Figures and Signatures, Returns, Deeds, Legal papers, and all such things not strictly letters.

Ship Letters.

Letters by private ship, from the United Kingdom, in *ship letter mail* 2 cents, if addressed to the port of arrival, and to other places in the Dominion, 5 cents. Loose ship letters from the United Kingdom, British Colonies, and Foreign countries, 4 cents. From places in the Dominion, if addressed to the port of arrival, 4 cents; and to other places in the Dominion, 7 cents. The Postmaster General may make such reasonable compensation, as he may see fit, to masters of vessels, not being Post Office Packets, for each letter conveyed by such vessels between places beyond the sea and the Dominion, and may direct that at any port such vessels shall not be permitted by the Officers of Customs to enter or break bulk until all letters have been delivered at the Post Office, nor until the master has made a declaration that he has delivered all.

The Postmaster General has the exclusive privilege of transmitting letters within the Dominion; and (except in the cases hereinafter mentioned) any person collecting, sending, or delivering letters, incurs a penalty, not exceeding \$20, for each and every letter so conveyed or found in his possession. Such penalty not to apply to, 1. Letters sent by a private friend, provided such letters be delivered by such friend to the party addressed; 2. Letters sent by a messenger on purpose, concerning the private affairs of the sender or receiver; 3. Commissions or returns thereof, issuing out of a court of Justice; 4. Letters addressed to a place out of the Dominion, sent by sea and by a private vessel; 5. Letters lawfully brought into the Dominion, and immediately posted at the nearest Post Office; 6. Letters of merchants, owners of vessels, or of the cargo or loading therein, sent by such vessel, or by any persons employed by such owners for the carriage of such letters according to their respective addresses, and delivered to the persons to whom addressed, without pay or reward for so doing; 7. Letters concerning goods or merchandize, sent by known common carriers to be delivered with the goods, without pay or reward; 8. Nothing herein contained to authorize any person to collect any such excepted letters for the purpose of sending or conveying them. No person obliged to send any newspaper, pamphlet, or printed book by post.

Mem. 1.—In all cases the postage must be prepaid. Letters for the United Kingdom, if posted unpaid or insufficiently prepaid, will be forwarded,—but they will be charged on delivery with the amount of deficient postage, and a fine of threepence sterling each letter.

Mem. 2.—Letters may be registered to all places, except those the names of which are followed by the mark §, indicating that no registration can be effected.

Mem. 3.—The Registration Fee on letters addressed to the United Kingdom, is 8 cents each. In all other cases the registration fee is 16 cents from Canada to the place of destination, except to places marked †, in which cases a registration fee of 8 cents each letter, and a postage of 4 cents per $\frac{1}{4}$ oz. must be collected, and in addition, double the ordinary rates of postage as given in this Table. (See note at foot of Table marked A.)

Mem. 4.—No Book Packet addressed to Portugal, Madeira, the Azores, or Cape de Verds, must exceed 1 lb. in weight; to Russia and Poland no such packet must exceed 8 ozs. A Packet of Patterns for Germany or Belgium, or any country, via Belgium, must not exceed 8 ozs. A Book Packet for Greece must not exceed 3 lbs. in weight, nor must it exceed 2 feet in length by 1 foot in width or depth.

Mem. 5.—Upon Letters, Newspapers, and Book Packets forwarded through the United States, the following additional rates must be collected, viz. 2 cents per half ounce on Letters, 2 cents each on Newspapers, and 2 cents per 4 ozs. on Book Packets.

Mem. 6.—An additional postage of 6 cents per half ounce must be collected on Letters, 2 cents each on Newspapers, and 6 cents per 4 ounces on Book Packets and Patterns, for places marked thus * when addressed to be sent via Brindisi.

Mem. 7.—On Book Packets for the United Kingdom not exceeding one ounce in weight, the postage is 2 cents. On Book Packets weighing more than one ounce, the progressive rates of postage will be found in Table below.

LIGHT HOUSEES.

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; The Coast of New Brunswick and the United States in the Bay of Fundy; and at Cape Ray, Newfoundland.

WEST FROM HALIFAX.

CHEBUCTO HEAD—On the Head. *A revolving light, showing its greatest brilliancy every minute.*

SAMBRO ISLAND—On the S. W. side of the entrance to Halifax harbor. *A fixed white light, elevated 115 ft. above the sea, visible in clear weather from 20 to 25 miles. White Octagonal Building, Lat. 44° 26' N. Lon. 63° 35' W. In thick or foggy weather, signal guns from ships will be answered from the signal station by firing two guns in quick succession, and the same reply will be made from the island to the sound of a steamer's whistle.*

PEGGY'S POINT—East point of entrance to St. Margaret's Bay. *A fixed red light, about 65 feet above high water. Square white Building standing about 40 yards from the shore. Lat, 44° 29' N. Lon. 63° 57' W.*

CHESTER LIGHT ON IRON BOUND ISLAND—Entrance to Mahone Bay. *One fixed white light, 25 ft. horizontally visible from sea from W. S. W. to N. E. Elevated 50 feet above high water. Lat. 44° 26' 15" N. Long. 64° 4' 10" W.*

MAHONE BAY—On Hobson's Nose Island, *A fixed red light. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white.*

CROSS ISLAND—Upon the S. E. point of the Island. *Two lights placed vertically 44 feet apart, the lower light is fixed; the upper one flashing at intervals of a minute, visible 14 miles. Building red. Lat. 44° 19' N. Long. 64° 9' W.*

BATTERY POINT—At the entrance of Lunenburg harbor. *A fixed white light, visible 12 miles. White square building. This harbor is easy of access, buoys are placed in the bay and entrance to the harbor on the Sculpin Rock, Haddock Shoal, Battery Point Shoal, and Head Shoal. In approaching the harbor from seaward the Buoy on Sculpin Rock, painted red and black in horizontal stripes, may be left on either hand, giving it a birth of two cable's length. The other buoys are painted black and must be left on the port hand going in. Iron can buoys in summer, spar buoys in winter.*

IRON-BOUND ISLAND—Entrance to LaHave River. *A bright flash light, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of 30 seconds. The lantern is on a square white tower, on the southern side of the island, 70 feet above sea level, visible from all points of approach.*

MOSER'S ISLAND—West side of the entrance to LaHave River. *A fixed red light, on the S. E. point of the island. Square white building, 58 feet above sea level, standing 100 feet from the cliff. Lat. 44° 12' N. Long. 63° 18' W.*

PORT MEDWAY HARBOR—On Admiralty Head, West side of the entrance to the port. Square white building, with a black square in the centre of the seaward sides. *A fixed white light*, 44 ft. above sea level, visible 10 miles. Spar buoys are placed in the channel to Port Medway harbor, on the breaking ledges, Nautilus Rock, corner ground and edge of flats off Bang's Point. In passing in from seaward the red buoys must be left on the starboard, and the black buoys on the port hand.

LIVERPOOL—South end of Coffin's Island. *A revolving red light*, appearing full at intervals of two minutes, 80 feet above sea level. Building octagonal, in red and white horizontal stripes, visible 16 miles.

FORT POINT—Entrance to the inner harbor of Liverpool. *A red fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand when entering the harbor.

PORT MOUTON HARBOUR—On North-east point Spectacle Island, *a fixed red light*.

LITTLE HOPE ISLAND—Off Liverpool. *A revolving red light*, 40 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute. Situate nearly in the centre of the island. Lat. $43^{\circ} 8' 43''$ N. Long. $64^{\circ} 47' 15''$ W. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white.

PORT LEHERBERT, QUEEN'S COUNTY—On Shingle Beach, East side of the Harbour, *fixed red light*.

GULL ROCK—Off the entrance to Ragged Island harbor. *A white fixed light*, 51 feet above sea level. Square white building. Lat. $43^{\circ} 39'$ N. Long. $64^{\circ} 66'$ W.

CARTER'S ISLAND, RAGGED ISLAND HARBOR—On the middle of the Island, *fixed red light*. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white.

SHELBOURNE HARBOR—On Sand Point, $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile S. E. of the Point.

SHELBOURNE—On the S. E. point of McNutt's Island, at the entrance of the harbor. *Two white lights vertical*—the upper light 100 ft. above sea level, and visible 18 miles; the lower light 38 ft. below the lantern at the top of the building, and visible 10 miles. Building painted black and white in vertical stripes.

NEGRO ISLAND—On North-east point, *A revolving red and white light*, showing alternately red and white flashes every minute. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white.

BARRINGTON—On Baccaro Point, E. side of the entrance to the harbor. *A red fixed light*. Square white building, with a black ball on the seaward side.

CAPE SABLE ISLAND—*A revolving light*, bright 15 seconds and dark 25 seconds, elevated 49 feet, visible 12 miles. Octagonal white building. Lat. $43^{\circ} 27'$ N. Long. $65^{\circ} 36'$ W. High water at Cape Sable, full and change, at $7\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock. Spring tides rise 12 ft., neaps 6 ft.

SEAL ISLAND—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the S. point of Seal Island. *A fixed white light*, 80 feet above high water, and may be seen when approaching, from any point of the compass, at a distance of 18 or 20 miles. Octagonal white building. The Blond Rock lies about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles S. by W. from the light house. Between this rock and the island there are some dangers; the ground is rocky throughout and large vessels ought not to attempt passing between them. A Fog Whistle is also in operation at Seal Island—The whistle sounds in each minute as follows: A blast of five seconds,

PURNICO HARBOUR—On the S. E. side of the entrance to the harbor, about 13 miles northerly of Cape Sable. *A fixed white light, 28 ft. above high water, (rise and fall 12 feet.)* Square white building, standing 50 fathoms from low water mark. Spar buoys mark the channel. Black left on port hand, red on starboard in approaching the harbour.

FISH ISLAND—On Big Fish Island, E. side of the entrance to Tusket River. *Two fixed horizontal white lights, visible 12 miles.*

YARMOUTH—On the island of Cape Forchu, West side of the entrance to the harbor. *A bright revolving light, 145 ft. above sea level, visible quarter minute and invisible half a minute.* Seen in clear weather 18 or 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. Lat. 43° 48' N. Long. 99° 09' W. Steam Fog Whistle near Light House, a blast of 10 seconds in each minute, in operation in all thick weather.

CAPE ST. MARY'S—East side of entrance to St. Mary's Bay, Digby Co. *A revolving light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, and showing alternately red and white faces, 100 ft. above high water.* White octagonal building. Lat. 44° 04' N. Long. 66° 08' W.

WEYMOUTH—On the Beach, South side of the entrance to the harbour, *A fixed white light.*

BRIER ISLAND—Situate on the western side. *A fixed white light, 92 ft. above sea level, visible 15 miles.* Octagonal white building. A steam fog whistle on Whipple's Point, S. W. of light, in operation in all thick weather.

WESTPORT—On Peter's Island, at the S. entrance of the E. side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white fixed lights, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, 40 feet above high water mark, visible 10 miles, and is intended to lead vessels into Westport, or through Grand Passage.* Square white building.

BOAR'S HEAD—N. entrance Petite Passage, Bay of Fundy. *Alternate flashes, red and white, at intervals of 60 seconds.* Square white building.

DIGBY GUT—On Point Prim, at the entrance of the Gut. *A fixed white light, 76 ft. above high water, and visible 13 miles.* Building square, painted red. A Steam Fog Whistle on Point Prim, in thick or foggy weather, sounded 8 seconds in each minute, making an interval of 52 seconds between each blast.

PORT WILLIAMS—*Two fixed white lights, 20 feet apart, perpendicularly, visible from all points of approach.* Square white building. Port Williams is distant from Digby Gut Light E. 25 miles; and from Black Rock W. 28 miles.

MATGARETVILLE—*A red fixed light, visible 10 miles from all points of approach.* Building square, painted in white and black horizontal stripes. Margaretville is distant E. 37 miles from Digby Gut Light, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock Light.

BLACK ROCK—*A white fixed light, 55 ft. above the level of high water, and visible 12 miles.* Square white building.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—On Hetty Point, N. side of the entrance to the River, and three leagues to the eastward of Cape Chignecto. *One fixed light, 40 feet above high water, visible 10 miles.* Square white building.

FRASER, REYNOLDS & CO., Sheet Rubber and Rubber packing of every description.

PARRSBORO'—On the W. side of the entrance to Parrsboro' River. *A fixed white light*, 30 ft. above high water, visible 9 miles. Octagonal white tower, standing close to high water mark on the beach.

BURNT COAT HEAD—The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building. *A white fixed light*, 75 feet above high water level, and visible from all points of approach.

SPENCER'S POINT—*A white fixed light* is placed on the top of a building at this point, on the northern shore of Cobequid Bay, near the head of Minas Basin.

HORTON BLUFF—*A white fixed light*, 95 ft. above high water level, (rise and fall 40 to 45 ft.) visible in clear weather over the greater part of the Basin of Minas (after passing Cape Blomedon) and above the Five Islands and up to Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it. Square white building, standing 66 feet from the Bluff.

GANNET ROCK—The Gannet Rock is 66 feet above high water, and has a light house upon it, painted black and white, in vertical stripes. *A revolving light* (visible 12 miles), lies S. W. by S. distant $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the southern point of Three Islands, and S.S.E. \pm E. 7 miles from the S.W. head of the Grand Manan. A gun is fired to answer signals during a fog. There are a number of small ledges and sunken rocks about it, which are always breaking. The light stands conspicuously in the immediate vicinity of all the sunken rocks and dangers, extending from the old Proprietor to the Seal Islands of Machias, a distance of about 20 miles. Between the northernmost and southernmost of the Murr Ledges there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them above water, and which extend westward from the light house about 4 miles. From this range farther westerly, about six miles, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands, near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND—S. W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. from Grand Manan, lie the Machias Islands. On the eastern island two light houses are erected, showing *fixed lights*, distant from each other about 200 feet in the direction of E.S.E. and W.N.W., by which they are easily distinguished from all other lights on the coast. Elevated about 54 and 58 feet above high water, visible 15 miles. A gun is fired every four hours during a fog. Both buildings white.

GRAND MANAN ISLAND—On Swallow Tail Point, N. E. side of the island. *A white fixed light*, 148 feet above high water, visible 17 miles. Building white, Lat. $44^{\circ} 45' 22''$ N. Long. $66^{\circ} 44' 4''$ W. This is a conspicuous mark in the S. Channel between Briar Island and Grand Manan.

LITTLE RIVER—On an island at the entrance of the River. *A fixed white light*, varied by flashes every 90 seconds, 40 feet above high water, visible 11 miles.

QUODDY HEAD—On the S. E. side of Quoddy Head. *A fixed white light*, 133 feet above sea level, visible in clear weather 17 miles. It bears from the Southern point of Grand Manan N. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 13 miles, and from the Northern point of said island W.N.W. $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Has a fog trumpet.

CAMPO BELLO—On the N. E. extremity of the island. *A white fixed light*, 64 ft. above the sea, visible 15 miles. Building white with a red cross. This light enables vessels to enter Head Harbor at all

times. It is also a guide to vessels entering the main channel, to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay of Passamaquoddy.

POINT LE PREAU—Upon this projecting head land *two fixed white lights*, one above the other, distant 28 feet. The lower lantern is fixed to the outside of the building, and throws its light quite inshore, both to the eastward and westward into Mace's Bay. The highest light is 81 feet, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes, 5 ft. broad, and bears from the easternmost Wolves E. by N., 11 miles.

ST. JOHN, N. B. HARBOUR—On Partridge Island at the entrance of the River and harbor. *A white fixed light*, 120 feet above high water, and visible 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. A Steam Whistle is sounded 10 seconds in every minute during fog and snow storms, audible 4 to 6 miles. There is also a *Bell Buoy* at the extremity of the ledge at the eastern end of the island, which is very useful to vessels in thick or rough weather. The bell can be heard 3 miles.

QUACO HEAD—On a small rock lying off Quaco Head. *A revolving white light*, 58 feet above high water, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes.

GAPE ENRAGE—On the point of that name in Westmorland nearly opposite Apple River Light in Cumberland. *A plain white light*, 151 feet above the sea, visible 15 miles. Square white building.

GRINDSTONE ISLAND—On Grindstone Island, Chignecto Bay. Lat. $45^{\circ} 43' 13''$ N. Lon. $64^{\circ} 37' 25''$ W., 60 feet above high water. Octagonal white tower.

EAST FROM HALIFAX.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side of Halifax harbor. *A fixed white light*, elevated 58 ft. above sea level, and visible 10 miles.

DEVIL'S ISLAND—On the S. W. point of Devil's Island, Eastern Passage entrance to Halifax Harbor. *A fixed red light*, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights, elevated 45 feet; visible 8 miles. Octagonal dark brown tower, with a white belt between the balcony and lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

EGG ISLAND—Off Jeddore. *A revolving light*, 80 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, showing alternately *red and white faces*. Building octagonal, painted black and white in vertical stripes. Lat. $44^{\circ} 39' 51''$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 51' 32''$ W. Visible 14 miles.

OUTER BEAVER, OR WILLIAM'S ISLAND—On South East part of the Island. *A revolving white flash light*, 70 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. Square white building with two black balls on its seaward side. A reef extends eastward from Beaver Island some distance. Lat. $44^{\circ} 49'$ N., Long. $62^{\circ} 21'$ W.

LISCOMB HARBOUR—Revolving Light on Liscomb Island, 450 feet E. S. E. from West end of Cranberry Point on the West side of Lis-

comb Island, East side of the entrance to Liscomb Harbour. The light is a *revolving red and white light*, showing alternate red and white flashes every two minutes ; elevated 64 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building, 28 feet high, painted white ; roof of dwelling painted red. Position—Lat. $44^{\circ} 59' 20''$ N., Long. $61^{\circ} 57' 51''$ W. This light is for the purpose of guiding vessels in the harbour.

COUNTRY HARBOR—On South Point of Green Island, *fixed white light*. The tower is a square wooden building, 28 feet high, painted white.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND—On the S. W. point of the island. *A bright flash light* of 10 seconds duration followed by eclipses of 10 seconds, displaying alternately 3 flashes and 3 eclipses in a minute. Square white tower, standing 75 fathoms from the water's edge, with an octagonal iron lantern, 55 feet above the sea level. Lat $45^{\circ} 11' 58''$ N., Long. $61^{\circ} 08' 02''$ W. Visible 11 miles.

CRANBERRY ISLAND—(Cape Canso.) *Two white fixed lights*, placed vertically 12 yards apart ; the upper 75 ft., the lower 45 ft., above high water, visible 15 and 9 miles respectively. Tower striped white and red horizontally. Lat. $45^{\circ} 19' 49''$ N., Long., $60^{\circ} 55' 29''$ W. A steam fog whistle has been established on Cranberry Island. In thick or foggy weather and snow storms, the whistle will be sounded eight seconds in each minute, thus making an interval of fifty-two seconds between each blast. The whistle will probably be heard, in calm weather, about 15 miles ; with the wind, about 20 miles ; in stormy weather and against the wind, 5 to 8 miles.

CANSO HARBOUR—The light is a *fixed red light*, on North East part of Hart's Island, elevated 42 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 12 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building, 28 feet high, painted white. Position—Lat. $45^{\circ} 21' 0''$ N., Long. $60^{\circ} 58' 31''$ W. This Light is for the purpose of guiding vessels into Canso harbour, and through Canso both North and South.

GREEN ISLAND—Near the S. E. end of Madame Island, off the town of Arichat. *A fixed red light*, elevated 70 feet above high water. Lat. $40^{\circ} 28' 51''$ N. Long. $60^{\circ} 53' 40''$ W. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white. Visible 14 miles.

ARICHAT—On Marachie Point, S. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 34 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Square white building. Lat $45^{\circ} 29' 02''$ N., Long $61^{\circ} 01' 52''$ W.

ARICHAT HARBOUR—The light is a *fixed red light* on the North end of Jerseyman's Island, elevated 39 feet above the level of high water, and in fine weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building, 28 ft. high, painted white. Position—Lat $45^{\circ} 30' 20''$ N., Lon $60^{\circ} 3' 4''$ W. This light is for the purpose of guiding vessels through Crid Passage in and out of Arichat Harbour.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR—On the W. side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chebucto Bay. *A fixed white light*, 30 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Lat. $45^{\circ} 22' 47''$ N., Long. $61^{\circ} 29' 11''$ W.

EDDY, OR SAND POINT—(Gut of Canso.) On the W. side of the S. entrance to the Strait of Canso. Lat. $45^{\circ} 30' 29''$ N., Long. $61^{\circ} 13' 42''$ W. Two horizontal fixed white lights, 24 ft. apart, elevated 25 ft. each, visible eight miles. Square white building, with a black diamond on the seaward side.

POINT TUPPER—On Stapleton's Point, South side of Ship Harbor, Gnt of Canso, fixed red light.

WEST SIDE GUT OF CANSO, NORTHERN ENTRANCE—A white fixed light, 110 ft. above high water, visible 18 miles, or between Cape George and Port Hood. White tower standing 120 yards from the shore. Lat. $45^{\circ} 41' 42''$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 28' 58''$ W.

POMKET ISLAND—St. George's Bay, Antigonish Co. Standing on the N. side, 50 yards from the E. end of the island. A fixed red light. Square white building, 50 ft. above high water. Lat. $45^{\circ} 38' N.$ Long. $61^{\circ} 49' W.$

CAPE ST. GEORGE—On the N. side of the Cape. A revolving white light every half minute, visible 25 miles. 350 ft. above high water. Square white tower. Lat. $45^{\circ} 52' 35''$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 53' 40''$ W.

PICTOU ISLAND—On the S. E. point of the island. A white fixed light, 52 ft. above sea level, visible 11 miles. Square white building, Lat. $45^{\circ} 49' 10''$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 30' 29''$ W.

PICTOU HARBOUR—On the S. point of the entrance to the harbour. A white fixed light, 65 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. A small red light is shown below the lantern. Building octagonal, in red and white vertical stripes. Lat. $45^{\circ} 41' 25''$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 39' 26''$ W.

BIG CARIBOU ISLAND—On the N. E. end of the island. A white revolving light, showing its greatest brilliancy every minute. Square white building, standing 130 ft. from the point, and about 35 ft. above high water. Lat. $45^{\circ} 44' N.$ Long. $62^{\circ} 46' W.$ Visible 10 miles.

AMET ISLAND—Off Tatamagouche Harbour. A fixed white light. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white, 44 feet above high water mark. Building square, painted white. Light visible 10 miles. Lat. $45^{\circ} 50' 15''$ N. Long. $63^{\circ} 15' W.$

MULLIN'S POINT—North side of entrance to Wallace Harbor, a fixed white light. The tower is a square wooden building, painted white.

PUGWASH HARBOR—A fixed light on Seaman's or Fishing Point, on the east side of the entrance to Pugwash Harbour. The light is a fixed light, showing red seaward, and white towards the harbour, it is elevated 48 feet above high water, and in clear weather can be seen from a distance of 8 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catopric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building 44 feet high, painted white. Position, Lat. $45^{\circ} 52' 30''$ N. Long $63^{\circ} 40' 30''$ W.

PORT HOOD—A fixed light, shows red on the N. side, and white to the southward, elevated 54 feet, and visible 10 miles. Square white tower. Lat. $46^{\circ} N.$, Long. $61^{\circ} 31' 40''$ W.

MARGARIE, OR SEA WOLF ISLAND—On the N. W. side of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Mabou and Cheticamp harbours, and distant $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the main land. A white fixed light, near the centre and summit of the island, elevated 298 feet, visible 21 miles from all points of approach. Square white building. Lat. $46^{\circ} 21' 30''$ N., Long. $61^{\circ} 15' 33''$. To vessels in dangerous proximity to the Island the Light may become obscured by the abrupt cliffs on the side of the Island.

CHETICAMP—The light is a revolving white light on S. W. end of Cheticamp Island, revolution every one and a half minutes, and a flash every 45 seconds, elevated about 149 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 20 miles. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building about 24 feet high, painted white, with a black ball seven feet in diameter on seaward side to distinguish it in day time from Sea Wolf Island light. Position—Lat. $46^{\circ} 36' 32''$ N., Long. $61^{\circ} 3' 0''$ W. This light is for a coast light, and for the purpose of guiding vessels into the harbour south of west end of Cheticamp Island.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND—On the S. point of the island, Lat. $47^{\circ} 11' 20''$ Long. $60^{\circ} 9' 36''$, is an octagonal light house, exhibiting a revolving white light every minute, elevated 140 ft., visible 20 miles on all bearings, except between S. S. E. southward to W. On a rock, 26 feet from the end of the island, in Lat. $47^{\circ} 13' 50''$, Long. $60^{\circ} 8' 20''$, is another similar building of the same height, showing a white fixed light, visible 20 miles, between N. by E. 4 E. northward to E. N. E. A gun is fired every 4 hours at the Humane Station. A Steam Fog Whistle in operation during all thick weather.

INGONISH ISLAND—A fixed white light is exhibited at an elevation of 237 feet above high water, and in clear weather can be seen at a distance of 15 miles. The tower is a square wooden building, 40 feet high, and painted white. Lat. $46^{\circ} 41' 20''$ N. Lon. $60^{\circ} 20'$ W.

OUTER BIRD ISLAND—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or, and St. Ann's (E. coast of Cape Breton). Alternate flashes of red and white at intervals of 60 seconds, elevated 77 ft., visible 14 miles. Octagonal white building. Revolving. Lat. $46^{\circ} 23' 10''$ N., Long. $62^{\circ} 22' 30''$ W.

ST. ANN'S HARBOR—On Point of Beach on north side of the entrance to the harbour, a fixed white light is exhibited at an elevation of 24 feet above high water, and can be seen at a distance of 8 miles. The light house is about 30 feet high, and painted white. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric, and consists of two lamps and reflectors, one facing S. W., and the other N. E. Lat. $46^{\circ} 17' 30''$ N. Long. $60^{\circ} 32' 15''$ W. This light is exhibited to find the entrance through the Narrows to the Harbour, which cannot be distinguished in dark nights.

BLACK ROCK POINT—S. side of entrance to Big Bras d'Or, C. B., fixed white light. Square white building, about 45 feet above high water, standing 100 feet from the point. Lat. $46^{\circ} 19'$ N., Long. $60^{\circ} 24'$ W.

SYDNEY HARBOUR—The light is a fixed red light on the West end of South Bar, elevated 304 feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white. Position—Lat. $46^{\circ} 12' 40''$ N., Long. $60^{\circ} 12' 40''$ W. This light is for the purpose of guiding vessels into the harbour and marking the dangers of the bar.

LOW POINT—On the eastern side of the entrance to Sydney, C. B., harbour. A white fixed light elevated 70 feet, visible 14 miles. Building octagon red and white vertical stripes. Lat. $46^{\circ} 16' 12''$ N., Long. $60^{\circ} 09' 22''$ W.

FLINT ISLAND—On Flint Island, E. coast of Cape Breton, between

Cape Granby and Point Gage, entrance to Cow Bay. Lat. 46° 11' 5" N., Long. 59° 45' 50" W. *A revolving light*, attaining its greatest brilliancy every 15 seconds, 65 feet above high water. Octagonal white building.

SCATTARI ISLAND—On the N. E. point of the island. *A revolving light*, visible 60 seconds and invisible 30 seconds, elevated 90 feet, visible 15 miles. Octagonal white building. Lat. 46° 2' 13" N. Long. 59° 40' 18" W. The light should never be brought to bear to the eastward of N. N. E. or to the southward of S. S. W., nor approached nearer than 1½ miles. Gun fired as signal, and a boat for assistance.

MAINADIEU—On the Westerly end of Scattari Island, *a fixed red light* is exhibited at an elevation of 90 feet above high water, and can be seen at a distance of 9 miles. The tower is a square wooden building, 40 feet high, and painted white. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric, and consists of 4 lamps and reflectors. Lat 40° 0' 30" N, Long. 59° 47' 30" W.

LOUISBURGH—On Lighthouse Point, N. side of the entrance to the harbour. *A white fixed light*, 85 ft. above high water, visible 16 miles. Square white building, with vertical black stripes. Lat. 45° 54' 31" N, Long. 59° 57' 15"

SABLE ISLAND, EAST END—*Fixed white light*. The tower is octagonal, about 80 feet high.

" 3 Do, 2 balls close up on the outer, and one on the inner.

" 4 Do, 2 balls separated, and one close up on the inner halliard.

" 5 Do, a pendant of any colour on the outer halliard, and one ball close up inside.

" 6 Do, a pendant under a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball at the inner halliard close up.

" 7 Do, a pendant over a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 8 Do, a pendant under two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 9 Do, a pendant between two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

" 10 Do, a flag of any colour close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

Two large balls close up, one at the outer and the other at the inner halliard, E or W, a steamer reported in that quarter.

A small ball at the outer, and a large one at the inner halliard, a second class Packet or Merchant Steamer.

A large ball at the outer, and a small one at the inner halliard, a Man-of-War Steamer, or Royal Mail Steamer, or large Merchant Steamer.

Lanterns are hoisted at night to denote a Steamer reported.

Red light on outer and white light inner on E. yard-arm denotes Steamer East reported.

Green light outer and white light inner on W. yard-arm—Steamer West reported.

Red light above white, 12 feet apart, mail from England.

Green light above white, 12 feet apart, mail for England.

White light above red, 12 feet apart, Newfoundland mail.

White light above green, 12 feet apart, Bermuda mail.

Green light above red, 12 feet apart, English Man-of-War.

Red, Green and white, 12 feet apart, enemy's Man-of-War.

The coloured lantern is always shown at yard arm, and the white ones at the inner halliard, E or W, according to the quarter the Steamer is reported in.

Numbers are indicated the same as on the lower yard.

When the description of vessel is ascertained, the following descriptive colours will be hoisted at the masthead:—

(a) The Population of Quebec is given in the Census Report of 1861 at the figure of 51,109, but this comes from the fact that a part of the population of the electoral district of the City of Quebec was enumerated as part of the population of the County of Quebec, to which it did not and does not actually belong.

(b) The decrease indicated is, in fact, only apparent. At the time of the taking of the census in 1861, Quebec and Kingston, with Montreal and Halifax, were the four most important military stations in Canada, and had comparatively large garrisons, the whole personnel of which was included as forming part of the population of these cities. In 1871 these garrisons had been withdrawn, and the few soldiery still remaining have not been counted, not being part of the domiciliated population of the localities from which they were about to depart. The increase of the population of the cities of Montreal, Toronto, Halifax, St. John, N. B., and Fredericton is also larger than apparent, for the same reason. It is again to be remarked, in relation to the comparative figures of Quebec, that this city was in 1861 the seat of the Government of Canada, and that the loss entailed by its removal to Ottawa has been only partially supplemented by it becoming the site of the Provincial Government of Quebec.
