BOY FOUND IN THE SWAMP Mystery Surrounding Disappearance of East Gwillimbury Farmer Partially Cleared Up.

LAST SEEN OCTOBER 20, 1900

Searching Party Investigated the Swamp at the Time—An Inquest Opened.

Mystery surrounding the disappearance of William Fowler, 74 years of age, from his home on the 7th concession of East Gwillimbury, about 18 months ago, was cleared away on Sunday, when his dead body was found a short distance from his farm. The remains, which were unrecognizable to his friends, were identified by a pipe and knife found in the pockets of the clothing.

Fowler left his home on the morning of Oct. 20, 1900, apparently for a walk, and when he did not return his friends became anxious as to his safety. Searching parties were organized by Chief Savage of Newmarket, who had charge of the case, and every place where the old man was likely to go was visited. The woods in the vicinity were searched without success. Nothing more developed in connection with the case until William Jowett, while searching for a lost sheep on Sunday, discovered the badly decomposed body of Fowler. Goodwin communicated with Chief Savage, and in turn, Coroner J. H. Wesley of Newmarket was notified to hold an inquest. The remains were removed to Wesley's place, where an inquest was held. After several witnesses had been examined an adjournment was made till next Monday evening.

HALF ALREADY SUBSCRIBED.

Sixteen Millions of New British Loan Placed Privately.

London, April 15.—The Standard announces in a financial article that only 116,000,000 of the new budget loan of £2,000,000 will be issued publicly, the remaining half of the loan having already been placed privately. The Standard further states that the loan of the latter half of the loan has been taken up by leading financial houses in London, and that the loan is being immediately, probably at 93-1/2, and the instalments will spread over a considerable period.

RUSSIAN MINISTER ASSASSINATED.

St. Petersburg, April 15.—The Minister of the Interior, M. Siplaginine, was shot at and fatally wounded at 1 o'clock in the lobby of the Ministerial offices by a man who held a revolver and a dagger. The assassin was shot and died at 2 p.m. The assassin is a student who gained access to the Minister's office by means of a uniform of an aide de camp. He met the Minister on the main stairs and emptied his revolver into his body at close quarters. The assassin was immediately arrested.

WHY CANADA GETS NO PREFERENCE FROM BRITAIN OUR GOVERNMENT REFLECTED TO AS FERRET

Record of Opportunities Let Slip by Shown Up by the Member for East York, Precipitating the Liveliest Debate of the Session—Sir Wilfrid's Refusal to Discuss Imperial Defence in Connection With Commerce Puts Canada on Same Footing With Foreigners.

LIBERALS' POSITION ON IMPERIAL QUESTIONS CONDEMNED

Ottawa, April 15.—Imperial politics up-to-date describes in five words the discussion which took place in the Commons today. It turned upon the adoption of a protective policy in Great Britain as announced in the budget speech of the Chancellor of the Exchequer, it covered the entire ground of Canada's commercial and military relations with the Mother Country, and elicited an exchange of views between party leaders in the House upon the policy of preferential trade within the empire. It was certainly a timely topic, also the leader of the government affected to regard it as inopportune.

The querulous attitude of Sir Wilfrid Laurier upon the subject, perhaps only natural, feeling that the triumph of protection in the Mother Country removes the last vestige of excuse for his failure to obtain for Canadian products a preference in the British market. That excuse was that England was wedded to free trade and would never consent to adjust her fiscal policy so as to permit a preference to be given to Canada in return, even for the preference given to the British goods by the tariff of the Dominion.

Belied His Predictions.

Wriggles as he might Sir Wilfrid was forced to admit that the new fiscal policy of England belied his predictions to the extent that it clears the field for an Imperial preferential trade arrangement being arrived at by the conference which is to assemble in London next June. Since 1896, therefore, the Liberal party has been traveling in a circle on the preferential trade question, and is now back to where it was in 1896, when Sir Wilfrid made that famous speech in London, Ont., in which he decanted upon the benefits of preferential trade and promised if placed in power to send a commission to London, England, to obtain that boon for the Canadian people. But after his utterances in the House yesterday this question not naturally cropped up between the lines of his opponents' speeches, Can the Prime Minister be trusted not to repeat at the conference of 1902 his worse than political blunder of 1897?

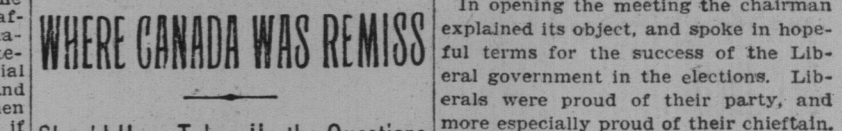

Forty-Nine Jewellers on Strike

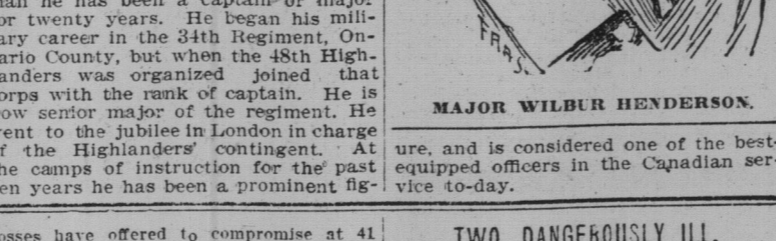
Discharge of Fellow Employee as Reason—Breakers Refuse Compromise.

Yesterday saw the ending of one labor trouble in Toronto and beginning of another. The painters and decorators won their fight, the employers acceding to all their demands. In pursuance of the order issued by the union, the men in those shops which had not granted the request did not return to work yesterday morning. The strikers, who numbered nearly 100, and who worked in shops represented in the Master Painters' Association, met in Richmond Hall. At an early hour word was received from the Master's Association that they would receive a committee from the men. A conference was held, at which the bosses decided to grant the men's demands, and the men returned to work this morning with all painters and decorators again at work.

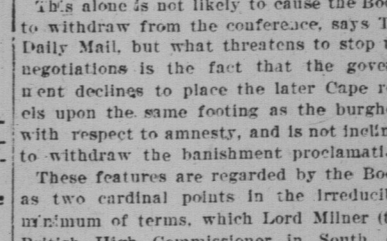

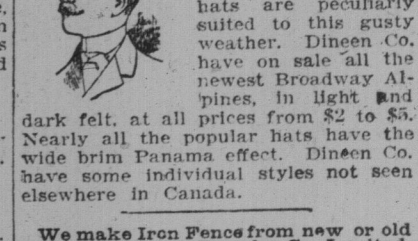
