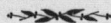

1. *Rev. A. R. B. Shrewsbury*, who died at Benton, N. B., July 31st, 1885. Our departed Brother was the son of the Rev. Jeremiah S. Shrewsbury, who labored very successfully in the mission field in Africa and in the West Indies. He came from England in 1871, to enter our ministry and continued in active work till his death. During the late years of his life he gave evidence of a deepening work of grace, and a very rich and joyous Christian experience. The day before he died he said: "I am on the Rock that does not move and I am safe." A little before his death, after appealing to those present to prepare to die, he murmured to himself, "Victory, yes, victory even for me; victory over pain and weakness, victory over self and sin, victory over the power of darkness, victory through the blood of the Lamb, victory unto Heaven."

2. *Rev. Edwin Mills* died at Debec, N. B., Dec. 14th, 1885. He was converted in early life and immediately connected himself with the Methodist Church. In 1868 he entered the Methodist ministry, and continued in the active work till failing health compelled him to become a Supernumerary, in which relation he continued till his death. His consistent godly life, his simple, child-like faith under the dark dispensations of Providence commended him to the confidence of all who knew him. Although death came to him unexpectedly, it did not find him unprepared. His dying testimony was clear and distinct, "Glory, glory to Jesus, His precious blood cleanseth me fully."

## IV — Report of the Committee of the Supernumerary Ministers' and Ministers' Widows' Fund.

The Committee met in the Preacher's Vestry of the Sackville Methodist Church, Monday evening, June 21st, 1886.

Wm. E. Dawson was appointed Chairman, and John E. Irvine Secretary of the Committee.

In the discharge of its duty as prescribed by the Discipline, the Committee has gone carefully over the returns made in the Minutes of the several Districts, and now begs leave to report to the Conference the following facts, viz :—

1st. The total amount contributed from the Circuits during the year now ending has been \$699.06, an increase of \$22.41 over the amount of the previous year; an average of about 73.5 cents per member. Had the minimum average, 10 cents, required by the Discipline, Art. 467, been reached, the amount would have been \$921.40, or \$222.34 more than was raised.

The St. John District, with a membership of 2016, according to the Minutes of 1885, has raised \$154.62, an average of 7.65 cents.

The Fredericton District, with a membership of 1771, contributed \$148.72, or an average of 8.39 cents.

The Miramichi District, with 482 members, \$70.17, an average of \$14.55 cents.

The Sackville District, with 1885 members, gives \$118.18, an average of 6.26 cents.

The St. Stephen District, with 545 members, gives \$42.78, an average of 7.54 cents, and P. E. Island District, with 2515 members, gives \$164.59, an average of 6.54 cents.

The Committee regrets that the recommendation of the Committee calling the attention of the Preachers to the 468 and 469 Articles of the Discipline, did not result in a larger addition to the income, especially because the anticipated addition to the number of Claimants has rendered the total amount of claims considerably in excess of the "Current Income," so that the very moderate claims of the Supernumerary Ministers, averaging only about \$200, and the claims of the Widows of Ministers, averaging only about \$90, will have to be subjected to deduction.

The report of the General Committee of the Fund, with the Financial Exhibit for the year ending July, 1885, appended, was read and found to be satisfactory. The Financial Exhibit is submitted to the Conference herewith; and it is recommended that it be published in the Printed Minutes.

The list of Preachers' subscriptions for publication in the Minutes is herewith appended.

The Discipline requires that lists of subscriptions and donations of two dollars and upwards on the Circuits should also be published. The Committee deeply regrets to find only two such subscriptions reported in the District Minutes. These are, John Windsor, Esq., \$5.00, on the Bathurst Circuit in the Miramichi District; and a Friend \$5.00, on the Charlottetown Upper Prince Street Circuit.

The Committee earnestly recommends that every Minister should endeavor, during the ensuing year, to obtain such subscriptions, so that such lists may be presented from very many of the Circuits next year.

The Secretary has in readiness for informal presentation to the Conference, if it is desired, certain memoranda of gratifying improvement in the contributions from some of the Circuits, and of lamentable diminution thereof from others.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

## APPENDIX II.

## STANDING ORDERS.

## 1. — RESPECTING THE FILLING UP OF SCHEDULES.

That the Secretaries of Districts be held responsible for the correct filling up of all the columns of the District Schedules as may be required by the Discipline for each year; and further, after the District books have been handed into the Statistical Committee, that no change be made in the Minutes of any District, except by order of the Conference.

## 2. — CLOSE OF THE FINANCIAL YEAR.

The Conference re-affirms the old rule making the 31st of May the close of each Financial year, and orders the same to be published in the Minutes.

## 3. — DISTRICT MEETINGS.

The District Superintendents are peremptorily required to procure three complete copies of the Minutes of the several annual and other meetings of the District Committees, financial and ordinary, duly signed by the Chairman and Secretary. One of these copies shall be inserted in the District Records; the second shall be reserved for the use of the Conference, and the third shall be delivered to the Secretary for preservation in the archives of the Conference. Furthermore, it is required that the last-mentioned copies be handed in the forenoon of the day preceding that on which our first preparatory committee meeting may be appointed to be held, that the Secretaries may prepare classified lists of all matters which are to come before the Conference, and thereby expedite business.

## 4. — MISSIONARY, SUPERNUMERARY AND EDUCATIONAL FUNDS LISTS.

Each Circuit Superintendent is requested to present, at the Annual District Meeting, prepared on foolscap paper, and made up in Canada Currency, perfect lists of all Missionary, Supernumerary and Educational monies collected on his Circuit; and each District Superintendent is requested to present such lists to the Secretaries of the various Funds, in a state ready for publication on the day previous to the meeting of the various Committees.

## 5. — CHILDREN'S FUND.

The Financial Secretaries of the several Districts are required to send to the Secretary of the Children's Fund, immediately after the Annual District Meetings, the names of all the Ministers in their respective Districts who are claimants upon the Children's Fund for the current year; and to state the number of children for whom allowance is claimed, and, as far as possible, the name and date of birth of each of the said children.

## 6. — TIME FOR COLLECTIONS IN AID OF THE CONNEXIONAL FUNDS.

## 7. — ON THE FINANCIAL ECONOMY.

The Conference recommends to the Quarterly Meetings of the several circuits, the following plan, by which it is hoped they may the more effectually raise the amount necessary to meet the allowances of the ministers and preachers, and which will make the collection of class and ticket money unnecessary.

1. Let the Quarterly Boards, at the beginning of each financial year, estimate the amount needed for the year.

2. Then ascertain from each member of the church, and, as far as practicable, from each member of the congregation, what each purposes to give as his or her weekly or monthly contribution.

3. Let these sums be entered by a steward appointed for this purpose in a book which he shall keep as Treasurer of the Quarterly Board.

4. If the Total amount of these sums does not equal the needed amount, then let the stewards apportion the deficiency among such as are willing for Christ's sake to assume such deficiency, setting down to each person, with his or her consent, the additional amount which they think he or she ought weekly or monthly to pay.

5. Let the stewards then adopt and carry out a plan by which every one shall have the opportunity of regularly contributing each week or month, by envelope or otherwise, not grudgingly nor of necessity, the sum which has been pledged by him or her. Let these contributions be paid over regularly to the steward appointed to receive them, and be brought up by him to the Quarterly Meeting. The said steward shall keep an individual account of all the pledges and contributions, and shall pay over the same, under the direction of the Quarterly Meeting, to the preacher or preachers authorized to receive them.

6. That Quarterly Meetings adopting the envelope system be recommended not to include in their estimates the claims of Foreign and Home Missions, but to provide for those funds as in times past, by special collections and subscriptions.

7. That in the opinion of this Conference, the minimum salary of ministers should be \$750.00.

8. That in the opinion of this Conference, the salary of ordained, but unmarried, ministers should be \$520.00.

9. That in the opinion of this Conference, the minimum amount of young men's salaries should be \$400.00.

10. When a deficiency occurs upon a circuit having two preachers, (a married and a single man), it shall be borne by each, according to a *pro rata* amount.

## 8. — NOT ATTENDING CONFERENCE.

That every Minister who shall not be able to attend any Conference shall notify the Superintendent of the Circuit in which it is to be held at least three weeks prior to the meeting of the Conference.

## 9. — PULPIT SUPPLY.

That a minister removing from any Circuit shall be responsible for two Sabbaths after Conference for the pulpit supply.

## 10. — LAY DELEGATES ATTENDING CONFERENCE.

That the Secretaries of Districts be required to furnish the Secretary of Conference the names of all Lay Delegates to the Conference, so that perfect lists may be ready on the opening of the first session.

## THE ANNUAL ADDRESS.

*To the Members of the Methodist Church Within the bounds of the N. B. and P. E. Island Conference:*

DEARLY BELOVED BRETHREN.—Assembled in our Annual Conference after the toils and triumphs of another year, we again greet you in the name of our common Lord and Master. The year recently closed is one whose history has been marked with many manifestations of the Divine favor. The blessing of God has rested upon the efforts of His servants in their work of directing men to the sinner's Saviour. To His honor and praise, whose we are and whom we serve, we gratefully record the addition of more than eleven hundred to the membership of our Church during the year within the bounds of our Conference. The increase of more than a thousand dollars to our missionary fund is a most pleasing feature, indicating a growing interest in the work, and an enlarged desire to lead men to Christ, both those of our own countrymen, and those of distant lands who have lived so long without a knowledge of the true God. Death has entered the families of several of our Ministers during the year, and among others that have passed to the spirit land, two of our brethren, Rev. A. R. B. Shrewsbury and Rev. Edwin Mills, have been called to the rest of the redeemed. We sorrow at the loss of these beloved brethren. We rejoice when we recall their faithful lives, their earnest toil, and above all, their triumphant deaths. We are well assured that they both received an abundant entrance into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. We appeal to you on behalf of the general interest of our work. We would commend to your fostering care and enlarged patronage our Educational Institutions. We believe that these Institutions of learning were never better prepared to impart a sound, liberal education based upon Christian principles. Every branch, both of Collegiate and Academic instruction, is thoroughly equipped, and in this time, when error is abroad, and when the youth of our country are led astray by ignorance on the one hand, and by philosophy, falsely so called, on the other, we appeal to you as loyal members of the Church of your choice to send your sons and daughters to Mount Allison, that by Christian training and culture they may be prepared to act well their part in life. And, beloved people, while urging you to remember your duty in reference to the education of your children in the schools, we would at the same time earnestly exhort you to give proper attention to the training of your children at home. We commend to you the Scriptural admonition, "Train up a Child in the Way he should Go." Do not think your children must wander far off from God to give the Holy Spirit an opportunity to bring them back to Christ. Dedicate them to the Saviour, and then train them for Heaven and God, "that they may never wander into sin nor into the evils of an unbridled appetite." We fear that in many of our homes the children never hear their parents pray, and we, as being entrusted by the Great Master with the spiritual interests of the families committed to our care, feel that we would be alike guilty in the sight of God, and before our own consciences, if we did not most earnestly and faithfully exhort you, as you prize your own spiritual interest, and value the souls of your own children, not to neglect the family altar. The number and efficiency of our Sabbath Schools are highly gratifying, and give much promise for the future. Realizing that the future prosperity of our Church is dependent upon those who are now the youth, we cannot lay too much stress upon the importance of Sabbath School instruction. It is to us, however, a subject of anxiety and deep regret that, in many of our schools, the Catechism is falling into

Favor the Methodist Book Room in Halifax with your patronage, where we believe you can secure as high a class of religious literature, and at as cheap a rate, as in any publishing house in the province. Especially remember that as Methodists, desirous of retaining your own allegiance, and that of your families to the Church, you can ill afford to do without the weekly visits of the *Wesleyan*, which furnishes us with information in reference to Church work, and stimulates increased effort in leading men to Christ. Remember, brethren, that our claim to be the Disciples of Christ, and followers of them who, through faith and patience, inherit the promises, rests upon the manner in which we live. Personal piety, whole-hearted consecration to the service of the Master are what we need. While some are living without God, and without hope in the world, and others living with the form of godliness, but without the power, we are called to be living epistles known and read of all men. Wherefore, also, we pray always for you that our God would count you worthy of this calling, and fulfil all the good pleasure of His goodness, and the work of faith with power; that the name of our Lord Jesus Christ may be glorified in you and ye in Him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ.
