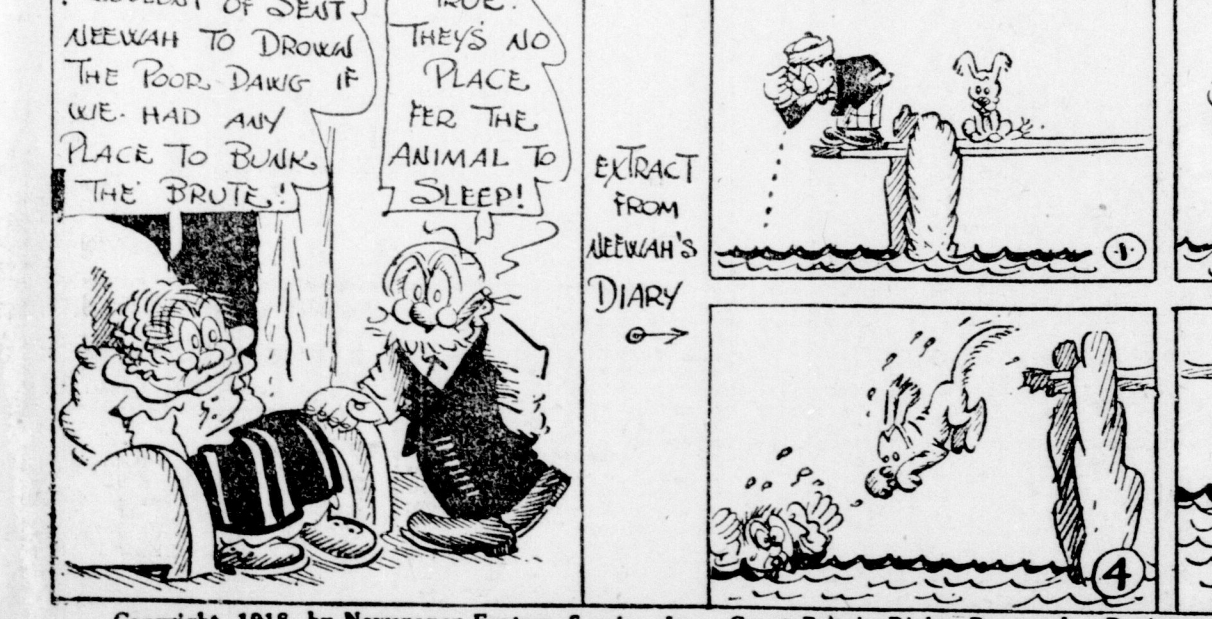

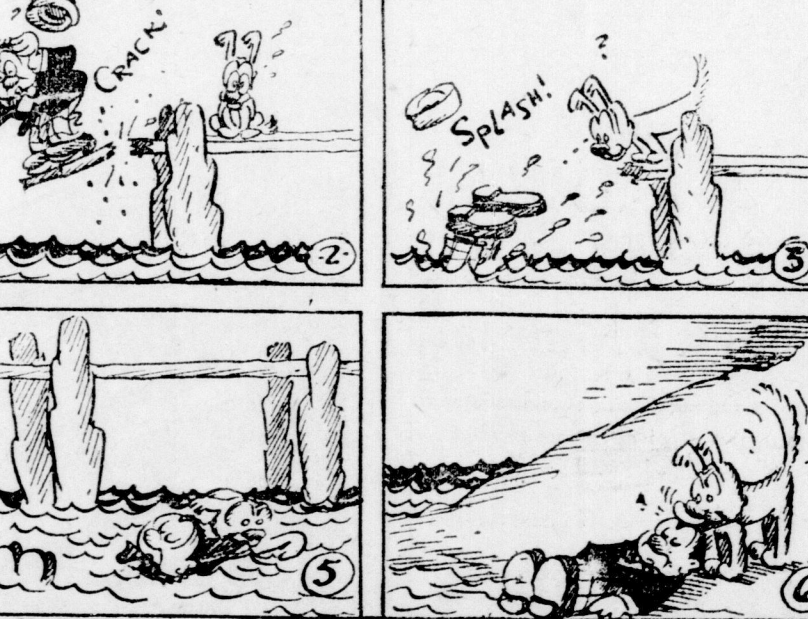

ORGANIZING THE NATION.

BRITAIN needs nearly 500,000 more men for her armies, and is devising ways and means of obtaining them. After consideration, the authorities have decided against taking boys under 18 years of age or men over 45 years, and against enforcing conscription in Ireland.

In making this decision, British authorities have drawn definite lines between certain classes of essential industries. From those engaged in one class they will take no men, while from the other two they will take a certain proportion.

Britain is getting nearer to this state. It is announced that the use of school-boy labor in the harvest fields will be extended; that women will be called to do even more than they have done, and that aliens who have their freedom will have to help.
