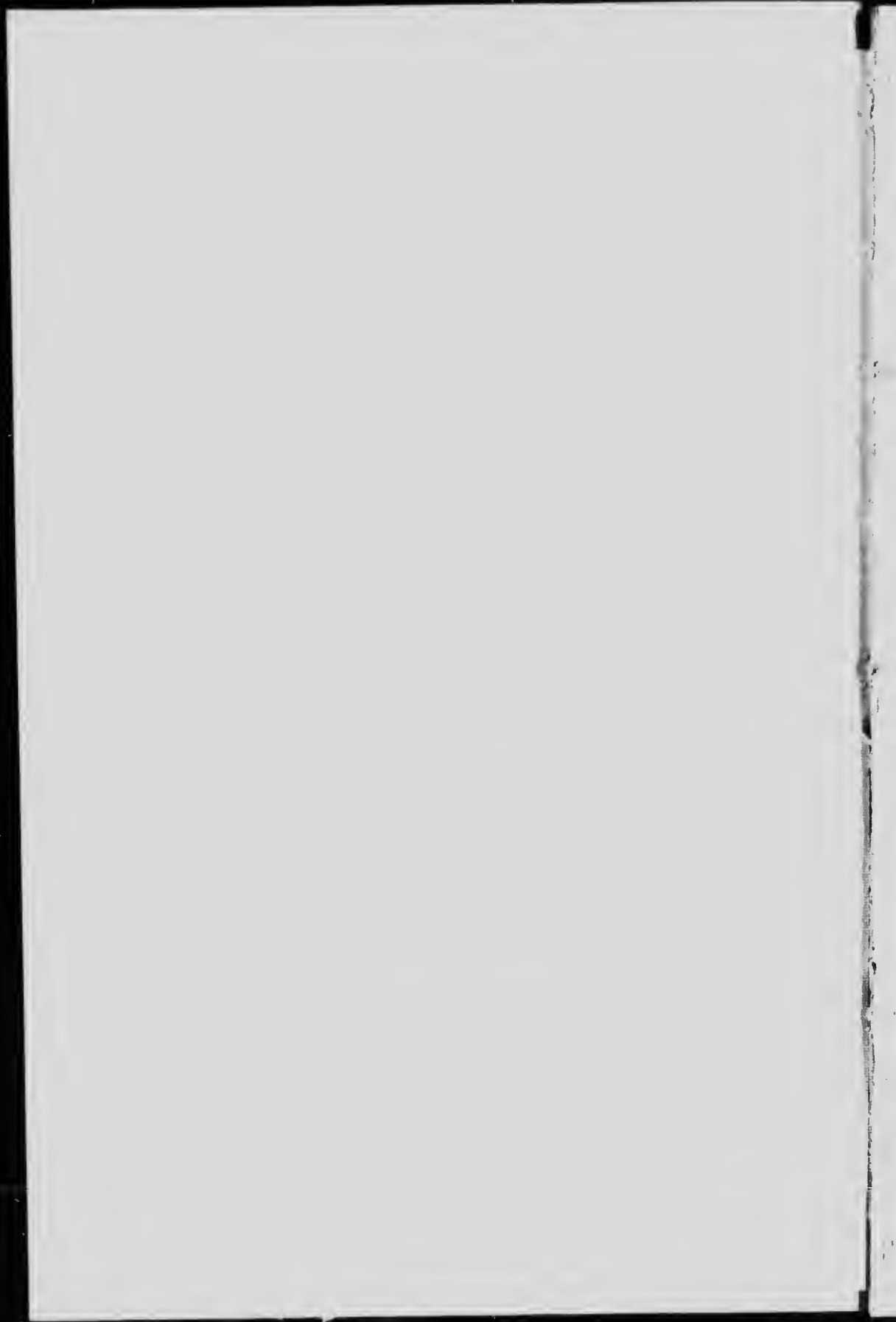
MICROCOPY RESOLUTION TEST CHART

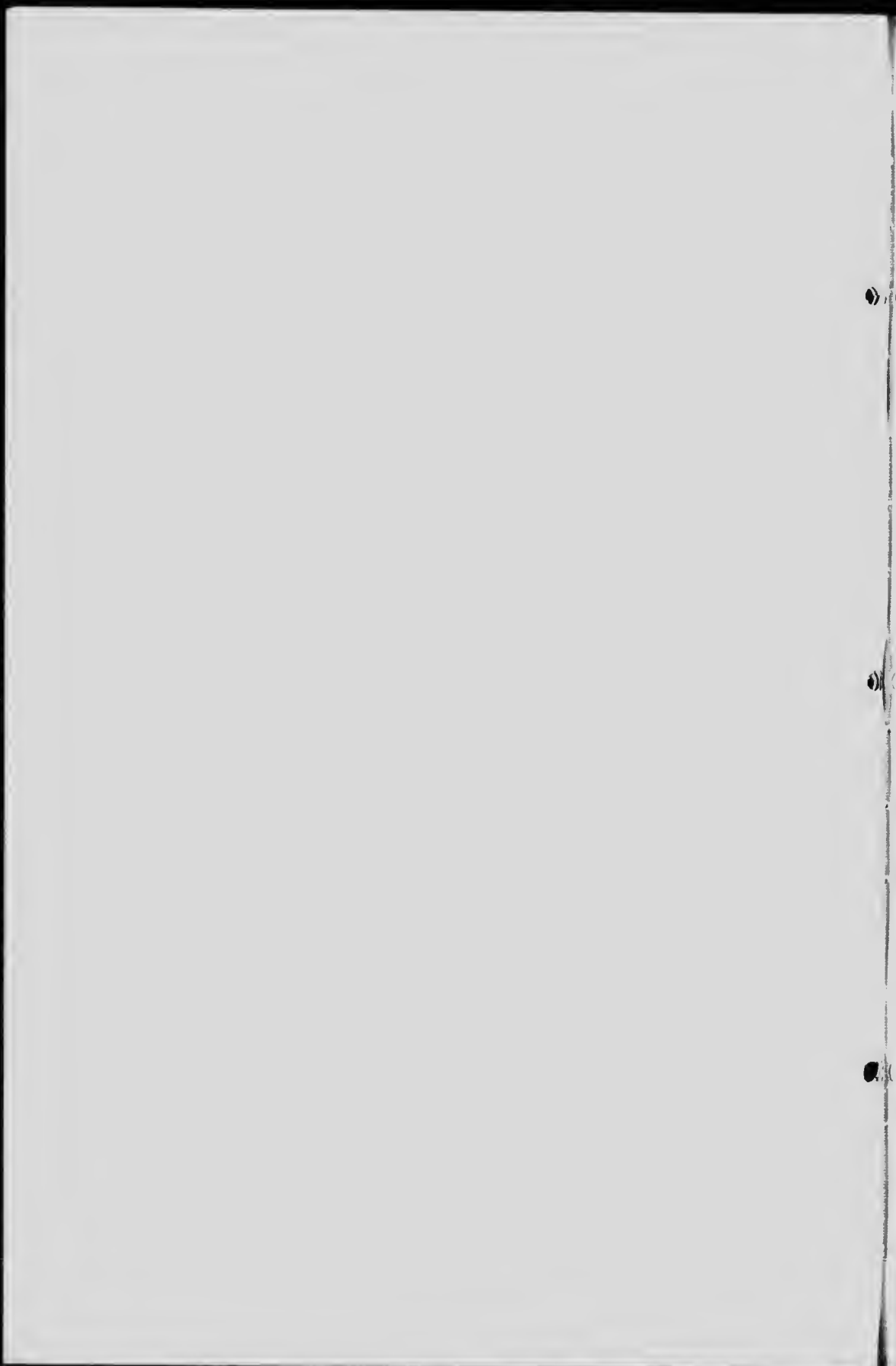
The British . . .

vicinity under Capt. W. H. Merritt, Canadian Militia. The total number was about seven hundred against over three thousand enemy forces under Generals Chandler and Winder.

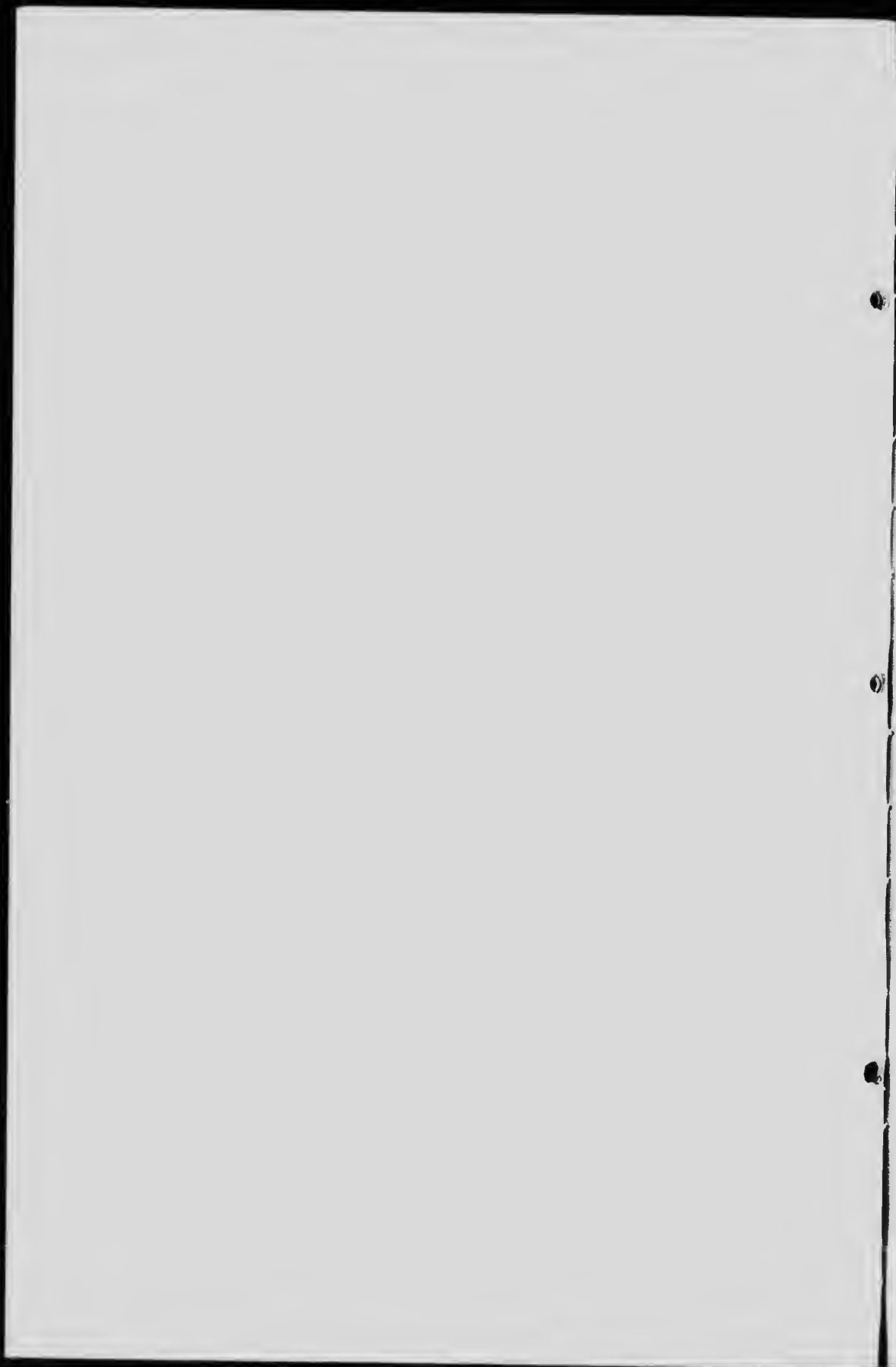
In the dead of . . . night the British . . . marched from Burlington Heights and, surprising the enemy, put him to confusion. This is held to have been the decisive engagement of the war.


