NO FIGHT IN ARKANSAS.

CORRETT AND FITZSIMMONS DID NOT MEET.

Bob in Jail at Little Rock and Jim on Bail in Hot Springs—Governor Clark Holds the Key to the Situation—No Prospect of a Battle.

Little Rock, Ark., Oct. 31.—From all appearances Bob Fitzsimmons is not likely to be at liberty to participate in a prize fight for several days to come. He may be detained here for a week, while the Attorney-General and the lawyers for the Hot Springs Athletic Club argue the legal points in the case.

But even if it were assured that Fitzsimmons would be discharged from custody to-morrow there is still the absolute certainty that he will be on his trail again with some species of legal weapon within five minutes.

It was 9:30 o'clock this morning when Fitzsimmons and Julian arrived in the city over the Cotton Belt Road, in the custody of Sheriff Dillard of Texarkana, who made the arrest. The party was driven to the Capital Hotel.

Julian spoke bitterly of the reports that had been telegraphed over the country to the effect that Fitzsimmons had thrown himself in the way of Sheriff Dillard, when he might have surrendered to Sheriff Hout of Jarman County, and been taken safely to Hot Springs. "That statement," he declared, "is a lie, pure and simple."

He knew nothing of either of the sheriffs. The Hot Springs people sent us no word of anything of the kind at the time I left there ten days ago up to the present moment.

At 3 o'clock the pugilist and his manager appeared before Judge J. W. Martin in the Circuit Court. Mayhew, attorney for the Hot Springs Athletic Club, could not reach Little Rock until to-morrow and consequently when Assistant Attorney-General Memming was present, there was no opposition.

GREAT BRITAIN'S FOREIGN POLICY

Lord Salisbury Says the Government Will Carry It Out—The Duke of Devonshire Speaks Seriously.

London, Oct. 31.—Lord Salisbury, speaking at Watford last evening, said: "My mouth is rather tightly closed upon foreign affairs, but if you are asked to judge the foreign policy of the Government, I exhort you to remember that we inherited that policy. We did not originate it, but for the sake of having a continuity of policy in the face of foreign nations, we expected to do our best to carry it loyally to an issue."

The Duke of Devonshire, speaking at Leeds yesterday, said: "It is idle to discuss the fact that in both Eastern Europe and Western Asia events are occurring and questions are arising which may affect great interests in this country, and the time may be approaching when it will be necessary for us to appeal to all political parties for sympathy."

JAPAN DON'T BELIEVE IT. The London Times' Reported Secret Treaty Doubtful by the Mikado's Government.

London, Oct. 31.—The announcement of a secret treaty between Russia and Japan, reported in a Times despatch from Hong Kong, which has been called back to the front, is not credited by the Japanese Cabinet. The opinion of the Japanese Government is that the report is due to some sensational and interested motive.

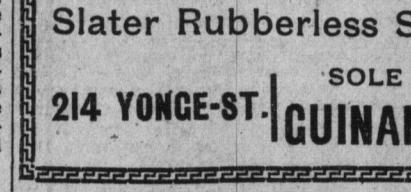
