## An Interesting Error.

The 22 Value of the Third Issue of Camada Bial Stamps with Inverted Medallion.

## BY K. K. RIFIDICIN.

Today the collecting of oldities is not in as much vogue as it was a decadeago, yet an oddity that is really interesting is to day regarded hy many in as friendly a minner as was an oddity ten years ago. By this I mean that a stanp that in some way differs from all others printed from the same plate or die in some salient point enjoys moch favor in the sight of true philatelists. The tendency of collectors to possess something that no one else can secure is very manifest to anyone having dealings with philatelists. It seems to be an inherent trait of the human race for each person, to, in some way, differ in habite from the rest of humanity, and in collecting this trait is carried even farther than in every day life. Some collectors take pleasure from the collecting of oddities and errors of all classes, and certainly a collection of this kind presents a very pleasing and interesting ajpearance. If a stamp that dif. fers only in the lacking or the addition of some unimportant feature is worthy of collecting at all surely the real oddities, such as the stamp being printed in the wrong color or the inverting of the centre portion of the stamp, are wor $\ldots$. $y$ of rank as really collectable classes. These show misunderstanding of orders or carelessness on the
part of the printers aud are not accountable for by broken dies, worn plates, etc, but are the the oddities and and as such are well worthy of collection.

Chief among the class of inverted medallion varieties must necessurily come the revenues of the second, third and fourth issues of United States revenues. Various scribes have described and explained the issuance of these interesting issues in so thorough a manner that itwould be unwise for me to say anything respecting them. But there is another specimen of this inViting of the medallion that, owing to the lack of definite in formation regarding it known, is even more interesting than those varieties I have mentioned. I refer to the $\$ 2$ value of the third issue of Canadian Bill stamps, than which to my mind, no more interesting stamp exists.

Very little definite knowledge is known regarding the number of such stamps issued, etc., but I will give a general view of how these stamps were issued to the public. This view may or may not be correct but as it is the generally accepted view of all collectors it is more than probably so.
These stamps were printed by the Amer. ican Bank Note Co., New York, which company printed other classes of revenues as well as the Canadian Telegraph Franks. They were printed in two colors-red for frome and black for the modallion and it was necessary for the sheet to be run through the press twice, once for each
color. The sheet was first run through the press to receive the impression of not only the frame, ar would be supposed, hut also a small circular piece of red rolor, about one-sixteenth of an inch wide composed of fine vertionl lmes, ruminrg out. site of, and inside of the usually seen red color, the white space left for the medathon. In the second run throngh the prese the medallion in hack wats printed. She shert was rum through the fist the abd received the red eolor bat whea the sheet was fed to the press the second time it was fed upide down and in consequence the queen is standing on her head-a very ludierous position for her Majesty.

This inverting of the medallion is not an masual occurrence in a large printiag house but the fact that such a sheet was allowed to get into circulation is indeed strange as they are usually promply destroyed. For some reason, no doubt care. lessness on the part of the printers the sheets was allowed to get beyond the walls of the printing house, where every stamp was worth two dollars. Here it could not he so easily recalled and the sheet was broken and some specimens sold and undoultly used, The date on which this sheet was issued is not known, and will prohably never be but is thought to be some time after the stamps were first issued, $1 \mathbf{1 8 6 9}$.
One writer has aileged that the sheet was the last one, used to fill a requisition from headquarters in the way. A demand was received and no other sheets being available several "cull" sheets were "run in" to help fill the order. Several sheets of poor impression etc., were used and this sheet with the inverted medallion was among those so utilized. Perhaps they thought it would make nodifference-.
and in truth, little difference it seems to have made. Another variety for the collector, then almost undreamed of, was the only result.

Only one sheet could pimilly have heell need at the most, and the stamp is very rare especially in unased conditon and is prosensed hy but few collectors. It is rater than its catalogue price- $\$ 20$ in uned condition would indicate.

now be issued here for payment, in the Transvaal or Orange Free State.

The price of the Guam set has dropped to $\$ 1$, and should the new stamps have the same surcharge a still further drop will come, but if a different variety of type is used-! -!!-!!!-
The newspaper and periodical stamps are still on sale at the postoffices here, but as they are all to be destroyed after December 31, collectors desiring sets had betterhurry up. They are the sets containing the reprints of the high values.


## Notes From England.

The stamp trade here is very dull for this time of the year. This is chiefly owing to reduction of prices in Gibbon's latest cataloguing.

A greater part of the east side of London Wall has been demolished to make room for a new block of buildings." This has had the effect of turning out no less than four stamp dealers, Messirs Alexander, Penny Bohn, aud Williams.

There have been other changes; Mr Bannistor removing from Morsfields to Capthall Avenue. Mr. Zusler from St. Martin's Lave to Charing Croes Roud, and Messrs Bright from Bournemonth to the Strand.

All London is greatly excited over the possibility of war between England and the Transvael. Many far-nighted dealers are buying up the $28,6 d$, 5s and $10 s$. Transvaal values, which, at present are very cheap.

To take the place of the Stamp Collectors'

Fortnightly, a new journal is now about to be issued. It will be called the Stamp Collector's Guardian and will have the well known Mr. Percy Bishop in the editorial chair. The first number is promisel in October.

The Colonial Stamp Co. has removed their busisess from Toronte, to Loudon England. I hear also that one of Canada's largest dealers will soon tranefer his business to England.

## Great Barrier Forgery.

"Quite a sensation was caused among the philatelists of this city when it came out that the 'Great Barrier Island Pigeon Post' stamps (?), with which the country has been flooded, had been printed, perforated and cancelled in this city. Although there has always been a strong suspicion that these stamps were not 'all night' it was bardly thought that they were being manafactured in this city.

The whole scheme was worked by the manager of the late Dominion Stamp Co., who is now on bis way to South Africh with the Cavadian Volunteers.
But this is not all, as ittes said that in the same box in. which the stock of Rigeon. Pgot stamps were found, there were several bundred counterfoit 3 penny Canada which were evidently awsiting the canceling stamp."-Montreal Notes in Wrekly Era.
